The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Jim Grego. He stated this was a regularly scheduled meeting in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Sections 301 and following as amended. The OACD Board of Directors attended the beginning of the meeting to observe Mr. Graumann take his oath of office and then departed. Those attending were: President Kim Farber, Immediate Past President Joe Parker, Vice Presidents Steve House and Dan Herald, Area 1 Director Jimmy Emmons, Area 2 Director Dan Sebert, Area 3 Director Justin Miller, Area 4 Director James Moore, OK Representative to NACD Board Trey Lam, Director of Development Sarah Blaney, Wildlife Crediting Jordan Shearer, and Wildlife Director Larry Wright.

OKLAHOMA ASSOCIATION OF CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

Mr. Grego allowed Clay Pope, Executive Director, to give his report at this time due to the OACD board meeting. Mr. Pope congratulated Mr. Graumann on his appointment as Area 4 Member.

Mr. Pope gave a status report of the upcoming State Meeting and thanked Mr. Thralls for inviting Governor Fallin. He is also trying to obtain a speaker to discuss the economics of soil health.

Mr. Pope stated that the Ag Group will begin its legislative session meetings soon. The OACD has endorsed the Commission's budget request but unfortunately the State will be looking at a standstill budget. Mr. Pope noted that the deadline for legislative bills filing is January 16.

Mr. Pope continues to monitor the Farm Bill and stated that it will probably be heard as it has moved in the conference committee. He expressed concerns that Congress may tie the extension of unemployment benefits to the Farm Bill. Mr. Pope also expressed concerns with the federal budget stating that legislation was passed allowing the Secretary of Agriculture to charge fees for technical assistance.

Mr. Pope stated that he and Jordan Shearer met with members of the Texas Soil and Water Conservation Board to discuss the lesser prairie chicken issue and stated there may be an opportunity for a cross-border partnership.

Mr. Pope stated that OACD has applied for a grant through the Kirkpatrick Foundation regarding the soil health initiative and that the Letter of Intent has been accepted.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Graumann led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the minutes of the December 2, 2013, Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Ms. Owen presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

EMPLOYEE RECOGNITIONS

Mike Thralls, Executive Director, stated that Tracy Reeder, AML Inspector, was unable to attend the meeting to be recognized for 10 years of service. His recognition will be rescheduled.

Stacey Day, Awards and Recognition Committee Chair, stated that Karla Spinner, Water Quality Administrative Technician, was named Employee of the Quarter during the full staff meeting held on December 11. Ms. Spinner was recognized for that award.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Robert Toole, Assistant Director, presented agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2 and recommended approval of new agreements. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the new agreements as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Mr. Thralls presented travel requests for approval as listed in Exhibit #3. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the requests as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

AML EMERGENCY

Mike Kastl, AML Program Director, presented an AML Emergency to the Commission as listed in Exhibit 5 and recommended that the Commission ratify its approval. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Herriman to ratify approval of the AML Emergency as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. 2014 NO TILL OKLAHOMA CONFERENCE

Mr. Thralls recommended the Commission sponsor the 2014 No-Till Oklahoma Conference scheduled on March 11-12, 2014 in Norman, Oklahoma. A motion was made by Mr. Graumann and seconded by Mr. Jett to co-sponsor the event. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

COST-SHARE PROGRAM PERMANENT RULE

Janet Stewart, General Counsel, presented the Cost-share Program Permanent Rule for adoption as listed in Exhibit #6. She reported that a public hearing was held on December 11 to

obtain comments and that no one attended the hearing. Ms. Stewart did receive comments from four conservation districts and she presented copies of those to members (See Attachment A). The Cimarron County Conservation District is in favor of the change but expressed its desire to not see allocations reduced to panhandle districts because of it. The Oklahoma County and Tulsa County Conservation Districts expressed favor of the change. The McClain County Conservation District is not in favor of the change. Mr. Grego stated that the Latimer County district supports the change and Mr. Rooker stated that Shawnee did as well.

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Herriman to adopt the Cost-share Program Permanent Rule as listed in Exhibit #6. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Blayne Arthur, Deputy Commissioner, reported that the next ODAFF board meeting is scheduled for January 28 and staff will be presenting permanent rules for approval.

Ms. Arthur and Teena Gunter, Legal Counsel, will be meeting with Environmental Protection Agency Region 6 personnel to discuss issues pertaining to Oklahoma.

Ms. Arthur stated that the Southern Agriculture Rural Leaders Meeting was held in Oklahoma recently and focused on public/private partnerships. She also stated that staff is gearing up for the upcoming legislative session.

Ms. Arthur noted that the Department is hosting a Blood Drive today from 1:30 to 4:00 p.m. and welcomed Commission participation.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, congratulated Mr. Graumann on his appointment to the Commission.

Although a written report was not available this month, Mr. O'Neill reported NRCS received an allocation in early December for the remainder of the fiscal year. There is \$170 million less nationwide for technical assistance which is an 11% reduction. He stated that though the numbers are not positive there are several opportunities to obtain additional funding. Mr. O'Neill stated that because of sequestration there is a 7.2% reduction in mandatory and discretionary funds. The Environmental Quality Incentive Program as well as Farm Bill programs will see reductions. There will be no money for new easement program signups because there was no authority approved for the programs.

The Conservation Security Program signup will end on January 17. The EQIP ranking for signups originally scheduled for December 20 has been extended to February 20.

Mr. O'Neill stated that soil health training begins next week and has been offered to Commission and conservation district employees.

Mr. O'Neill reported that he will be advertising for one district conservationist position as well as the State Soil Scientist position. Wynea Buford, Ohio NRCS, has been named the new DC at the Purcell Field Office and Carol Crouch will become the fulltime Tribal Liaison.

Mr. O'Neill stated that a conference call with the Chief of NRCS as well as national conservation leaders (RC&Ds, the National Association of Conservation Districts, and the National Association of State Conservation Agencies) was held to discuss success stories from across the country. Oklahoma was given opportunity to share its successes with water quality, the carbon program and the lesser prairie chicken.

Mr. O'Neill then reported that administrative changes are being made. There will be twelve national centers formed to provide administrative functions for regions. Administrative staff in Oklahoma will be assigned to a regional center however they will remain in Oklahoma for now.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Graumann reported that the Greer County Conservation District received 34 applications under the emergency drought program which will far exceed the allocation the district received.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Administration - Executive Director: Mr. Thralls congratulated Mr. Graumann on his appointment to the Commission. He and Mr. Toole met with Mr. Graumann in Greer County prior to the meeting to acquaint him with Commission business processes and functions.

Mr. Thralls stated that with the retirement of Ben Pollard, Assistant Director, effective December 31, 2013, staff will be reorganizing as two positions will be left vacant. Mr. Toole has been named the Assistant Director and the position of District Liaison and Conservation Programs Director will not be filled. Tammy Sawatzky and Janet Stewart, both with the Conservation Programs Division, will be providing support to Ms. Owen and the District Services and Human Resources Division. Mr. Thralls is confident in the staff at the Commission.

Mr. Thralls stated that the staff will be attending a Joint House and Senate Performance meeting later this month and will be providing information regarding the FY2015 budget request.

District Services and Human Resources Division: Ms. Owen expanded on the reorganization comments by Mr. Thralls stating that Ms. Stewart and Ms. Sawatzky will be working on district services issues. Ms. Owen will also be contracting with conservation districts to assist with training for new district employees for time plus mileage and is hopeful those funds will go to the employee providing the training. Ms. Owen stated that there is a vacancy at the Pontotoc County district office as of January 1 and she will be discussing training for the new employees, once hired, with a nearby district.

Ms. Owen stated that a written report was in the meeting packet. Staff is assisting districts with taxes this month. Ms. Owen stated a valuable lesson was learned recently when Sheryl Gibson, Financial Management Program Assistant, was on extended sick leave and the lack of cross-training of Commission staff hampered the performance of some agency functions. Staff has since met and cross-training of several financial management staff has begun.

Ms. Owen met with Bill Porter, NRCS Assistant State Conservationist for Operations, to discuss and develop future government shutdown procedures and how those procedures can be accessed.

Ms. Owen stated that districts are submitting their audits in a timely fashion.

Water Quality Program: Greg Kloxin, Assistant Director, stated that a written report was in the packet and he yielded for questions. He congratulated Mr. Graumann on his appointment and the Water Quality Division looks forward to working with him.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Mike Kastl, Director, congratulated Mr. Graumann on his appointment. He also stated that a written report was in the packet. There are two active AML project sites under construction. The Northeastern State project deadline for completion will be extended.

Mr. Kastl stated that the agreement the Commission has with the NRCS for design and inspections is working very well. He also reported that Gene Spurlock, AML Inspector, will be retiring March 1, 2014.

Financial Management: No representative present.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, welcomed Mr. Graumann to the Commission. He stated that a written report was in the packet and then yielded for questions.

Assistant Director/Conservation Programs: Mr. Toole stated that work is continuing on the OACD State Meeting and that OACD is arranging the program on Monday and the Commission will be arranging events on Tuesday. The Commission will be holding four workshops on Tuesday: pesticide application, conservation education on soil health, Google Earth training, and engaging local grassroots.

Mr. Toole stated that the City of Kingfisher flood initiative will be finalized and funds expended. He will have a report next month on its completion. Mr. Herriman questioned who identified the properties for the buyout and the cost of those properties. Mr. Toole stated that the City of Kingfisher made those decisions through an engineering firm hired for that purpose. As a result, 40 properties were identified for the buyout offer. The buyout offer was based first on lowest elevation and if that property owner declined it was offered to the next on a progressive elevation list. There were two appraisers and one independent reviewer to look at the appraisals before offered to property owners.

Mr. Toole stated that Karla Beatty, conservation education coordinator, has been busy this month. He also stated that the three watershed technicians are responsible for supervision of two watershed aides each and approximately 700 structures in their respective areas. Mr. Toole stated that the watershed aide model allows these employees along with the technicians to be detailed to any part of the state. Mr. Toole stated that staff is preparing a Fleet Management Plan to identify all vehicles and to obtain a list and schedule of equipment needing replacement. As of now, the Commission has 20 vehicles out in districts. Discussion is ongoing on how watershed workloads vary from one district to the next. Mr. Graumann stated that the Upper Washita district has 172 watershed sites and may receive over 50 CallOkie tickets in a single day. Mr. Herriman stated that workloads are not equal across the state in the fact that his district, Nowata County, has 2 watershed sites compared to the Upper Washita district with 172 sites. Mr. Graumann stated that long term planning needs to happen in a short time frame. The Commission needs to know what people are doing and share ideas as how to cover heavy workload areas.

Mr. Toole provided each member with a copy of the Conservation District Act.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, February 10, 2014, in the Agriculture Building Board Room, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30 a.m.

PRESENTATION BY KEEP OKLAHOMA BEAUTIFUL

Gina Levesque, CREP Coordinator, stated that the Illinois River project was funded by ARRA funds through the Oklahoma Water Resources Board on sites with 10 to 20 feet cut-banks. The project restored 11 sites, six thousand feet of river edge, and kept 900 tons of sediment out of the river. It was a joint project with landowners, public entities (cities, towns, agencies), Oklahoma State University, Corps of Engineers, and the Cherokee Nation.

Jeanette Nance, Keep Oklahoma Beautiful Executive Director, stated that the Commission, along with Oklahoma State University, received the 2013 Environmental Excellence Award during the Awards Banquet held recently, which was attended by 528 people. She was pleased to present the award to the Commission.

STATE GUIDELINES FOR THE EMERGENCY DROUGHT COST-SHARE PROGRAM

Robert Toole, Conservation Programs Director, presented the State Guidelines for the Emergency Drought Cost-share Program, Program Year Emergency Drought 1 as listed in Exhibit #5. The funds are for the five districts included in the Governor's declaration (Greer County, Harmon County, Jackson County, Texas County and Tillman County Conservation Districts). The Emergency Drought Commission, consisting of executive directors of the Oklahoma Water Resources Board and the Oklahoma Conservation Commission as well as the Secretary of Agriculture, recommended the initial requests as follows: Conservation Commission in the amount of \$300,000 and OWRB in the amount of \$900,000. The Governor approved the Drought Commission's recommendations on November 19. The Commission is holding in reserve \$60,000 of the \$300,000 in the event any of the five districts may need additional funds.

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the guidelines as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

ADDITIONAL PRACTICE TO COST-SHARE PROGRAM, PROGRAM YEAR 15

Mr. Toole stated that a request has been received to add practice #315 Herbaceous Weed Control to the list of approved practices for the Cost-share Program. He is recommending this practice be added to the statewide list. The average costs are: Mechanical-\$19.08/acre; Chemical, Spot-\$13.66/acre; and Broadcast Chemical-\$19.42/acre. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Jett to add the practice and rates statewide as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Blayne Arthur, Deputy Commissioner, reported that the Equine Alliance had an economic impact study done on the equine industry in Oklahoma and the study found that the industry contributes \$3.6 billion to Oklahoma's economy.

Ms. Arthur stated that staff participated in the Office of Emergency Management's Earth, Wind and Fire exercise to be more prepared in emergency situations.

Ms. Arthur stated that the Department has begun work on the second publication of the Oklahoma Ag Magazine and asked to let her know if members or staff have ideas for articles for the 2014 publication.

The Governor will hold the Capitol Complex Christmas Tree lighting ceremony on December 3 at 6:00 p.m. The Morrison FFA is making a lighted display for the Agriculture Building grounds.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, provided a written report which headlines an article regarding the Commission and Wetland Reserve Program projects.

Mr. O'Neill stated that he should receive the remainder of their budget this week or next. It will include sequestration estimates as well as financial assistance for the Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP). He stated that the EQIP signup ends December 20.

Mr. O'Neill reported that Conservation Stewardship Program payments are being made. He stated that the CSP has paid \$48 million to Oklahoma farmers and ranchers, which includes \$1.8 million of old Conservation Security Program funds. Mr. O'Neill reported that a CSP signup will be held in early 2014.

Mr. O'Neill is reinstating the Quality Leadership Team and scheduling a meeting soon. This team is a great way for him to better understand local issues.

Mr. O'Neill stated that Don Skiles, from the NRCS office in Dalhart, Texas has been selected as the district conservationist for the Altus Field Office. The district conservationist positions in El Reno and Stillwater will be advertised soon.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Clay Pope, Executive Director, reported on the recent area meetings and stated that attendance was up in three areas and down in two areas.

Mr. Pope stated that he and Greg Scott demonstrated the rainfall simulator to Senators Justice and Jolly and Secretary of Environment and Energy Michael Teague. The presentation was well received and Senator Jolly has requested a presentation for the full Senate Appropriations Committee.

Mr. Pope attended a meeting held by the Upper Washita Conservation District with their legislators to discuss local challenges that they face with conservation issues. He commended the district for holding the meeting and stated it would be a model for other districts to follow.

OACD continues to work with Pauline Hodges on the Dust Bowl Curriculum. Meetings were held with the Rural Schools Association and the Cooperative Council of State Administrators to discuss getting this work in the core curriculum. He stated that Education Week, a national publication, has made contact regarding the curriculum as has the National Association of State Conservation Agencies.

Mr. Pope reported that the World Resources Institute cites an EPA study that shows for every one dollar spent on best management practices in a watershed that it save cities and towns downstream over\$20 in water treatment costs. He stated this was a national study and is hopeful that a study could be done for Oklahoma.

Mr. Pope stated that work has begun on the state meeting and that Chris Clayton with the Progressive Farmer publication has been confirmed as a speaker. Congressman Markwayne Mullin has been invited to speak.

Mr. Pope reported on the wildlife credit program stating that it is set up like the carbon program.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Members reported on attending their respective area meetings and stated that they were very successful. Mr. Grego also attended the Oklahoma Farm Bureau state convention.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Administration - Executive Director: Mr. Thralls recognized Dan Lowrance, former Area 4 member and stated that he would be recognized for his service during a conservation partnership luncheon following adjournment. He also recognized former members Virginia Kidd, Matt Gard, and George Stunkard. Mr. Thralls stated that this is Mr. Pollard's last Commission meeting in his official capacity as Assistant Director and stated that Mr. Pollard will be honored a retirement reception on January 6.

Mr. Thralls stated that the top budget priorities for the upcoming legislative session are salary increases for commission and district employees, filling the budget hole and watershed rehabilitation and operation and maintenance.

District Services and Human Resources Division: Lisa Knauf Owen, Director, stated that she and Akia Hankins, Human Resources Specialist, attended the Area Meetings.

Ms. Owen stated that staff will begin data entry for district employee insurance costs so districts can begin 2014 payroll. She has been training a new district employee in Okmulgee County.

Ms. Owen stated that the Commission is receiving district audits. She will be providing information to districts regarding the long range plan process over the next few months.

Water Quality Program: Greg Kloxin, Assistant Director, stated that Shanon Phillips, Director, was attending an Illinois River meeting. He stated that a written report was in the packet and then reported on the Blue Thumb Program's 20th anniversary celebration held in Tulsa where over 90 people attended. A celebration will be planned for the Oklahoma City area volunteers in 2014.

Mr. Kloxin expressed his appreciation to Mr. Pollard for his leadership in his position of Assistant Director. He appreciates the character and integrity Mr. Pollard has exhibited and the model he provided in assisting and facilitating employees.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Mike Kastl, Director, stated that a written report was in the packet. He then stated that Gene Spurlock, AML Inspector, will be retiring effective March 1, 2014. He reported on the three active sites as detailed in the report.

Mr. Kastl reported on an underground mine emergency near Haileyville and another emergency near Krebs.

Financial Management Division: There is no written report but Mr. Pollard stated that it was business as usual for the division.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated there is a written report in the packet and he then yielded for questions.

Conservation Programs Division: Robert Toole, Director, stated that a written report was in the meeting packet. He then commended the Upper Washita Conservation District for hosting a meeting with their legislators and educating them on the work the district does.

Mr. Toole reported on participating in the Earth, Wind and Fire exercise hosted by the Office of Emergency Management.

Administration - Assistant Director: Mr. Pollard reflected on his 35 years of service with the agency stating that he has worked for and with three executive directors and 26 Commission members over the years. He commended members for their work in not only serving on the Commission but on their local conservation district boards as they receive no pay for the job they perform. Mr. Pollard commended the Commission staff stating it is one of the finest in the state.



This project addresses a situation involving the sudden collapse of an abandoned underground coal mine creating a subsidence near Krebs, Oklahoma. The subsidence is approximately 16 feet in diameter and 5 feet deep. It has vertical sides and active erosion taking dirt deeper underground into an abandoned coal mine void. Three houses are located within half a mile and 27 houses within a mile. The site is 125 feet from State Highway 31.

Location:

It is located in the SE¼ of Section 36, Township 6 North, Range 15 East in Pittsburg County (Krebs, Oklahoma, USGS Quadrangle), Oklahoma.

TITLE 155. OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION
CHAPTER 20. CONSERVATION COST-SHARE PROGRAM

155:20-1-5. Eligibility for Conservation Cost-Share Program

(a) ~~Ineligible~~ Eligible land. ~~Allocated funds shall not be used on tracts of land smaller than twenty acres in size from which less than \$1,000 of soil dependent products are sold annually. These restrictions shall not apply to tracts of land which serve as waste collection sites, waste transfer sites, or to cost-share practices implemented in priority watersheds and unique priority areas within a conservation district. Withstanding these provisions, the~~ The determination whether land is eligible for cost-share payments shall be pursuant to any restrictions established by the conservation district in whose jurisdiction the land is located and pursuant to 27A O. S. Ann. §§ 3-3-114.

(b) **Eligible purposes.** Cost-share payments shall be available only for eligible conservation practices.

(c) **Eligible conservation practices.** Conservation practices that the Commission has approved shall be eligible for cost-share payments. A complete listing of the eligible conservation practices will be identified in the Commission's program year guidelines.

(d) **Requirement to file an application and conservation plan.** In order to qualify for a cost-share payment, an eligible person shall file:

- (1) An application for allocated funds.
- (2) A conservation plan approved by the district in which the eligible person's land is located.

RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

TITLE 155. OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION CHAPTER 20. CONSERVATION COST-SHARE PROGRAM

(A) PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED RULE:

The purpose of this proposed rule change is to extend the ability of locally led conservation districts to provide conservation and best management practices to an increasing number of lands including many located in more urban districts. This proposed change will also allow districts the ability to consider best management practices regarding the eradication of cedar trees and the implementation of other state programs like Firewise.

(B) CLASSES OF PERSONS WHO MOST LIKELY WILL BE AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED RULE AND ANY INFORMATION ON COST IMPACTS RECEIVED BY THE AGENCY FROM ANY PRIVATE OR PUBLIC ENTITIES:

These rules positively affect persons seeking assistance in implementing conservation and best management practices on their lands. No cost impacts are anticipated since the cost-share program is voluntary.

(C) PERSONS WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE PROPOSED RULE:

The rule change will provide certain persons within certain districts, once excluded from applying for cost-share funds, with the ability to apply to their conservation district for funds to implement conservation and best management practices.

(D) DESCRIPTION OF THE PROBABLE IMPACT OF THE PROPOSED RULE UPON AFFECTED CLASSES OF PERSONS:

It will make more persons eligible to apply for conservation cost-share funds, especially in those districts with a higher urban population.

(E) PROBABLE COST AND BENEFITS TO AGENCY; SOURCE OF REVENUE FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE PROPOSED RULE:

No additional cost to the agency is anticipated by the rule change.

(F) DETERMINATION OF WHETHER IMPLEMENTATION WILL HAVE ANY ECONOMIC IMPACT ON ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR REQUIRE THEIR COOPERATION IN IMPLEMENTING OR ENFORCING THE PROPOSED RULE:

No effect on any political subdivision is anticipated by the amendment to this rule.
