The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, May 2, 2016, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Mike Rooker. He stated this was a Regular Meeting scheduled in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. Steve Coffman, Financial Management and Human Resources Director, presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. RECOGNITION

Shellie Willoughby, GIS Specialist, stated that the Office of Geographic Information's OKMAPS project was awarded the Mid-America GIS Consortium's GIS Innovation Award during the 2016 MAGIC Symposium on April 26 in Overland Park, Kansas (see Attachment A). Members commended the OGITS division for this recognition.

- b. approve polling places in conservation districts where two or more candidates filed a Notification and Declaration of Candidacy for District Director and therefore will be holding elections on Tuesday, June 7, 2016.

CONSOLIDATION OF VALLIANT CD AND KIAMICHI CD

Ms. Owen presented the Administrative Order and Report of the Conservation Commission regarding the approval of the County Boundary Consolidation Plan submitted by and between the

Valliant Conservation District Board and the Kiamichi Conservation District Board as listed in Exhibit #5. The Kiamichi Conservation District would be on county boundaries of Choctaw County.

A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the consolidation as submitted. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSOLIDATION OF VALLIANT CD AND LITTLE RIVER CD

Ms. Knauf presented the Administrative Order and Report of the Conservation Commission regarding the approval of the New District Consolidation Plan submitted by and between the Valliant Conservation District Board and the Little River Conservation District Board as listed in Exhibit #6. The consolidation would result in a new Little River Conservation District within the McCurtain County boundary lines.

A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the consolidation as submitted. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Mr. Lam commended staff for their work with this consolidation process.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Blayne Arthur, Deputy Commissioner, stated that she has accepted a new job as the Executive Director of the Oklahoma 4-H Foundation and this would be her last Commission meeting.

On the legislative side, Ms. Arthur stated she has been watching new bills pertaining to the administrative rules process, feral hogs and the budget. She will be participating in a conference call today regarding proposed organic livestock and poultry practices.

Members and staff wished Ms. Arthur well in her new endeavor and stated it has been a pleasure working with her.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, provided copies of his quarterly report. He then stated that Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) pre-proposals are due May 10. The Conservation Innovative Grant period is now open.

Mr. O'Neill stated that thirteen students are being selected for summer work and they will start at the end of May. He stated that Chad Kacir, Assistant State Conservationist for Field Operations (Zone 2) in the northeast has been detailed to Headquarters for 120 days and that Cord

Colwell, District Conservationist at Claremore Field Office, has been named acting ASC for FO in Zone 2. April Burns, Water Resources Coordinator, has been named Acting Assistant State Conservationist (Water Resources).

Mr. O'Neill stated that the national conservation partnership consisting of RC&D, National Association of State Conservation Agencies, National Association of Conservation Districts and the employees association are working to get certification xx.

Mr. O'Neill stated that farm bill programs are on-going. The Quality Assurance Compliance Review was completed with a few findings and the Civil Rights Review will be in June.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Steve House, President, stated that the National Land and Range Judging Contest is this week as well as the OACD Executive Board meeting. They will be discussion opportunities and budget cuts.

Mr. House stated that the 2017 State Meeting will likely be held at the Embassy Suites in downtown Oklahoma City. The NACD Summer Board Meeting is scheduled for July 15-19 in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Clark hosted an OSU cow/calf cup at his ranch. Discussions included range and grazing management and prescribed burn.

Ms. LeGrand attended the retirement reception at Harmon County Conservation District for Lee Roy Hudson. She also attended a soil health training and an outdoor classroom for Washita County.

Mr. Jett attended the Woodward County Banker's Awards banquet and has been visiting with Area 1 district employees.

Mr. Rooker attended the Lt. Governor's turkey hunt in Okemah as well as the Oklahoma City Farm Show.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. He reported that the Governor signed the bill reauthorizing the Conservation Infrastructure Revolving Fund for three years. He appreciated the work of the OACD and OACDE for their work with getting this reauthorization.

Mr. Lam met with Congressman Russell's staff regarding the watershed program. He attended the retirement reception for Lee Roy and Sylvia Hudson in Harmon County, the Logan County Conservation District banquet and the Wagoner County Stewardship breakfast.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She stated the division will begin a new set of monitoring in northeast Oklahoma as well as continuing monitoring in the southeast. She stated that the division will be assisting the OACD

RCPP project for soil health demonstration farms with 319 funds by paying \$40 per acre. There will be ten farms with the maximum of 80 acres per farm. These are five year projects. Ms. Phillips stated that contracts will be with conservation districts and those agreements will be presented to the Commission for approval next month.

Ms. Phillips reported that the Oklahoma Cattlemen's Association and the Oklahoma Farm Bureau have approached the Commission for assistance in bringing the Leopold Conservation Award Program to Oklahoma. These organizations would obtain sponsors for the cash award and locally accept and judge applications. The state recipient would receive a \$10,000 cash award. It is proposed that the award could be presented during the OACD State Meeting or Conservation Day at the Capitol. Ms. Phillips provided a brochure about the award.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet and he yielded for questions. He stated that OKMaps added a live radar layer.

Mr. Sharp stated that Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Land Program Director, was attending an out of state meeting and that a written report from the AML Program is in the packet.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She stated that seven Emergency Watershed Program projects have been completed and that preconstruction meetings will be held in the next few weeks for the larger sites.

Ms. Sawatzky thanked Mr. Lam for his work in getting the Conservation Infrastructure Revolving Fund reauthorized. She thanked NRCS for their work with the EWP projects.

Mr. Lam questioned the use of AquaDam and Mr. O'Neill stated it was a devise used to divert water away from going through the head cut of dams.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen stated a written report is in the packet. She attended the Woodward County banquet and met with the Valliant board. Ms. Owen spent a day with Jeanette Lamb, water quality monitory staff, and commended her for the work she does.

Ms. Owen worked with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services on conservation district furlough plans as well as conservation district liability coverage and workers compensation insurance. She secured a Governor's Proclamation for Soil Stewardship Week and sent out a press release.

Ms. Owen stated that the Cherokee County district secretary submitted her resignation effective May 13.

During the 2016 MidAmerica GIS Symposium held on April 26 in Overland Park, KS, the OK Office of Geographic Information's OKMAPS project was awarded the MAGIC Award for GIS Innovation. The GIS Innovation Award is given to nominees who have demonstrated outstanding innovation using GIS technologies to benefit their community in the Mid-America region during the past two years. Contributions may have been through applications or projects that reflect creative utilization of GIS.

The MidAmerica GIS Consortium, Ltd. (MAGIC) is a nonprofit educational organization established to foster the applications of geographic information systems (GIS) and related spatial technologies in the mid-continent region. In 1998 the MidAmerica GIS Consortium initiated a series of awards to recognize and honor public agencies, firms, organizations and individuals that have made especially noteworthy contributions to advancing the state-of-the-art and application of geographic information technologies in MidAmerica. These biennial awards are presented at each MidAmerica GIS Symposium.

Nominations for Consortium awards are explicitly solicited from state GIS organizations affiliated with MAGIC, past honorees and other MAGIC-affiliated organizations (e.g., corporate members); individuals may also submit nominations. The awards are then voted on by the 9 state GIS organizations affiliated with MAGIC with each state getting one vote.

The nomination submitted for the OKMAPS project was as follows: In todays out of the box solutions for a GIS Clearinghouse Oklahoma's Office of Geographic Information determined what the OK GIS Community needed and took a different direction. OKMAPS is developed on an open source platform that exhibits a can do attitude & spirit of generosity that is the "Oklahoma Standard". OKMAPS not only created an open platform repository for housing GIS data but developed GIS utilities to enable the integration of data into end user applications. With the ability to download in many formats & projections, reproject, direct connect to services, or upload local data & share to anyone with only an internet browser OKMAPS is one of the most robust functionally customizable no cost publically available GIS resources in the region. This all has been accomplished by dedicated individuals who devote countless unfunded hours to make OKMAPS a model of what can be accomplished on a limited budget.

The Oklahoma Office of Geographic Information (OGI) is an agency of the State of Oklahoma housed within the Oklahoma Conservation Commission. The OGI was created to coordinate the development, maintenance and distribution of location-based geographic information for the State of Oklahoma while eliminating duplicative activities. The OGI does not receive any appropriated funding from the State. The OKMaps project is funded through grants from the FEMA Grant Programs Directorate, U. S. Department of Homeland Security and the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security.


