MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, May 6, 2019, in the Agriculture Building Conference Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Bill Clark. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, May 2, 2019, at the front entrance of the Oklahoma Agriculture Building.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Bill Clark led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the minutes of the April 1, 2019 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Nancy Tackett, Comptroller, presented the claims, purchase card summary and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOGNITION OF COMMISSION EMPLOYEE

Tammy Sawatzky, OCC Conservation Programs Director, presented George Moore with an award for twenty-five years of service at the Oklahoma Conservation Commission. She stated that Mr. Moore was incredibly hard-working and dependable, and that our agency is lucky to have him on board.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Mrs. Owen presented two agreements listed as item "A-B" in Exhibit 2, for possible approval.

The first agreement is a ratification of a new agreement with the Natural Resource Conservation Service. It seeks to allow the OCC to provide technical and financial assistance for the Emergency Watershed Protection project, for Rainy Mountain Creek Site 23 in Kiowa County. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to ratify the agreement as presented. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

The second agreement is an amended agreement between the OCC and Natural Resource Conservation Service. The original agreement was to update the watershed fact and figures document, assists on the preparation of Emergency Action Plans, assists with the implementation of Dam Watch, and provides GIS data on the watershed program. The amendment to this agreement will add additional funding and extend the date of the original agreement. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the amended agreement. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Mr. Lam presented the out of state travel request as presented in Exhibit 3. The first request is a ratification to attend the SWAT for Beginners Workshop –Texas A&M University –May 6-8, 2019 –College Station, Texas. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to ratify this travel request. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

The second request was presented for approval for AML staff to attend the Surface and Groundwater Hydrology –Office of Surface Mining –July 15-19, 2019 –Columbus, Ohio. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the travel request. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF THE ATTENDANCE AND CO-SPONSORSHIP OF OACD SOUTHCENTRAL REGIONAL MEETING

Mr. Lam led a brief discussion about this year's annual NACD Southcentral Regional Meeting to be hosted at Winstar World Casino, in Thackerville, OK on July 21-23rd, 2019. Among other events to be held at the meeting, will be a tour of the Rock Creek Rehabilitation, an exhibit of a summer controlled burn, and water quality monitoring activities in the Chickasaw Recreational

Area in Sulphur, Oklahoma. Mr. Clark, Mr. Herriman, and Mr. Campbell all indicated interest in attending the event. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the co-sponsorship and attendance of Commission employees and up to five commissioners. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR

Mrs. Owen presented in Exhibit #4, a list of potential appointments of conservation district directors. She recommends approval as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the recommendations as presented. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE RATIFICATION OF THE FOLLOWING DECLARATION OF ABANDONED COAL MINE EMERGENCY

Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Land Division Director, led a brief discussion of the Purvis; OK 2019-02-02 emergency. He stated that there was a mine collapse just feet from the backdoor of a family home in Tulsa, Oklahoma. His crew was able to schedule a site showing for repairs for later today, May 6, 2019. Mr. Toole would recommend ratification of the emergency declaration as presented in Exhibit #5. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to ratify the declaration as presented. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECTIONS FOR POSITION #3

Mrs. Owen discussed with Commissioners the process for conducting conservation district elections. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to authorize Executive Director Lam to certify eligibility of candidates filing a Notification and Declaration of Candidacy for District Director Election and approve polling places in conservation districts where two or more candidates filed a Notification and Declaration of Candidacy for Elections. Those voting aye were: Mr. Clark, Mr. Herriman, and Mr. Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: JanLee Rowlett, ODAFF Legislative Liaison, reported on the following issues:

- They had twenty high school seniors participate in the Agriculture Youth Council.
- This year's legislation session is nearing an end.
- There have been confirmed reports of Elk Chronic Wasting Disease in Lincoln County, Oklahoma.

Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

- NRCS has been busy obligating EQIP funds.
- Chief Lore attended the National Land and Range Judging Contest and toured a watershed rehab site with Tammy Sawatzky and Janet Stewart.
- NRCS will host a meeting on Wednesday, May 8, 2019 about the upcoming Feral Hog Pilot Program.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Larry Wright, OACD President gave the following update:

- Although it was quite muddy, there was excellent participation in the land and range judging contest that OACD hosted.
- The Farm to Food Bank program needs more volunteers to ensure its success and continuity.
- OACD wrapped up their leadership class in Elk City.
- The Kaleo Foundation donated a truck-load of seed that are still available to be disbursed to conservation districts upon their request.
- Mr. Wright is looking forward to the Southcentral Regional Meeting in Thackerville, Oklahoma to be held in July, 2019.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Jett was not in attendance.

Mr. Campbell stated that he had a great opportunity to visit with the Natural Resource Conservation Service Chief at the Land and Range Judging Contest. He described Chief Lore as dedicated and personable. Mr. Campbell also stated that he graduated from the OACD Leadership Class.

Mr. Herriman stated that he had nothing new to report.

Mrs. LeGrand was not in attendance.

Mr. Clark stated he attended Conservation Day at the Capitol in Oklahoma City this year. He was impressed with the organization and implementation of the OCC's staff in speaking with legislators, and thought that they had a very meaningful impact.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. Mr. Lam reported on the following items:

- He stated that he was pleased with the Employee Training Session and that with a couple of exceptions, all district staff was in attendance.
- Mr. Lam said that he and his staff have been busy reviewing Conservation District's Long Range Plans.
- Mr. Lam stated that he attended five banquets this month honoring various objectives in Payne, Deer Creek, Kay, Pittsburg and Woodward Conservation Districts.
- Director Lam noted that the bond proceeds will be available for use by the end of May, 2019. Proceeds include five-million one-hundred thousand dollars (\$5,100,000.00) to be used as a match for dam rehabilitation.
- Clay Forst, of Jefferson County, will be our newest Commissioner for Area 4 and will be confirmed on May 8, 2019.

Water Quality Program: Mrs. Phillips reported on the following items:

- Her staff has been engaged in many education, outreach and training pursuits this past month, noting that Blue Thumb volunteers staffed six events this month. She also added that the Blue Thumb Staff have worked twelve days in a row this past month.

- Mrs. Phillips stated that the mid-year review with the Environmental Protection Agency went really well.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet.

- He noted that elevation data from FEMA has been received, and that he intends to make that information available on OKMaps soon.

- He stated that OETA is celebrating twenty-five years of Mesonet use that was originally funded by joint efforts of the University of Oklahoma and Oklahoma State University.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation Program Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that: construction was completed on one project, final inspection had been performed and the project site prepared for vegetation; construction is on-going on two projects; vegetation management is being performed on four projects; one project is being monitored for maintenance and we plan to send a Release Letter to landowner in June; three projects required minor maintenance and re-vegetation due to rainfall; five projects are in the design phase with two being designed by engineering firms and three being designed in-house; four projects are pending environmental clearances (American Burying Beetle); two sites are in realty phase; four sites are pending project selection. He concluded saying that the USFWS has proposed to down-list the American Burying Beetle to threatened and a bill has been introduced in the U.S. Senate to reauthorize the funding for AML reclamation by extending the fee collection for another 15 years. At present, the bill is a simple bill that extends the existing legislation to 2036.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director stated that a written report was in the packet. Mrs. Sawatzky reported the following items:

- She stated that employee training was good and that she has gotten several new inquiries about the Cost Share Program.

- She also noted that the bond news release has garnered attention for dam rehabilitation.

Assistant Director: Lisa Knauf Owen reported on the following items:

- Documents have been submitted for the bid process for the conservation district liability policy renewal and the workers compensation renewal to OMES Risk Management.

- Ms. Owen commended staff for their hard work on making the all district employee training a success.

- Prepared financial reports and funding reimbursement requests on 10 NRCS agreements.

- Ms. Owen noted that the gross production tax bill that funds conservation district administration and the cost share program was passed, extending the funds for another three years.

- Ms. Owen welcomed Bryan Painter to the Commission staff and commended him for the work he had accomplished in his first 30 days of employment. She referred the Commissioners to his portion of the Administration report to see the amount of public information disseminated in such a short period of time.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Tuesday, June 4, 2019 in the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Board Room. 2800 N. Lincoln Blvd, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma at 9:30am.

DECLARATION OF ABANDONED COAL MINE EMERGENCY

Under the provisions of the Oklahoma Public Competitive Bidding Act (Title 61 - Section 130), Trey Lam, as chief administrative officer for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, has the authority to declare an emergency.

Whenever the chief administrative officer declares an emergency, he/she shall notify the Oklahoma Conservation Commission and the State Construction Administrator - Office of Management Enterprise Services (Division of Capitol Asset Management - DCAM), of such action within 10 days. Such notification shall contain a statement of the reasons for the action, and shall be recorded in the official minutes of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission.

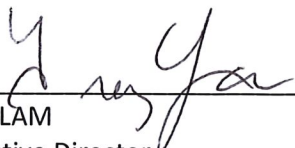

Reasons for Emergency Declaration:

This project addresses a situation involving the sudden collapse of an abandon coal mine creating an vertical opening. Erosion is taking dirt deeper underground. The current approximate dimensions are 2 feet diameter by 8 feet deep with a side opening extending an additional 7 feet.

This site is located in a densely populated residential area of Tulsa, Oklahoma, in the backyard of a family home. There is a high probability of substantial harm to the children, other family, utility workers, and visitors.

The vertical opening is located at 5424 East 17th Street in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The Legal description is NE SW of Section 10, Township 19 North, Range 13 East in Tulsa County (Tulsa USGS Quadrangle), Oklahoma. The geographic coordinates are: 36.13811, -95.91477.
