



#### **Accomplishments over Past Year**

- Completed the rehabilitation of three high hazard upstream flood control dams to bring the total completed to 22;
- Completed 141 rehabilitation assessments on high hazard upstream flood control dams (needed in order to qualify for federal construction funds for dam rehabilitation);
- Strategically placed 10 sets of maintenance equipment across the state to support the operation and maintenance of the state's 2,107 upstream flood control dams;
- EPA recognition and ranked in the top five states nationally for the reduction of Phosphorus and Nitrogen contaminants in Oklahoma's streams and rivers;
- Delisted 4 Oklahoma streams from the EPA 303d list of impaired streams;
- Reclaimed 64 acres of scarred abandoned coal mine land; and
- Assisted conservation districts and Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in the delivery of over \$22 million in federal conservation assistance to Oklahoma landowners.

#### Goals for Upcoming Year

 Complete the rehabilitation of 10 additional high hazard upstream flood control dams to bring the total to 32 (172 remaining);

- Complete hazard assessments on 225 upstream flood control dams;
- Perform operation and maintenance on 2,107 upstream flood control dams (backlog, \$22 million);
- Remove 10 additional stream segments from EPA's 303d list of impacted streams;
- Develop a 4 state implementation plan to reduce nutrient loading to the Grand Lake of the Cherokee's, in cooperation with the Office of the Secretary of the Environment, in order to begin addressing the blue green algae problem in the lake:
- Reclaim 160 acres of scarred abandoned coal mine land;
- Deliver through conservation districts and the NRCS, \$20 million in federal conservation assistance to Oklahoma landowners.

#### **Major Agency Projects**

- Rehabilitation of flood control dams to protect people living below high hazard dams;
- Operation and maintenance of 2,107 upstream flood control dams to provide \$81 million in annual benefits;
- Implementation of best management practices to improve the water quality in impaired priority watersheds;
- Monitoring of streams to assess nonpoint source pollution impacts;
- Reclamation of scarred mine land and continued management of the emergency reclamation program to protect citizens from abandoned mine land hazards;
- Support of conservation districts so that federal and state assistance, flood protection, reclamation, soil and water quality protection can be effectively delivered.

## Savings, Efficiencies and Shared Services in FY-2012

- During FY-2011, the 87 conservation districts were setup to receive reimbursements from the Commission electronically. The 87 conservation districts also moved from the submission of paper copies, on the minutes of monthly board meetings, to electronic submission.
- Efficiencies in the agency vehicle fleet resulted in reducing the number of leased vehicles by five.

#### FY 2010 AML SIMPLIFIED GRANT - The following is the status report on the submitted projects:

1. Shouse - 251 (Rogers County)

All reclamation work has been completed and the site has been planted. The project will be monitored per AML Program guidelines. Extreme heat in summer of 2011 and lack of rain may require the site to be re-planted.

2. Azbill - 246 (Rogers County)

All reclamation work has been completed and the site has been planted. The project will be monitored per AML Program guidelines.

Reves Phase 2 South - 101 (Sequoyah County)

The contractor, Goad & Sons Construction LLC, was issued a Notice to Proceed on January 6, 2011, with a contract time of 400 calendar days and a completion date of February 20, 2012. A change order has been submitted to the Department of Central Services requesting a time extension of 14 days to March 5. As of February 22, the contractor has completed approximately 95 percent of the work in 99 percent of the contract time. If the contractor has not completed all the work by March 5 liquidated damages of \$300 per calendar day will be assessed until all reclamation work has been completed at the site.

Peevyhouse - 140 (Haskell County)

The reclamation at the site is on hold until a dispute with the contractor is settled.

5. Bates/Fullerton - 259 (Rogers County)

The contractor, Ira M. Green Construction, was issued a Notice to Proceed on December 1, 2011, with a contract time of 252 days and a completion date of August 19, 2012. As of February 22, the contractor has completed approximately 10 percent of the work in 29 percent of the contract time.

4. Reves Phase 2 North - 102 (Sequoyah County)

The Office of Surface Mining must issue the authorization to proceed before the project can be submitted to DCS Construction and Properties Division to begin the bid and contracting process.

FY 2012 AML SIMPLIFIED GRANT - The following is the status report on the submitted projects:

#### 1. Bacon-251 (Rogers County)

The authorization to proceed was received from the Office of Surface Mining on February 13, 2012.

The Bacon abandoned mine land site is approximately 5½ miles northwest of the town of Chelsea, Oklahoma (population 2,136). The prominent topographical features and hazards contained within the project area are two HWBs (West Pit and North Pit), water-filled final-cut pits left unreclaimed by mining. Each pit has an associated DH located within 150 feet of well traveled roads. West Pit is oriented relatively north to south and bordered to the west by State Highway 28. North Pit is oriented relatively east to west and bordered to the north by EW 300 Road. The project area's landowner has witnessed trespassers frequently accessing the property via a wide shoulder area on the east side of the State Highway 28.

West Pit contains approximately 2,200 feet of DH running along nearly the entire west bank of the pit. The highest point of the highwall is approximately 50 feet above the surface of the waterfilled pit. The depth of water in West Pit is approximately 4 feet at the south end and l6 feet at the north end.

North Pit contains approximately 1,730 feet of DH running along nearly the entire north bank of the pit. The west end of North Pit is filled with water up to eight feet deep while the east end is dry. The associated highwall is approximately 66 feet high. A 0.2 acre pile of IRW within this dry section contains abandoned home appliances, furniture, farm equipment, and other refuse.

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission proposes to use federal funds from the Office of Surface Mining to correct the public safety hazards at the project. The proposed action calls for grading and revegetating approximately 37 acres of abandoned strip mine lands to: 1) eliminate approximately 3,930 feet of priority 2 dangerous highwalls , 2) eliminate the safety threat posed by two priority 2 hazardous water bodies totaling approximately 3.45 acres, 3) regrade and revegetate approximately 33 acres of priority 2 spoil areas , and 4) properly dispose of a 0.2 acre priority 2 industrial/residential waste dump.
