The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Tuesday, March 4, 2014, at the Reed Conference Center located at 5800 Will Rogers Road, Midwest City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 8:03 a.m. by Chairman Jim Grego. Sheryl Gibson, Financial Management Assistant Director, presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. Eldon Merklin, Conservation Cost-share Program Coordinator, was recognized for 16 years of service. Mr. Merklin will be retiring effective April 1, 2014.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Robert Toole, Assistant Director, presented agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2. Mr. Toole recommended approval of the amended agreements listed as (a) and (b). A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the amended as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Mr. Toole recommended approval of the new agreement listed as (c). He stated this will be one of several agreements with districts for use of equipment with watershed work. The Commission has a "floater" compact tractor loader with truck, trailer and all attachments. This equipment will be housed at the Latimer County Conservation District under the direction of Robert Hunnicutt, Equipment Manager. Districts will coordinate through Mr. Hunnicutt for its use. Districts must have their employees trained in the use of this equipment as well as have a Class A Commercial Drivers Licence. After verifying these requirements a district will enter an agreement with the Commission. Districts will be responsible for any repairs needed after the use of the equipment. Mr. Grego stated that the Latimer County Conservation District spent \$700 replacing the front end of the truck that hauls this equipment and asked if they could be reimbursed. Mr. Toole stated that they could submit a request to the Commission.

Mr. Graumann requested an explanation of how the watershed technicians and watershed aides are hired and how they work. Mr. Toole explained that the Commission hires three full-time watershed technicians. It also enters agreements with districts to hire and co-supervise watershed aides. These aides can assist any district in the state. This system is very efficient and very effective.

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Graumann to approve the new agreement as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: None. Motion carried.







INSIDE THIS ISSUE:

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A recent dust storm in Colorado, Oklahoma and Nebraska reminded many of the 1930s Dust Bowl. The Dust Bowl prompted the creation of our agency, then called the Soil Conservation Service, to protect our nation's soil. Though our name has changed, 79 years later soil conservation still remains a priority, as it helps producers increase their yields while ensuring the land becomes more resilient to erosion, drought and other natural resource threats. Many conservation practices, such as no-till, cover crops and windbreaks help decrease soil erosion. Furthermore, USDA studies show that soil erosion is reduced by 43 percent on lands that use conservation practices. Hugh Hammond Bennett, the first Chief of SCS, said "Take care of the land and the land will take care of you." This statement is truer today than ever, as NRCS, like other USDA agencies, works to address modern issues like climate change and develops methods for feeding an ever-growing population. To some, it is surprising to see dust storms like this in the modern age; it underscores the critical need for continued conservation on our nation's lands.




A wall of dust towers over Cimarron County during a dust storm on Jan. 9, demonstrating the persistent need for NRCS conservation assistance.

OUTREACH REVIEW

NRCS Participated in Eastern Red Cedar on Indian Land Workshop

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) was invited to participate by the Division of Natural Resources, Eastern Oklahoma Region, Bureau of Indian Affairs, in their Eastern Red Cedar on Indian Lands Workshop. The workshop was held at the Eastern Oklahoma Regional Office in Muskogee, Oklahoma on Wednesday, January 22, 2014. There were 16 Oklahoma Tribes in attendance. The purpose of the workshop was to inform the Oklahoma Tribes and Restricted Indian landowners of the Eastern Red Cedar encroachment, removal methods and commercial use. The focus of the workshop was to elevate the awareness of Eastern Red Cedar encroachment, fire danger, and impact on wildlife habitat, loss of grazing land and loss of water supply. The workshop will also include best methods to remove the Eastern Red Cedar.

Representing NRCS was Dr. Carol Crouch, State Tribal liaison. Dr. Crouch provided an overview of the NRCS Environmental Quality Incentive Program (EQIP) and shared NRCS initiatives to address the encroachment of Eastern Red Cedar. Dr. Crouch was honored by Alan Fletcher, Cheyenne District 2 Legislator, of the Cheyenne Arapaho Tribes of Oklahoma, in cedar smudging ceremony. To the Cheyenne, the Eastern Red Cedar (*Juniperus virginia*), is used ceremonially. The cedar is burned while praying either aloud or silently. The prayers rise on the cedar smoke and are carried up to the Creator.

NRCS Hosted a Tribal Workshop and Consultation Meeting with Oklahoma Tribes

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) partnered with the Oklahoma Tribal Conservation Advisory Council (OTCAC), the Citizen Potawatomi Nation (CPN) and the American Indian Science and Engineering Society (AISES) to host an informational workshop that provided the opportunity to explore ways to align the educational goals that AISES has for American Indian students with Tribal community needs and programs. Sarah EchoHawk, Chief Executive Officer, and Tribal member of the Pawnee Nation of Oklahoma, represented AISES at the workshop.

NRCS had the opportunity to consult with Tribes on their conservation needs, concerns and issues. Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, provided an overview of NRCS technical assistance and programs available to Tribes. O'Neill also discussed the NRCS educational initiatives available for Tribes; such as soil health. Dr. Carol Crouch, NRCS State Tribal Liaison, shared with attendees the career opportunities that are available with NRCS in the field of STEM. The workshop was attended by 21 Oklahoma Tribes. NRCS has had a strong partnership with AISES for the past 11 years and this partnership has provided the opportunity to promote diversity in our workforce as we work together to promote the importance of careers in the field of STEM. The workshop provided a unique opportunity to consult with Tribes and strengthen our communication pathways as we develop strong relations that promote conservation that will lead to us working together to protect and preserve our lands for future generations. 

KAY COUNTY – Medford Field Service Center




GARVIN COUNTY – Pauls Valley Field Service Center


JACKSON COUNTY – Altus Field Service Center

the importance of buying locally, healthy living, preventing identity theft, and self-defense. During breaks, those attending could visit booths set up by sponsors, local businesses, and vendors.


NRCS and the Jackson County Conservation District had a booth and distributed general conservation pamphlets and information about NRCS programs including CSP and EQIP.
