CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, March 4, 2019, at the Agriculture Building Conference Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Bill Clark. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, February 28, 2019, at the front entrance of the building.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the minutes of the February 11, 2019, Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell and Herriman. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Nancy Tackett, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Comptroller, presented the claims, purchase card summary and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, and Herriman. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

PRESENTATION OF COMMISSION AGREEMENTS

Mrs. Owen led a discussion about the possible approval of the following amended agreement (Exhibit #2):

Natural Resources Conservation Service (OCC-574) to provide assistance to NRCS and conservation districts through a shared staffing agreement for two clerical staff to carry out tasks to assist in the delivery of Farm Bill programs as well as administrative tasks for the conservation district. Amendment 1 adds two shared clerical staff in Pushmataha and Bryan Conservation Districts. Mrs. Owen would recommend the approval of the amendment as presented. A motion to approve was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, and Herriman. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUEST

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF RECOMMENDATION FOR APPOINTMENT OF CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTORS

Mrs. Owen presented the recommendation for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #4. She would recommend that these individuals be confirmed. Mr. Jett made a motion to approve and it was seconded by Mr. Campbell. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, and Herriman. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL TO CO-SPONSOR EVENTS

Trey Lam presented information regarding the upcoming Conservation Day at the Capitol on April 23 and National Land and Range Judging Contest on April 30 - May 1-2. He indicated that sponsorship would involve staff time for hosting the events. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the co-sponsorships of both events. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, and Herriman. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

VIEWING OF GRAND RIVER DAM AUTHORITY'S VIDEO PRESENTATION: *Our Borrowed Waters*

Following the viewing of the video presentation; Commissioner's thanked Ed Fite, VP of Water, Scenic Rivers and Water Quality for Grand River Dam Authority, for his partnership with the agency and commitment to improving water quality along the Illinois River. No action required.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

NEW BUSINESS

The Declaration of Emergency, dated March 4, 2019, for the Haileyville School 6 Abandoned Mine Land (AML) Emergency was ratified by the Commissioners with a unanimous vote. Under the provisions of the Oklahoma Public Competitive Bidding Act (Title 61 – Section 130), Trey Lam, as chief administrative officer for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, has the authority to declare an emergency with such action and the reasons thereof to be recorded in the official minutes of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission. The Haileyville School 6 AML Emergency involved the sudden collapse of an abandoned coal mine creating a vertical opening 10 feet in diameter and 7 feet deep. The site is in the Haileyville School yard/playground with a high probability of substantial harm to the students, school personnel and visiting public. The site is located at 200 Riley Avenue, Haileyville, Pittsburg County, Oklahoma. A motion was made for ratification by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Jan Lee Rowlett, , Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Legislative Liaison, reported on the following items:

- She is excited to begin working for the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture and looks forward to meeting everyone.

Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

- He is pleased that the last version of the Farm Bill from 2014 remained largely intact with the passage of the new Farm Bill. There were no programs that were lost in the passage.

- NRCS is currently awaiting the definite rules for the programs to implement the new Farm Bill.

- NRCS may begin to keep their field offices open on Saturdays in order to better serve the communities they reside in.

- There are ongoing efforts to walk tribal conservation districts through operations and development practices.

- Mr. O'Neil stated that he will be attending the Washington D.C. fly-in to visit with legislators and meet with leaders at NRCS's headquarters.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Larry Wright, President, reported on the following items:

- There was 69 conservation districts in attendance at this year's OACD State Meeting.

- Bill Jordan and Larry Wright will attend the Washington D.C. fly-in.

- OACD is looking to partner with the Chickasaw Nation on various conservation programs.

- OACD is interested in partnering with *Pollinators in the Rough*, which is a program aimed at installing plant material for pollinators on several golf courses around the state of Oklahoma.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Campbell reported that he thoroughly enjoyed the OACD State Meeting this year and had several good interactions with our legislators that were in attendance.

Mr. Jett reported that he believes that it is important to have senators and representatives involved in all of our conservation events. He states that those like Jim Grego are interested in being a strong partner to conservation in Oklahoma.

Mr. Herriman stated that he attended the OACD State Meeting and really enjoyed the new Soil Health speakers this year.

Mrs. LeGrand was not in attendance.

Mr. Clark stated he also attend the OACD State Meeting. He noted that it is fun to listen to people that are passionate about what they do.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. Mr. Lam reported on the following items:

- Attend the OACD State Meeting in Oklahoma City.
- Wanted to extend a warm welcome to incoming OACD President, Larry Wright.
- Met with the Cherokee Nation with Gary O'Neill to discuss conservation efforts.
- Met with the bonding authority. They propose to roll the new bond in with the current bond. This will result in a savings of approximately four-hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) with an improvement to the interest rate.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director stated a written report was in the packet. Ms. Phillips reported on the following items:

- Stated that she learned a lot from the Water Quality Conference in Wyoming that she and Greg Kloxin attended. She noted that some of the highlights were: Regular communication with all staff is essential in fostering an efficient work environment. She also stated that it is important for Water Quality folks to remind conservation districts ways in which they can serve them.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He noted that GIS Day at the Capitol is tomorrow and encouraged those with no prior commitments to attend.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation Program Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that: Construction was initiated on one project; Construction is on-going on two projects; four projects are pending environmental clearances; Vegetation & maintenance management is being performed on four projects; four projects are in the design phase; two sites are in realty phase, and; four sites are pending project selection.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director stated that a written report was in the packet. Ms. Sawatzky reported on the following items:

- Ms. Sawatzky and Janet Stewart (OCC General Counsel) attended a town-hall meeting in Perry, Oklahoma to discuss the rehabilitation of Perry Lake (Upper Black Bear Site 62). The meeting had lots of engagement from the public.

Assistant Director: Mrs. Owen noted that monthly activities are outlined in the written report. Mrs. Owen reported on the following items:

- The Agreement between Oklahoma State University and the Oklahoma Conservation Commission has been amended.

- Mrs. Owen, along with her staff, have been busy assisting OACD in the preparations for the State Meeting.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, April 1, 2019, in the Agriculture Building Conference Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30am.
