MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, January 4, 2016, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Mike Rooker. He stated this was a Regular Meeting scheduled in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted on December 30, 2015, at the front entrance of the building.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Clark led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the minutes of the December 7, 2015 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Steve Coffman, Financial Management Director, presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOGNITION OF EMPLOYEE OF THE QUARTER

Brooks Tramell, Awards and Recognition Committee member, stated that Jean Lemmon, Water Quality Program Senior Technical Writer, was named Employee of the Quarter during the December full staff meeting. Ms. Lemmon was recognized for that distinction.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Lisa Knauf Owen, Assistant Director, presented agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2. She recommended approval of the new agreements listed as (a) and (b). A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the new agreements as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen recommended approval of the continued agreement listed as (c). A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the agreement as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Trey Lam, Executive Director, presented travel requests for approval as listed in Exhibit #3 and recommended approval, pending approval from Secretary of Agriculture Jim Reese. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the requests as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT

Kim Tweed, Executive Secretary, presented the recommendations for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #4. A motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve district director appointments as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DECLARATIONS OF ABANDONED COAL MINE EMERGENCY

Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Land Program Director, requested ratification of the following AML emergencies previously approved by Mr. Lam as listed in Exhibit #5. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Clark to ratify the emergencies as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CO-SPONSOR THE NO-TILL OKLAHOMA CONFERENCE

Mr. Lam requested that the Commission co-sponsor the No-Till Conference scheduled for March 1-2, 2016, in Norman, Oklahoma. He stated there are two sponsorships available at \$1000 and \$500, and he recommended \$500 which includes one paid registration. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve co-sponsorship at \$500. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

FY2016 BUDGET RESCISSION AND REVISED BUDGET WORK PROGRAM

Mr. Lam reported that after tax money was certified in December it was determined there is a budget shortfall and the Commission will receive a rescission for the remainder of this fiscal year in the amount of six percent.

Mr. Lam stated that the Commission received a five percent reduction at the beginning of the fiscal year. Those reductions were met through elimination of district positions, reduced spending, reduction in district director meeting expense (from \$25.00 to \$20.00) and the Commission held \$1000 from each district for operating expenses. The Commission reduced a total of \$515,000 but only \$405,000 was required.

This new rescission will total \$298,000 in additional cuts. The Commission created a \$251,000 savings by leaving positions open and sharing duties. The Commission would realize more savings by suspending district director meeting expenses for the remainder of the year and leaving the Public Information Officer position open. Mr. Lam stated another challenge is the Conservation Infrastructure Fund. Funds from this account are coming in slower than expected and a portion of this money is used for conservation districts.

Mr. Herriman stated that not only is there a budget shortfall for the remainder of this fiscal year but the Commission will see reductions in the next fiscal year. He stated it is very important to convey to the districts the story that is ahead of us. The Commission is making cuts now to be ready for more. He agrees that the PIO position should remain vacant and that director meeting expense should be suspended.

Mr. Lam stated that when the budget stabilizes positions will be re-evaluated and filled to meet the workload needs.

SUSPEND DISTRICT DIRECTOR MEETING EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Clark to suspend district director meeting expense reimbursement for the remainder of FY2016 (January-June). Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Blayne Arthur, Deputy Commissioner, stated that the Department is also working on budget shortfall issues. She stated that positions will be left unfilled and that staff is smaller with greater regulatory responsibilities.

Ms. Arthur stated that the Department has published Administrative Rules regarding feral hogs and the comment period begins January 16, followed by a hearing scheduled for February 17. The board will vote on the rules in March. The rules develop a feral hog free zone beginning with most of the northwest quadrant of Oklahoma.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, stated that a budget has been signed and an additional \$160 million was added to the Emergency Watershed Program with Oklahoma receiving an additional \$500,000. There was also \$12 million added to the watershed rehabilitation program.

Mr. O'Neill stated that proposed changes to the Conservation Stewardship Program will be delayed until 2017 so the 2016 sign-up will be announced soon. All funds have been obligated for the Environmental Quality Incentive Program with initiative funding deadline on January 15.

Mr. O'Neill reported that the restructuring proposal will be send to the National office this month. He also reported on the following resignations: Steve Elsener, Water Resources Staff Biologist; Steve Clark, Resource Specialist in Claremore; and Terry Kenzie, Management Services Realty Officer.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Steve House, President, stated that the recent ice storm has caused power outages and challenges for most in his area. He expressed his sympathy to Mr. Lam on the loss of his home to fire.

Mr. House stated that a state meeting planning meeting will be held today to finalize a draft agenda. He also expressed interest in attending the National Association of Conservation Districts legislative fly-in.

Mr. House expressed his appreciation to the Commission for its assistance to OACD and stated that OACD is behind the Commission as it works through budget challenges.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Clark stated that parts of his area received 11 to 12 inches of rain which caused flow in many flood control structures.

Ms. LeGrand reported on attending a meeting in Cotton County Conservation District with legislators.

Mr. Herriman stated that a magazine, The Furrow, which is national and printed in 12 languages, has an article with Commission employee Greg Scott.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. He made a budget presentation to the joint house and senate budget committee. He also attended the Adair County Conservation District legislative luncheon where the directors performed the district evaluation. He encouraged district to invite legislators to their meetings.

Water Quality Program: Greg Kloxin, Assistant Director, stated a written report is in the packet and he yielded for questions.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He will be making a presentation to the Commission at the February meeting regarding OKMaps.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He stated the program has one ongoing construction project, two projects going through the contract process and one project awaiting an Authorization-To-Proceed. Environmental issues are delaying projects.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She stated because of the recent rains there is water in dry sites. Ms. Sawatzky stated that the Coalgate City Lake was rehabilitated in July 2011 and it flowed.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen stated a written report is in the packet. She attended the Bryan Conservation District Christmas meeting and it was well attended. The director of the economic development authority in Durant attended and reported on the economic boom in the area.

Ms. Owen met with Garvin and Murray County Conservation Districts to discuss shared secretarial services and both districts agreed that the Murray County secretary would provide services to Garvin. She advised that the Garvin secretary resigned and since that district is housed in the Murray County office due to mold issues this makes sense.

Ms. Owen stated that Mr. Coffman will be mailing out insurance information this week and that work with the district on payroll and taxes will begin.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, February 8, 2016, in the Agriculture Building Board Room, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30 a.m.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT EXECUTIVE ORDER 2016-01

Oklahomans rightly expect that public officers will be readily identifiable and accessible to the public and that relevant background and contact information will be prominently displayed on the website of each agency, board, or commission. Likewise, state law requires public bodies, as defined in Section 304 of Title 25 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to "make available on their Internet website the names of members of their governing bodies and such other information about the members as the public body may choose to include." 74 O.S. § 3106.2(C).

Accordingly, in order to increase transparency and improve the functionality and usefulness of the www.ok.gov website, I, Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma, by the authority vested in me pursuant to Sections 1 and 2 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution, hereby direct and order as follows:

- 1. Every State Agency website on www.ok.gov shall include a webpage accessible within two clicks of the homepage that includes, at a minimum, the name of each individual currently serving on the governing body; a telephone number at which each individual currently serving on the governing body may be reached or at which a voicemail message for the individual may be recorded; and an email address at which any or all of the individuals currently serving on the governing body may be contacted.
- 2. It shall be the responsibility of every State Agency to ensure that this Order is implemented in a timely fashion; to provide a state email address for all individuals serving on the Agency's governing body and to require its exclusive use when state business is being conducted via email; to ensure that posted information is reviewed for accuracy and updated, as needed; and to make certain that the members of the Agency's governing body routinely access, monitor, and respond to their electronic and voicemail messages.

This Executive Order shall be distributed to all members of the Governor's Executive Cabinet and the chief executives of all State Agencies, who shall cause the provisions of this Order to be implemented.




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

Accomplishments Over The Past Year:

- Improved soil health, water quality and air quality by providing technical assistance services to land managers (429 from locally led plus 223 from priority watershed);
- Inspected and operated Oklahoma's 2,107 small upstream flood control dams to sustain the \$2 billion
 public infrastructure, maintain the \$85 million in benefits that the flood control dams provide
 annually to the state and that protect more than 6,000 citizens living downstream of the dams; and
- Responded to more than 21,000 Okic One-Call locate tickets to prevent damage to our \$2 billion flood control dam infrastructure. Oklahoma's 2,107 flood control dams provided more than \$162 million in benefits during the historic storms that occurred from April to July 2015.

Savings, Efficiencies and Shared Services:

 equipping specialists for shared resource positions;
- Leveraged state cost share funding to private matching funds at a ratio of 1:1.2;
- By utilizing conservation district staff, Conservation Commission staff and our partnership with the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service, the state saved an estimated \$5 million by performing inspections of the state's 2,107 flood control dams.
- Utilized open source software in the development of the state geospatial clearinghouse, OKMaps, which eliminates being dependent on vendor-specific software licensing and maintenance fees;
- Began using the OMES conference calling/webinar service which allows for a significant reduction in travel time and expenses for Commission staff and partners to conduct meetings; and
- Purchasing, rather than leasing vehicles with the following goals in mind: lower fuel costs, lower monthly vehicle expenses, and extending the length of use per unit vehicle.








This project addressed a situation involving the sudden collapse of an abandon coal mine creating a vertical opening (VO). The project was declared an emergency on December 18, 2016. Mine maps indicate that there is an abandon coal mine directly under the site. Recovery efforts revealed no coal mine void but multiple utilities were encountered. Conclusion was that the combination of excavations for utilities, heavy rains, possible piping of water along utility conduits as well as settling of excavated areas resulted in subsidence and loss of soil. Area was backfilled with appropriate material and vegetated. Landowners are satisfied.

The project was completed on January 6, 2016, at a cost of \$8,950.

Dewayne Johnson Emergency

This project addressed a situation involving the sudden collapse of an abandon coal mine creating a VO. The project was declared an emergency on December 22, 2016. Subsidence was coal mine related but of a minor nature. No void was encountered but a large area of wasted timber, brush and trash from a past dump area was uncovered. The area was excavated of all unstable material, backfilled with appropriate soil and vegetated. Landowners are satisfied.

The project was completed on January 14, 2016, at a cost of \$8,350.
