CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met on Monday, March 2, 2015, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Karl Jett. He stated this was a Regular Meeting scheduled in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. Lisa Knauf Owen, Assistant Director, presented agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2. She recommended approval of the new agreements listed as (a) through (d). Ms. Owen recommended ratification of the amended agreement listed as (f) as this agreement received prior approval from Mr. Jett. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to ratify approval of the amended agreement as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RATIFICATION OF THE DECLARATION OF AML EMERGENCY

Robert Toole, AML Program Director, stated that ratification is needed for the Abandoned Coal Mine Emergency, Emergency Number OK2015-01-01; Emergency Name: LaValley in Henryetta, Oklahoma as listed in Exhibit #4. After discussion, a motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Herriman to ratify the AML emergency as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CO-SPONSOR THE NATIONAL LAND AND RANGE JUDGING CONTEST

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Rooker to co-sponsor the National Land and Range Judging Contest scheduled for May 5-7, 2015 in Oklahoma City. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

REGISTER EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AS THE COMMISSION'S LEGISLATIVE LIAISON

Mr. Lam stated that the Ethics Commission has adopted new rules for lobbyists that went into effect on January 1. With his title as executive director and in working with the legislature on legislative matters he will need to register with the Ethics Commission as a legislative liaison. He will be required to file a monthly report as to any amounts of monies spent on legislators. The cost of the filing is \$100. After discussion, a motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve registering Mr. Lam as the Commission's legislative liaison. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE USDA-NRCS

Shanon Phillips, Water Quality Program Director, is recommending approval of a Memoranda of Understanding with the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) to provide funding and staff support totaling \$1,550,000 in Environmental Protection Agency Clean Water Act, Section 319 funds and State funds toward completion of the Elk City Watershed Regional Conservation Partnership Program Project in return for \$1,400,000 in Environmental Quality Incentive Program funding from NRCS toward the same effort.

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the Memoranda of Understanding. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: No representative present.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, reported that the Oklahoma NRCS received its budget last week and will have an allocation for programs. The Environmental Quality Incentive Program allocation will be received soon but it will be lower than received last year. He stated that there will be a new air quality initiative in the EQIP. Mr. O'Neill stated that money for the Regional Conservation Partnership Program is new money. He also reported on the National Water Quality Initiative. Mr. O'Neill stated that the Conservation Stewardship Program signup has been extended to March 13.

Mr. O'Neill will be attending the Oklahoma No-Till Conference in Norman this week.

Mr. O'Neill stated that Oklahoma will receive around \$2.9 million from Emergency Watershed Program funding due to flooding in May 2013.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Steve House, President, stated it is a privilege to represent OACD. He has set up some committees to assist the OACD board. Kim Farber, past president, will work with the legislative committee.

He then reported on the recent OACD State Meeting and thanked Commission staff for their work as well as OACD staff and board members. It was a great meeting despite weather.

Mr. House stated that OACD is hosting a dinner on March 4 for new legislators. The OACD board has hired former house member Don Armes to work with legislative issues and activities.

Mr. House stated that Conservation Day at the Capitol is March 23 and details are being worked out. The NACD legislative fly-in is this month in Washington, D.C. The National Land and Range Judging Contest is scheduled for May 5-7 in Oklahoma with around 1500 kids from across the nation. The NACD South Central Meeting is scheduled for August 9-11 at the Hard Rock Hotel and Casino in Catoosa.

Mr. House stated that OACD is applying for a Conservation Incentive Grant for the Beaver River. The OACD received funding for its RCPP grant on soil health.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

All members reported on attending the state meeting and agreed it was a good meeting, despite the weather. Mr. Jett commended the Blue Thumb volunteers for their presentation on Tuesday and stated that we need to support them. They will be participating in Conservation Day at the Capitol.

Ms. LeGrand stated that her district is working with the county commissioners regarding insurance for equipment.

Mr. Herriman will be attending the Oklahoma No-Till Conference in Norman this week.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated the OACD State Meeting was excellent with a good turnout. He commended the OACD and Commission staffs for their work on the meeting.

Mr. Lam will be attending the NACD Spring Legislative Fly-In this month and will meet with Oklahoma's congressional delegation.

Conservation Day at the Capitol is being planned with OACD. Governor Fallin has been invited to visit the Commission's exhibit.

Mr. Lam stated that the FY2016 budget is up in the air and that district directors and employees need to meet with their legislators to let them know conservation is a priority. Legislative tours are being planned to highlight water quality and flood control structures.

Mr. Lam stated he will be attending board meetings in Valliant, Little River and Cherokee County Conservation Districts.

Mr. Herriman questioned progress with mediation in South Caddo and was informed it is going well.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She bragged on Ed Crall stating that he recently received his Certified Public Accountant certification.

Ms. Phillips provided a handout regarding the FY14 Load Reduction Estimates by State/Region that shows where Oklahoma ranks third in the nation for Nitrogen reductions, second in the nation for Phosphorous reductions and nineteenth in the nation for sedimentation. This success is due not only to the 319 program but the locally-led cost-share program as well as the poultry litter transfer program. The Environmental Protection Agency has not certified these numbers but will in the future. This program's success uses EPA funds on a voluntary basis.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He reported that GIS Day at the Capitol is March 12 and invited Commission members to attend.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report is in the packet and she yielded for questions.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Director, stated a written report in the packet and he yielded for questions.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen stated a written report is in the packet. She thanked the staff for working to make the OACD state meeting a success. She stated the session with Senator Anastasia Pittman and Representatives Leslie Osborne and James Lockhart was a tremendous success.

Ms. Owen stated that the Ethics Commission has now ruled that district directors no longer are required to file financial disclosure with the Oklahoma Ethics Commission.

Ms. Owen stated that the Commission's Human Resources Specialist has resigned and those responsibilities have gone to Mr. Coffman and his division. She stated there are numerous retirements in districts: Dee Surber, Grady County, effective March 1; both employees in Valliant, one effective March 1 and the other April 1; Washita County effective May 1 and Kiowa County effective March 15. Ms. Owen and Mr. Lam will be meeting with the Valliant and Little River Conservation Districts regarding the retirement in Valliant.

Ms. Owen stated that staff has met with the Oklahoma Emergency Management to close out the Sugar Creek Watershed project.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, April 6, 2015, in the Agriculture Building Board Room, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30 a.m.

Reasons for Emergency Declaration:

This project addresses an emergency situation involving the sudden awareness of an open abandon coal mine vertical opening (VO) in Henryetta, Oklahoma. The VO is an abandoned air shaft. It is approximately 24 inches in diameters by 56 feet deep. It is open, dangerous, and possible for someone to fall into without means of escape.

The VO is located in an active residential neighborhood with houses all around and is 75 feet from two streets. There is activity preparing this property for the building of a new house. There is substantial probability of harm to visitors.

Location:

It is located in the NE¼ of Section 1, Township 11 North, Range 12 East in Okmulgee County (Henryetta USGS Quadrangle), Oklahoma. Site is located in Henryetta, Oklahoma, near the intersection of Warden Camp Road and N. 5th Street.
