The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, July 10, 2017, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Scotty Herriman. He stated this was a Regular Meeting filed in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

SELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018

A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Jett to appoint Ms. LeGrand, Chair; Mr. Clark, Vice Chair; and Mr. Jett, Secretary. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. Ms. LeGrand assumed chair of the meeting.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the minutes of the June 5, 2017 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Lisa Knauf Owen, Assistant Director, presented new agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2. She indicated that item k. is being removed from consideration. She recommended approval of the new agreements as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the new agreements in Exhibit #2 as listed minus item k. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Knauf Owen presented the amended agreements for approval as listed in Exhibit #2. She recommended approval of the amended agreements as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the amended agreements in Exhibit #2 as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Trey Lam, Executive Director, presented the out of state travel requests for approval as listed in Exhibit #3. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the travel requests listed as items a-c as presented. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

NACD SOUTH CENTRAL REGION MEETING

The National Association of Conservation Districts South Central Region Meeting will be held on August 2-4, 2017 in Alexandria, Louisiana. Mr. Lam recommended three members to attend as well as him. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the attendance of Mr. Clark, Mr. Campbell, Ms. LeGrand and Mr. Lam. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

NATIONAL WATERSHED COALITION / NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STATE CONSERVATION AGENCIES CONSERVATION CONFERENCE

Mr. Lam explained that the National Watershed Coalition and the National Association of State Conservation Agencies were holding their annual meetings together on September 25-27, 2017 in Nebraska City, NE. Mr. Lam recommended that three members attend as well as Assistant Director Knauf Owen and himself. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve attendance of Mr. Clark, Mr. Campbell, Ms. LeGrand, Mr. Lam and Ms. Knauf Owen. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR ATTENANCE TO THE NATIONAL WATERSHED COALITION / NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STATE CONSERVATION AGENCIES CONSERVATION CONFERENCE

Mr. Lam explained that with the conference being held within driving distance this would be an excellent opportunity to send conservation district directors and/or employees who have flood control responsibilities to the conference. Mr. Lam indicated that through funding from the Conservation Programs Division the Commission could offer up to 10 scholarships to send directors and/or employees to the meeting. After discussion, Mr. Jett made a motion, seconded by Mr. Herriman, to approve up to 10 scholarships, one per district, to directors and /or employees from districts with watershed structures. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT

Ms. Knauf Owen presented the recommendation for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #4. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve district director appointments as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECTED POSITION #1

Ms. Knauf Owen stated that Exhibit #5 lists districts where only one eligible person filed a *Notification and Declaration of Candidacy* and recommended that the Commission declare the candidate listed as elected to Position #1. A motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Herriman to declare the candidates as elected. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

RESULTS OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECTIONS FOR POSITION #1

Ms. Knauf Owen stated that District Director elections for Position #1 were held in Texas County Conservation District, Noble County Conservation District, Sequoyah County Conservation District, South Caddo Conservation District and Shawnee Conservation District. Election results are detailed in Exhibit #6. As authorized by the Commission, Mr. Lam declared the candidate receiving the highest number of votes as elected. No action required.

CONSERVATION DISTRICT JOINT PLANS OF OPERATIONS

Ms. Knauf Owen recommended approval of the Joint Plans of Operations as listed in Exhibit #7. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the plans as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes:

none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION -FISCAL YEAR 2018:

- a. Conservation District Director Meeting Expense (maximum of 12 meetings): Ms. Knauf Owen recommended setting the maximum district director meeting expense at \$25.00 per meeting. She stated that staff is recommending that there not be a separate account for this expense this year but that districts could choose to pay the reimbursement from its operating expense allocation. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to set the maximum at \$25.00 with reimbursement coming from the district's operating expense allocation. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.
- b. Allocations to Conservation Districts for Personnel and Operating Expenses: Mr. Lam stated that the allocation to districts for personnel includes gross salary and FICA. Mr. Lam is recommending that each district receive \$3,000 in operating expense. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the allocations to districts as listed in Exhibit #8. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.
- c. Budget Work Program: Mr. Lam detailed the Budget Work Program as outlined in Exhibit #9 and stated that the Commission has received over 9 percent reductions since the same time last year. He stated that the Administration category has been reduced by \$35,000. Mr. Lam stated that under Watershed Operation and Maintenance \$1,000,000 was budgeted in new state funds for dam rehabilitation. Overall state appropriations for OCC were up over \$700,000 but that included a budget cut of 5 % and the one time dam rehab funds. Field Services includes allocations to districts as well as money received from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. It also includes benefits for employees and district liability insurance. Mr. Lam discussed the categories of Abandoned Mine Lands, Water Quality/Wetlands and Data Processing.

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the Budget Work Program as listed in Exhibit #9. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

d. Personnel and Financial Management Policies: Ms. Knauf Owen presented personnel and financial management policies for consideration as listed in Exhibit #10. She stated that these policies are carry over from last fiscal year and would recommend their approval. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the policies as listed in Exhibit #10. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

No public comments were presented.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business presented.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Betty Thompson, Deputy Commissioner, reported on the following items:

- FFA chapters around the state are completing hog gates
- The Department is reopening their Women in Agriculture nominations
- Jim Reese, Bryan Painter and Betty Thompson have attended numerous conferences this summer
- Ag in the Classroom has hosted their summer tours and conference for teachers
- Dept of Ag contributed a DVD, quilt and NAAS statistics to the time capsule
- Dept of Ag has kicked off their wellness program and have invited Conservation Commission to participate.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, Natural Resources Conservation Service State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

- -The agency had received \$600,000 additional in EQIP funding
- All CSP applications have been ranked
- -The agency had received funding for design work for the Boiling Springs site
- No word on any operational funding for the watershed program
- No word yet on filling positions
- A nation to nation meeting will be held in Wyandotte, OK on August 21-22
- New NRCS administrative staff will be in Oklahoma August 1. Commission is assisting with the tour.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: No one was present from the association. Mr. Lam noted that the association has been very active with the Regional Food Bank Project.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Campbell had no items to report.

Mr. Jett participated in a fire ant community awareness workshop.

Mr. Clark noted that he had recently had opportunity to visit Swaziland. He expressed how extremely fortunate we are here in this country especially in comparison with others.

Mr. Herriman has been working with No Till on the Plains planting mile strips for pollinators. He indicated they have had in excess of 30 inches of rain this past month. He is also working on preparations for a Soil Health Field Day for either August 15 or 17.

Ms. LeGrand attended district meetings in Weatherford and Anadarko to discuss district staffing going forward.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a complete written report is in the packet. Mr. Lam welcomed Mr. Campbell to the Commission and stated he looked forward to working with him. Mr. Lam noted that he and staff had attended several district meetings to discuss district staffing

and allocations. He noted that the majority of the month was spent working on setting the agency division budges. Mr. Lam reported that there would be a Soil Health Field Day at his farm on July 20.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She highlighted to various Soil Health events going on around the state this summer.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report was in the packet. He also provided information to the Commissioners about an update to the OK Maps site that allows you to geo reference your location.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, stated a written report is in the packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that: three projects were in construction, three projects were in design by AML staff; two projects were being solicited for A&E proposals; five projects were being contracted for American Burying Beatle surveys; two projects were in the vegetation phase; five projects were scheduled for release letters and five project areas were pending project selection.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. Ms. Sawatzky noted that the final Emergency Watershed Protection repair project on Caddo Site 27 in Carter County will be complete in a few months.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen noted that the majority of the month was taken up with division budget meetings and preparing conservation district allocations.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on or about January 6, 2016 the Craig County Conservation District ("District") requested clarification on an issue from a Commission employee. On January 7, 2016, the Commission employee asked the following question of the Director of the Water Quality Division of the Commission: *Are Conservation District employees and district boards eligible for the program*? (Program meaning: Neosho River Regional Conservation Partnership Program Project "NEOSHO RCPP").

WHEREAS, the response back from the Director stated as follows: Yes, Conservation District employees and boards are eligible, same rules as normally apply.

Whereas, Director assumed that questioner understood what was meant by the words "same rules as normally apply". These words in the Director's mind meant that board members can participate in the 319/state funded program, but cannot vote on program rules and as a result only the number of directors on the Board that are not needed to sustain a quorum can participate. Also, that employees and their family members can participate in EQIP, a federal program, but cannot participate in state cost share programs.

Whereas, Commission employee did not understand the words "same rules as normally apply" in the same context as the Director and responded back to the District that employees and their family members were eligible to participate in the NEOSHO RCPP.

Whereas, a District employee's husband, the Claimant, applied and was approved for the NEOSHO RCPP and signed a "Performance Agreement" with the District on June 1, 2016 that expired in May of 2020.

Whereas, Claimant, pursuant to the terms in his "Performance Agreement," complied with all the restrictions of use and conservation practices on his property for the first year; thus, resulting in Claimant filing a claim with the Commission at the end of the first performance year for his first initial payment of \$15,273.00.

Whereas, upon receipt and review of the claim, a Commission employee recognized that the Claimant was the husband of one of the District's employees. As such the Claimant is ineligible to participate in the cost-share program and/or to receive payment under the program. Hence, the Claimant's claim was denied by the Commission for being ineligible under the NEOSHO RCPP and also pursuant to the Oklahoma Ethics Statutes, specifically 74 O.S. Rule 4.7.

Whereas, Claimant contacted the Commission to discuss losses to his livelihood owing to reliance on the "Performance Agreement" signed in June of 2016.

WHEREAS, in the negotiation of the issues, the Parties have agreed to settle pursuant to the terms set out below.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

I. Terms.

- A. *Payment*. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the Commission shall pay the Claimant Fifteen Thousand Two Hundred and Seventy-Three Dollars (\$15,273.00) ("Payment"). The Payment shall be paid within 30 business days of the Effective Date and shall be made out in the name of Ernest Callison. The funds used by the Commission to settle this dispute shall not be from any 319 or other cost-share monies. The Claimant acknowledges and agrees that once the Payment is received that Claimant shall be responsible for any and all applicable federal, state and local taxes.
- B. Termination of Performance Agreement. Claimant now understands why he is ineligible to participate in the cost-share program and agrees with the automatic and immediate termination of the "Performance Agreement." Claimant also acknowledges that no payments will be made to him through the cost-share program and that he is no longer bound by any of the restrictions on the use of his property or conservation practices detailed in the "Performance Agreement."
- C. Release. In consideration of the Payment by the Commission and any other benefits set forth herein, the Claimant, on behalf of himself and his family members, heirs, representatives, successors and assigns, knowingly and voluntarily waives, releases and forever discharges the Commission and the District as well as the Commission and District's respective current and former board members, employees, officers, representatives, partners, agents and any successor or assign from any claim, charge, action or cause of action whether known or unknown from the beginning of time through the date of this Agreement based upon any matter, cause, or thing whatsoever related to or arising out of the Conservation Cost-Share Program Performance Agreement signed on June 1, 2016 by Claimant. The only exception to this clause would be for any claims arising out of a breach of this Agreement or any claim that cannot be waived by law. All other claims arising under this Agreement are forever barred by this Agreement.
- <u>II. Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Parties concerning the Commission's responsibilities and obligations to Claimant and supersedes all prior oral agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and undertakings between the Parties. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by a written addendum signed by both Parties.
- III. No Admission. This Agreement is entered into in compromise of issues arising through a miscommunication on the eligibility of employees and their family members in the NEOSHO RCPP. The parties acknowledge and agree that this Agreement does not constitute and should not be construed in any way as an admission by any other party of (a) any wrongdoing or liability whatsoever, (b) any violation of the Claimant's rights or those of any other person, or (c) any violation of any order, law, statute, duty or contract.
- IV. Severability. In the event that any provision or portion of this Agreement or the application of this Agreement, or the application of this Agreement to any person or circumstance is determined to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions or portions of this Agreement, and the application of the provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to whom it is found to be invalid shall be unaffected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect to the fullest extent permitted by law.
- V. Titles. Agreement titles and subtitles are for convenience only and shall not be deemed to have legal effect.
- <u>VI. Interpretation; Governing Law.</u> This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the plain meaning of its terms and not strictly for or against any person or entity. To the extent that federal law controls the interpretation or enforceability of any provision of this Agreement, this Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with federal law. Otherwise, this Agreement shall be governed by and construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Oklahoma.

This Agreement shall not be deemed in effect until (1) signed by the Claimant (2) reviewed and approved by the Commissioners of the Commission during a regular Commission meeting and (3) signed by the Chair of the Commission. CASE REVIEW/LEGAL ISSUES SALLISAW 33

The Sequoyah County Conservation District ("SCCD") commenced Case No. CS-09-633 by filing its Petition for condemnation to acquire certain property interest to perform rehabilitation work on a floodwater retarding structure referred to as Site 33 (the "dam" or "Site 33"), since the dam had been classified as a "high hazard" dam ("Condemnation Proceeding"). Commissioners were appointed and found just compensation due Defendants in the amount of \$77,000.00. SCCD has deposited said sum with the Court Clerk.

Benitscheck Taylor filed a Petition with the Oklahoma Water Resources Board ("OWRB"), seeking a declaration that the dam is not a "high hazard" dam. The OWRB denied the Petition. Defendants appealed the ruling of the OWRB ("Administrative Appeal") in Case No. CV-11-65. Over the objection of SCCD the Court consolidated the Administrative Appeal and the Condemnation Proceeding. On August 12, 2013, the Court summarily ruled that the dam was not "high hazard" (the "Order"). The OWRB filed its appeal. SCCD filed its brief in this appeal.

The appeals court ruled that the trial court exceeded the proper scope of review and reversed the Order of the trial court. However, the court also concluded the OWRB erred in failing to address the Taylor's petition regarding the high hazard classification "today" of the dam and remanded the petition back to the OWRB for further proceedings.

Currently, SCCD is awaiting the review and determination by the OWRB. Once a determination is made by the OWRB then the SCCD can review the findings and hopefully proceed with Case No. CS-09-633. The SCCD believes that the review and determination by the OWRB can be completed in the next 90-120 days.
