The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, July 11, 2016, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Scotty Herriman. He stated this was a Regular Meeting scheduled in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. A motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the minutes of the June 6, 2016 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Steve Coffman, Financial Management and Human Resources Director, presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOGNITION OF CONSERVATION COMMISSION EMPLOYEES

Tammy Sawatzky, Conservation Programs Director, recognized Dennis Boney, Watershed Technician, for 30 years of service.

Karla Spinner, Awards and Recognition Committee Chair, read the nomination submitted for Greg Kloxin, Water Quality Program Assistant Director, for being named Employee of the Quarter. She also stated that Jeri Fleming, Blue Thumb Water Quality Education Program Environmental Programs Manager, was named Employee of the Year and re-read her nomination form.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Ms. Owen presented agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2. She recommended approval of the amended agreements listed as (a) through (e). A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the amended agreements as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen recommended approval of the continued agreements listed as (f) through (h). A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the continued agreements as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen recommended approval of the new agreements listed as (I) through (n). A motion was made by Mr. Rooker and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the new agreements as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Trey Lam, Executive Director, presented the travel request for approval as listed in Exhibit #3. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the request as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

NACD SOUTH CENTRAL REGION MEETING

The National Association of Conservation Districts South Central Region Meeting will be held on August 10-12, 2016 in Little Rock Arkansas. Mr. Lam recommended two members to attend as well as him. After discussion, a motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the attendance of Mr. Jett, Mr. Rooker and Mr. Lam. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. Mr. Lam encouraged all members to attend either on their own or as a district director.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT

Kim Tweed, Executive Secretary, presented the recommendations for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #4. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve district director appointments as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RESULTS OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECTIONS FOR POSITION #3

Ms. Tweed stated that District Director elections for Position #3 were held in the Cherokee County Conservation District and the Texas County Conservation District and the results are listed in Exhibit #5. As authorized by the Commission, Mr. Lam declared the candidate receiving the highest number of votes as elected. No action necessary.

CONSERVATION DISTRICT JOINT PLANS OF OPERATIONS

Ms. Owen recommended approval of the Joint Plans of Operations as listed in Exhibit #6. A motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the plans as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RE-AUTHORIZATION OF BUDGET AND DISTRICT STAFFING COMMITTEE

Mr. Lam recommended re-authorizing the Budget and District Staffing Committee for FY2017. He stated the committee consists of two district employees, two district directors, two Commission members, Jamey Wood with NRCS and Ms. Owen and Mr. Lam. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to re-authorize the committee as outlined. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION - FISCAL YEAR 2017:

Executive Director Salary: Ms. Owen stated that the Commission needs to set the salary for the Executive Director for FY2017. His current salary is \$70,500. A motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Jett to set the salary for FY17 at the same level of \$70,500. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Conservation District Director Meeting Expense (maximum of 12 meetings): Mr. Lam recommended setting the maximum district director meeting expense at \$25.00 per meeting. He stated that staff is recommending that there not be a separate account for this expense this year but that districts could choose to pay the reimbursement from its \$2,000 allocation. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Rooker to set the maximum at \$25.00 with reimbursement coming from the district's \$2,000 allocation. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Allocations to Conservation Districts for Personnel and Operating Expenses: Mr. Lam stated that the allocation to districts for personnel includes gross salary and FICA. As stated earlier Mr. Lam is recommending that each district receive \$2,000 in operating expenses and that those funds could be used for district director meeting expenses if the district so chooses but there would not be a separate account for this expense. It was noted that McIntosh County and Checotah Conservation Districts receive \$1,000 each in operating expenses as these districts share office space.

Mr. Lam stated that staff is recommending reductions to part-time allocations for the following districts: Deer Creek, Ellis County, Haskell County, Hughes County, LeFlore County, North Caddo, Okmulgee County, Pittsburg County, Sequoyah County, Tillman County and Wagoner County.

After discussion, a motion was made by Ms. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the allocations to districts as listed in Exhibit #7. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Budget Work Program: Mr. Lam detailed the Budget Work Program as outlined in Exhibit #8 and stated that the Commission has received over sixteen percent reductions since the same time last year. He stated that the Administration category has been reduced by \$80,000. Mr. Lam stated that under Watershed Operation and Maintenance, which includes rehabilitation, revolving funds for emergency repairs (\$1.8 million) and the remainder of the supplemental allocation in the amount of \$3 million received two years ago. Field Services includes allocations to districts as well as money received from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. It also includes benefits for employees and district liability insurance. Mr. Lam discussed the categories of Abandoned Mine Lands, Water Quality/Wetlands and Data Processing.

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the Budget Work Program as listed in Exhibit #8. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. Mr. Lam thanked the Commission staff for their work with the budget this year.

Personnel and Financial Management Policies: Ms. Owen recommended approval of the personnel and financial management policies as listed in Exhibit #9. She stated that the first five were basically the same from previous years with a few housekeeping changes. Staff is recommending a new policy listed as (6) that would require all districts with two or more employees to enter an agreement with neighboring districts with less than two employees to provide assistance.

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the policies as listed in Exhibit #9. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Rod Wanger, Farm Service Agency Conservation Programs Director, addressed the Commission on FSA Programs. He stated that the loan programs are available for assistance with wheat prices.

The Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) & Price Loss Coverage (PLC) enrollment deadline date is August 1. The Emergency Conservation Program contains eight to nine million dollars for assistance to counties with fires in northwest Oklahoma, tornado damage in central Oklahoma and damage from flooding in 2015 and 2016.

Mr. Wanger reported that 13,000 acres were accepted in the Conservation Reserve Program out of 50,000 acres offered. He then introduced Joy Alspach who has joined the FSA Conservation Programs division from the NRCS.

NEW BUSINESS

None.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Jeremy Seiger, Agricultural Environmental Management Services Director, provided a handout regarding the Leopold Conservation Awards. Ten states participate in this award which would cost around \$40,000 to bring to the state. The recipient receives a \$10,000 cash award. Fund-raising efforts are underway and applications will be taken beginning October 1.

Mr. Seiger provided a copy of a news release highlighting the work done in the Illinois River by Oklahoma and Arkansas with phosphorous reduction. He commended Shanon Phillips, Water Quality Program Director, for her assistance with the release.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, appreciated the news release on the Illinois River and that the NRCS and USDA were recognized for their efforts as well. He stated that the Civil Rights Review was completed last week.

Mr. O'Neill reported on the Environmental Quality Incentive Program stating that ninety percent of the funds have been obligated. A sign-up was held on the monarch butterfly initiative but no applications were received so a second sign-up will be held. The Conservation Stewardship Program for 2017 will be rolled out in October.

Mr. O'Neill stated that the Watershed O&M Engineer position will be filled quickly. He stated that a tribal conservation position will be placed in northeast Oklahoma to work with the tribes. He also reported that Brooke Taylor will be filling the position left vacant by Joy Alspach.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Steve House, President, reported on attending the Rogers County Conservation District 75th Anniversary celebration and shared a picture taken of eight current/former presidents of the Association. He stated that Rick Jeans will be representing Oklahoma at a meeting Minnesota. Mr. House will be attending the National Association of Conservation Districts South Central Meeting. He reported that a demonstration farm meeting will be held in Goldsby on July 21. The Executive Boards of the OACD and the Oklahoma Association of Conservation District Employees will be meeting on August 16 to begin planning for area and state meetings.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Rooker attended a watershed tour in Seminole County for legislators and staff.

Mr. Jett attended a cover crop tour in Beaver County.

Mr. Clark attended a seminar in Minnesota regarding soil health and reported that a producer is running a cattle operation without hay or feed.

Ms. LeGrand attended the Rogers County Conservation District 75th Anniversary as well as a local plant ID Seminar.

Mr. Herriman introduced his wife Jo.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. He reported on a tour of flood control structures in Seminole County for staff members of Congressman Russell, Senators Inhofe and Lankford, and Representative Newell. Mr. Lam attended the final meeting of the Oklahoma Scenic Rivers Commission before it was consolidated with the Grand River Dam Authority.

Mr. Lam attended a Summer Fire Field Day in Noble County where around 90 people were in attendance. He also attended the Rogers County Conservation District 75th anniversary.

Mr. Lam saluted the Employee of the Quarter and Employee of the Year.

Water Quality Program: Greg Kloxin, Assistant Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He stated that the National Wetlands Assessment has been completed with 17 site visits. Two sites will be re-visited this week. Mr. Kloxin stated that Plant ID workshops continue with one being held in Kenton on July 27 and one in Beaver on July 29.

Mr. Kloxin thanked the ODAFF for the news release outlining work done on the Illinois River. He then reported that Cheryl Cheadle, Blue Thumb Director, will be retiring from the Commission on September 1 to take another position elsewhere.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report was in the packet. He yielded for questions.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Director, stated a written report was in the packet. The mission of the Program is to protect lives, repair scarred lands and improve the environment. He stated that weather has delayed some activity but the rain was needed for some vegetation.

Mr. Toole stated that planning on underground mine sites in LeFlore County has identified 41 sites involving seven landowners. Aerial surveys have been completed on 14 sites in Rogers, Haskell and Leflore Counties and bathymetric surveys are progressing on those site. Designs are on-going for two sites, construction is progressing on three sites, maintenance has been completed on one site with maintenance scheduled on three site, and vegetation completed on two sites.

Mr. Toole stated that the Office of Surface Mining performed an evaluation of the program and it received a favorable report.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report was in the packet. She stated that Cost-Share Program Year 16 concluded June 30 and she will get a final report prepared. Under Program Year 17 three districts have already spent their money.

Ms. Sawatzky reported on the Emergency Watershed Program stating that 18 sites have been completed. Design work is being done on four sites from December 2015 floods. She also reported that repairs will need to be made on sites that did not qualify under the EWP.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen stated a written report was in the packet. She reported on attending Tech Trek at Southwestern Oklahoma State University. This program is for 8th grade girls. She is continuing discussions with the OSU Extension on shared positions.

Ms. Owen stated that the Lincoln County Conservation District theft investigation has been completed resulting in five arrests. The large equipment was recovered but the pickup was burnt so this will be included in the restitution amount.

She commended staff on their work with the budget.

Mr. Herriman expressed his appreciation to Mr. Lam and Ms. Owen for their work with the budget.

NEXT MEETING

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, August 1, 2016, in the Agriculture Building Board Room, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30 a.m.

RECOMMENDED POLICIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017

- 1. All employee positions (District and Commission) that become vacant will be reviewed and will require justification before approval to fill the position; shared positions between 2 or more districts will be encouraged. Future employee allocations will be dependent on the level of legislative appropriations.
- 2. When an equipment manager position becomes vacant in districts, the position may transition to a non-benefitted position with a cash allocation for part-time help subject to availability of funds and Commission approval.
- 3. The maximum number of hours for a non-benefitted part-time district employee will be 1599 hours.
- 4. Failure to perform audits and/or submit preclaim payments (for retirement and insurance) within the established timeframe will result in OCC withholding payment of district claims until compliance is accomplished.
- 5. In order for a district to be eligible to continue receiving a personnel allocation from OCC; the districts must perform annual performance evaluations on all staff.
- 6. All districts with 2 or more FTE are required to establish a formal agreement with an adjoining district with fewer than 2 FTE. This agreement will specify areas of assistance to be provided with the assistance being mutually beneficial. The assistance can include but is not limited to: Administrative / Clerical; watershed O&M; education / outreach; conservation equipment. All agreements will require pre-approval by the Commission Executive Director.
