g. Kiowa County Conservation District (OCC-584) to provide funds for a full-time Watershed Aide with the majority of time dedicated to O&M program duties. The work area for this agreement is all of Kiowa and Washita County Conservation Districts; with the aide headquartered in Kiowa County Conservation District.

h. Murray County Conservation District (OCC-585) to provide funds for a full-time Watershed Aide with the majority of time dedicated to O&M program duties. The work area for this agreement is all of Murray and Johnston County Conservation Districts; with the aide headquartered in Murray County Conservation District.

i. Noble County Conservation District (OCC-586) to provide funds for a full-time Watershed Aide with the majority of time dedicated to O&M program duties. The work area for this agreement is all of Noble, Pawnee, Garfield and Payne County Conservation Districts; with the aide headquartered in Noble County Conservation District.

j. Okfuskee County Conservation District (OCC-587) to provide funds for a full-time Watershed Aide with the majority of time dedicated to O&M program duties. The work area for this agreement is all of Okfuskee, Hughes and Seminole County Conservation Districts; with the aide headquartered in Okfuskee County Conservation District.

k. Pontotoc County Conservation District (OCC-588) to provide funds for a full-time Watershed Aide with the majority of time dedicated to O&M program duties. The work area for this agreement is all of Pontotoc and Coal County Conservation Districts; with the aide headquartered in Pontotoc County Conservation District.

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, June 4, 2019, in the Agriculture Building Conference Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Bill Clark. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, May 30, 2019, at the front entrance of the Oklahoma Agriculture Building.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Bill Clark led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the minutes of the May 6, 2019 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOGNITION OF COMMISSION EMPLOYEE

Henry Roye was unable to attend the meeting due to potential AML emergency. His recognition will be rescheduled for a future Commission meeting.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Nancy Tackett, Comptroller, presented the claims, purchase card summary and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mrs. LeGrand to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Mrs. Owen presented a new agreement listed as item “a” in Exhibit #2. She recommended approval of this new agreement as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mrs. LeGrand to approve this new agreement. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Mrs. Owen next presented amended agreements listed as items “b through s” in Exhibit #2. She recommended approval of these amended agreements as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve these amended agreements. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Mrs. Owen next presented two continued agreements listed as items “t and u”. She noted that there are no changes to these agreements for the coming year and recommended their approval. A motion was made by Mrs. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the continued agreements. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

The final agreement presented by Mrs. Owen is for the possible ratification of a new agreement listed at item “v” in Exhibit#2. She recommended ratification of the new agreement. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to ratify the new agreement. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Trey Lam, Executive Director, presented the out of state travel requests for approval as listed in Exhibit #3. Mr. Lam recommended the approval of the out of state travel requests as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mrs. LeGrand to approve the travel requests. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR

Ms. Owen presented the recommendation for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #4. She recommended approval as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the recommendations as presented. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL TO DECLARE THE CANDIDATES IN DISTRICTS WHERE ONLY ONE ELIGIBLE PERSON FILED A NOTIFICATION AND DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY AS ELECTED TO POSITION #3

Mrs. Owen led a brief discussion about the rules and regulations pertaining to the election declaration. Ms. Owen presented the list of eligible individuals filing a Notification and Declaration of Candidacy for Elected Position #3 as listed in Exhibit #5. She recommended that the positions be declared “elected”. A motion was made by Mrs. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Jett to declare the positions elected. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL TO DECLARE POSITION #3 VACANT IN CONSERVATION DISTRICTS WHERE NO ONE FILED FOR ELECTION.

Mrs. Owen presented a list of districts where no one filed for election of Position #3 as listed in Exhibit #6. She recommended that this position be declared vacant so that districts can work to appoint an individual to that board position. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Jett to declare these positions vacant. Those voting aye were: Clark, Herriman, Campbell, Jett and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

REVIEW OF CONSERVATION DISTRICT ELECTIONS WHERE MORE THAN ONE CANDIDATE FILED FOR ELECTED POSITION #3 (EXHIBIT #7)

Mrs. Owen discussed with Commissioners the process for conducting conservation district elections. No action was required to be taken.

DISCUSSION OF THE COMMISSION’S FY2020 APPROPRIATION AND BUDGET

Mr. Lam directed a discussion about the Oklahoma Conservation Commission’s FY2020 budget as passed by the legislature and signed by the Governor. He indicated that the budget will be presented for approval at the July 2019, Commission meeting. Director Lam noted that one of the most important components this year will be filling some of the mission critical watershed aid positions around the state. He also stated that Commission employees, including district employees, will see a modest pay raise. No action required.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Kirby Smith, representing Congressman Lucas’ office presented Mrs. LeGrand with a certificate of appreciation for her service to the Commission.

NEW BUSINESS

No New Business.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: JanLee Rowlett, ODAFF Legislative Liaison, reported on the following issues:

- They are currently in the middle of the budgeting process.
- They have finished the legislative session, with updates being successful for animal related issues.
- Secretary Arthur toured flooding damage around the state.
- They anticipate more funding for wildfire prevention efforts and for the Feral Hog Pilot Program.

Natural Resources Conservation Service: Stacey Riley, Assistant State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

- EQIP funds have been obligated and are now off the books. \$9,000,000 of the \$20,000,000 has already been obligated.
- The State of Oklahoma has submitted a proposal for the Feral Hog Pilot Program with NRCS.
- Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) has been busy assessing the damage caused by flooding.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Sarah Blaney, OACD Executive Director gave the following update:

- Ms. Blaney stated that she had the opportunity to speak at an event in Houston, Texas about the 2501 Grant Program. The 2501 Grant Program is aimed at outreaching the socially disadvantaged producers. She noted that the Farm Bill will increase 2501 Grant Program funding by one-hundred and fifteen thousand dollars (\$115,000.00) to Conservation Districts. OACD plans to reapply for funding with this grant program in the coming year.
- OACD is working on plans to host the NACD South Central Meeting in Thackerville, Oklahoma on July 21-23rd, 2019.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Jett stated that he has had flooding issues at his residence.

Mr. Campbell stated that he had a wonderful opportunity to attend a small farmer's conference at Langston University.

Mr. Herriman stated that he had nothing new to report.

Mrs. LeGrand stated that this will be her last meeting as a Commissioner as she is going off of the board. She intends to stay active in state and local conservation efforts. Mrs. LeGrand introduced her husband, Roy LeGrand, as well as her grandchildren Dax and Carli.

Mr. Clark stated he has been assisting Amy Seiger, OCC Program Coordinator, with an upcoming soil health seminar.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. Mr. Lam reported on the following items:

- Mr. Lam thanked Mrs. LeGrand for her service to the Conservation Commission and

commended her on her willingness to participate and represent the Agency whenever necessary. He also presented Mrs. LeGrand with a citation from State Senator Jech and State Representative Russ for her service to the Commission, along with a certificate of appreciation from the agency.

- He and staff met with the newly appointed Area Four Commissioner, Clay Forst. Mr. Forst is from Jefferson County.

- Mr. Lam said that he attended a stewardship breakfast in Wagoner County.

- Mr. Lam also noted that Mrs. Owen and he attended the Governor's summit for agency leaders. He noted that he enjoyed listening to Sam Presti, Thunder's General Manager, speak. Director Lam reported that Governor Stitt wants to "leave Oklahoma better than we found it", and incorporate twenty-five percent (25%) of Oklahoma's land in active conservation programs. Governor Stitt also heavily promoted the idea of improving customer relations with state agencies.

Water Quality Program: Mrs. Phillips reported on the following items:

- She stated it has been a privilege to have worked with Commissioner LeGrand over the past few years.

- Mrs. Phillips stated that the education teams, both Soil Health and Blue Thumb, have been busy the past month with training new employees and building volunteer monitoring programs.

- The Water Quality program has been working on completing the water quality success stories for the Environmental Protection Agency.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet.

- He noted that the USGS Stream gauge data, which measures water levels and flow rates, is now available as a layer in OKMaps.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation Program Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that: Henry Roye could not be present to receive his 30 year service recognition due to working an AML sudden occurrence in a residential area in Wilburton that we are going to recommend be declared an emergency; additionally, Henry is awaiting a call from the City of Coalgate regarding another sudden occurrence that could be AML related. The City is trying to ascertain if they have a sewer main involved. Toole continued by saying: construction was to have been completed on one project but rain days in May have shut down construction on all AML reclamation projects thus construction is on-going on three projects; vegetation & maintenance management is being performed on four projects; seven projects are in the design phase with three being designed by engineering firms and four being designed in-house; four projects are pending American Burying Beetle surveys and a request for proposals has been mailed to prospective vendors; two sites have had rights-of-entry acquired.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director stated that a written report was in the packet. Mrs. Sawatzky reported the following items:

- She stated that the dams worked remarkably well during the major flooding events of the past month.

- She would like to extend her gratitude to Anita Kaufman in Payne County, Johnny Pelley for assisting in Logan County, and Wade Warren in Pawnee, Noble and Garfield Counties for working hard to assess the condition of the dams and to take pictures of the flooding events.

Assistant Director: Lisa Knauf Owen reported on the following items:

- Clancy Green has been busy reviewing the Conservation District's Long Range Plans. She stated that they will be used as benchmark tools for the Conservation Districts.

- Ms. Owen commended conservation district's hard work in responding to the flooding events. She stated that the media used a lot of their pictures and articles.

- Frank Acker, from Little River Conservation District, will be retiring at the end of August.

- Mrs. Owen noted that Oklahoma received four grants with NACD to help deliver Farm Bill programs. Technicians will be hired in Logan, Pontotoc and Custer County Conservation Districts. The archeology positions were continued in Oklahoma County that assist statewide.

- Mrs. Owen reminded everyone that following the Commission meeting; everyone was invited to attend a luncheon honoring Mrs. LeGrand for her service to Commission.

SELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2020

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mrs. LeGrand to appoint Mr. Jett, Chair; Mr. Campbell, Vice Chair; and Mr. Herriman, Secretary. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

FISCAL YEAR 20 - PROPOSED DISTRICT POLICIES

1. All employee positions (District and Commission) that become vacant will be reviewed and will require justification before approval to fill the position. Future employee allocations will be dependent on the level of legislative appropriations.
2. The maximum number of hours for a non-benefitted temporary district employee will be 1599 hours. However, if the employee works more than 999 hours, the district will be responsible for the employer's share of retirement contributions.
3. Districts were required to have long range plans approved by Commission staff prior to June 30th, 2019. Any district not receiving approval by the deadline will be given a provisional funding allocation. If final Commission approval is not received by September 1, 2019 the allocation will be reviewed and potentially reduced. The reduction may result in loss of staff.
4. Failure to perform audits and/or submit preclaim payments (for retirement and insurance) within the established timeframe will result in OCC withholding payment of district claims until compliance is accomplished.
5. In order for a district to be eligible to continue receiving a personnel allocation from OCC; the districts must perform annual performance evaluations on all staff.

The site is located in a residential area of Wilburton, Oklahoma, in the backyard of a family home. The overburden has fallen straight down into what appears to be an abandoned mine room or entry. There is a high probability of substantial harm to the family and visitors.

The site is located at 141 Yellow Brick Road, Wilburton, Oklahoma. The vertical opening is in the back yard approximately 20 feet northwest of the back door. The Legal description is the NE SE of Section 9, Township 5 North, Range 19 East in Latimer County (Wilburton USGS Quadrangle), Oklahoma. The geographic coordinates are: 34.91571, -95.29753.
