MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, April 7, 2014, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Jim Grego. He stated this was a regularly scheduled meeting in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted on April 3, 2014, at the front entrance of the building.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Jett led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Graumann and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the minutes of the March 4, 2014 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Steve Coffman, Financial Management Director, presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the claims and financial statement as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Robert Toole, Assistant Director, presented new agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2 and recommended approval. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the agreements as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CO-SPONSOR THE FOUR STATE FORESTRY CONFERENCE

Mr. Thralls stated that the Four State Forestry Conference is scheduled for April 24-26, 2014 in Texarkana, Texas and the Commission has been asked to co-sponsor the event. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve sponsorship of the conference. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Mr. Thralls presented travel requests for approval as listed in Exhibit #3. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Graumann to approve the requests as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT

Kim Tweed, Executive Secretary, presented the recommendations for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #4. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve district director appointments as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

COMMISSION'S STRATEGIC PLAN

Mr. Toole stated that the Commission is required to resubmit its 5 year strategic plan with the FY2016 budget request this year. Staff has been meeting to review revisions and will be meeting again on April 17 to review the mission, vision, values, behaviors, goals, and key performance measures. Staff would like to give members the opportunity to participate in the process. Mr. Jett asked about the possibility of getting private enterprise to provide monetary assistance to the Commission's programs. Mr. Grego stated that as a state agency the Commission would need to be aware of laws regarding monetary assistance.

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Herriman to appoint Mr. Grego and Mr. Rooker to work with Commission staff on the strategic plan. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

None. Mr. Toole stated that public comments are not to be used as a period of questions and answers but a time for the public to address members. Janet Stewart, General Counsel, confirmed that public comments are an opportunity for the public to address the Commission and that members

are not required to engage in conversation.

NEW BUSINESS

None.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: No representative present.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, provided a written report. He stated that the report contains information about the soil health initiative and the NRCS is working with the Commission and districts on this initiative.

Mr. O'Neill reported on the Farm Bill stating that the Environmental Quality Incentive Program and the Conservation Stewardship Program are on hold at this time and funds cannot be obligated pending the development of new guidelines. He also stated there were over 1,200 applications for the CSP signup.

Mr. O'Neill reported on a new program in the Farm Bill, the Regional Conservation Partnership Program. He has scheduled a meeting with the Commission and OACD staff to discuss this program in Oklahoma as the eligible partners for the program are very broad. Mr. O'Neill stated that NRCS staff is working to identify watershed sites for rehabilitation since the rehabilitation program could receive \$250 million under the new Farm Bill. A list of proposed projects is due this week.

Mr. O'Neill reported on staffing stating that Assistant State Conservationist Dick Zetterburg has been detailed for 90-days to the National office. Jamey Wood will serve as Acting Assistant SC for Programs in his absence, and Brent Pannell will serve in Mr. Wood's position. Three district conservationist positions are being opened in McAlester, Stillwater and El Reno. He also stated that student intern positions are open and four students will be returning who were interns last year.

Mr. Jett questioned how the announcement that the lesser prairie chicken is on the threatened list affect the NRCS programs. Mr. O'Neill does not see the listing as a deterrence for producers' participation.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Clay Pope, Executive Director, stated that the State Meeting was successful as was Conservation Day at the Capitol. The rainfall simulator demonstration at Conservation Day was also a success. He thanked the Commission staff for assisting with these events.

Mr. Pope stated that the OACD has received a grant from the Kirkpatrick Foundation to assist with the soil health initiative. The OACD will also be partnering with the Commission and the NRCS on this initiative. Mr. Pope also advised that the OACD has received an agreement with Midstream Access to purchase wildlife credits in addition to the pilot project with the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation. He stated that the OACD was disappointed with the Lesser Prairie Chicken being placed on the threatened list.

Mr. Pope stated that a number of OACD members attended Congressman Lucas's town hall meeting on the Farm Bill over the weekend and thought his remarks were timely. Mr. Pope stated that the OACD is interested in conservation easement funds being utilized to fix aging dams. He applauded the Commission and the Emergency Drought Commission for getting drought funds out to districts in a timely manner.

Mr. Pope has been approached by the Oklahoma Scenic Rivers Commission to assist with water quality monitoring. He also stated that because of a change in law the OSRC will not be able to use police officers as part-time park rangers.

Mr. Pope stated that staff will be attending the State 4-H Education meeting in Stillwater on April 17. He also stated that the OACD has partnered with the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum on joint projects.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

All members attended Conservation Day at the Capitol and commended the OACD and Commission staff on a good event. Mr. Herriman noted that his district was awarded the District of the Year award.

Mr. Rooker reported on attending the Murray County, Kay County and Payne County Conservation District banquets.

Mr. Jett reported on attending a meeting where OSU staff gave a presentation on the Farm Bill. He then reported on attending a meeting regarding Vance Air Force Base and encroachment easements. The Defense Department has initiated a \$12 million study to look at water issues at air force bases. Mr. Graumann stated that a similar meeting was held at Altus Air Force Base but it was not as issue oriented as the one in Enid.

Mr. Jett also reported on the Northwest Regional Fire Management Association stating that Beaver County is forming a burn association.

Mr. Graumann stated that he is working with Commission and district staff to identify producers for interviews that are participating in the Emergency Drought program.

Mr. Grego stated that Mr. Herriman was recognized by the Farm Bureau for his outstanding corn crop. Mr. Herriman stated that it was his best crop ever producing 223 bushels per acre. Mr. Grego also reported that the Talihina Conservation District has lost its full-time employee and will be requesting that it be filled with a full-time employee instead of the \$12,000 allocation. Mr. Grego noted that Karla Beatty, Education Coordinator, attended his district board meeting and will be assisting them with hosting a water festival at the Robbers Cave Park in conjunction with a Natural Resources Day.

Phil Cross and Scott Noland arrived.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Thralls reported on attending the National Association of

Conservation Districts Spring Fly-In as the president of the National Association of State Conservation Agencies.

Mr. Thralls reported on the legislative session stating that the Governor recommended that all agencies take a five percent budget reduction for this year. At this time we are unsure if this will become a reality. He stated that the Commission will be asking for \$3.4 million for watershed rehabilitation match money for FY2015 and then an additional \$6 million for FY2016 and FY2017. Mr. Thralls stated that after the education rally at the Capitol last week the Legislature is considering diverting funds from the Department of Transportation to common education.

Mr. Thralls stated that two bills are being considered for pay increases for state employees and the Commission is determining if this bill should would include conservation district compensation language.

Mr. Thralls stated that the Commission received notice to submit full application for two Conservation Incentive Grants.

Operations Chief: Lisa Knauf Owen stated there is a written report in the packet. She reported on attending a hearing regarding personnel legislation. Ms. Owen also stated that the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has contacted her about additional funds for the purchase of drills in conservation districts and prescribed burn associations.

Ms. Owen is assisting districts with their long range plans and assisting the NRCS with the field office restructuring study.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated there is a written report in the packet. She stated that because of the recent big events, the OACD State Meeting and Conservation Day at the Capitol, the Communications Team has not been as responsive to districts as they would like to be, but will now be able to focus on those activities more.

The press event held during Conservation Day highlighted the nonpoint source pollution reductions in Oklahoma, which resulted through the work of the locally-led cost-share program, the EPA funded cost-share program and the Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry poultry transfer program.

Ms. Phillips stated that a Blue Thumb celebration for teachers is being planned for the summer.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Mike Kastl, Director, stated there is a written report in the packet. He reported on two active sites and stated that the Northeastern State project is being extended while the Baumann project is ahead of schedule.

Mr. Kastl stated that the NRCS has 5 projects designed with one ready to bid.

Financial Management Division: Mr. Coffman stated that his report is included in the Operations Chief report.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Shellie Willoughby, GIS Specialist, stated there is a written report in the packet. She reported that the 20th Annual GIS Day at the Capitol was held this past month and had great participation.

Assistant Director: Mr. Toole stated there is a Conservation Programs Division written report in the packet. He appreciated the kind remarks about OACD and Commission staff and their work on the OACD State Meeting and Conservation Day at the Capitol. Mr. Toole stated that the Awards Ceremony was very good and that Representative Vaughan and Senator Fields attended to help recognize the Kay County district.

Mr. Toole stated that the watershed rehabilitation program has two ongoing contracts. The NRCS is developing a proposal for funds for the \$250 million available in the Farm Bill for watershed rehab. Watershed operation and maintenance is ongoing and watershed techs and aides have been detailed to Okmulgee County, Delaware County and Payne County Conservation Districts and will be detailed to Grady County soon. Mr. Toole stated that staff had conversations with the House Appropriations Committee Chair and Vice Chair regarding state match for Farm Bill money and while they understand and support watershed rehabilitation, they noted that this will be a tough budget year.

Mr. Toole stated that the Commission is actively involved with the Soil Health Initiative.

Mr. Jett attended the OACD state meeting workshop presented by Mr. Toole and Mr. Hathorne and he commended them on a very good workshop.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, May 5, 2014, in the Agriculture Building Board Room, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30 a.m.

There being no further business a motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Graumann to adjourn. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, Graumann and Grego. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 10:51 a.m.

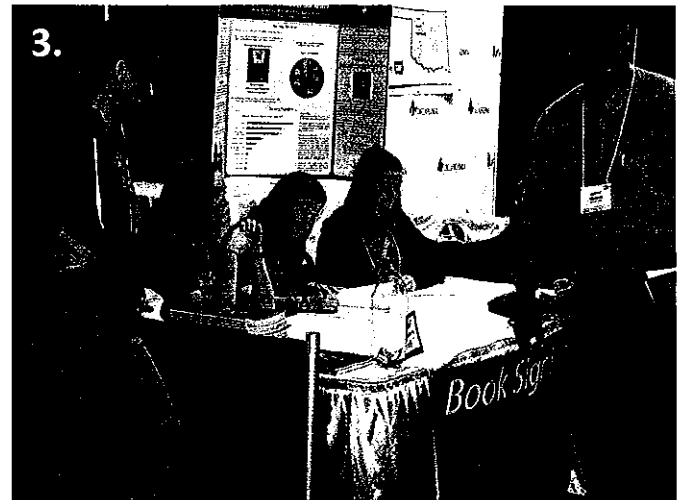
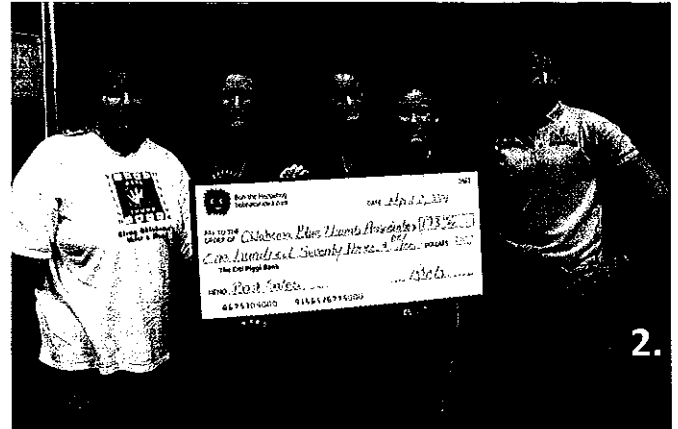
