DECLARATION OF ABANDONED COAL MINE EMERGENCY

Under the provisions of the Oklahoma Public Competitive Bidding Act (Title61 - Section 130), Mike Thralls, as chief administrative officer for the Oklahoma Conservation Commission, has the authority to declare an emergency.

Such notification shall contain a statement of the reasons for the action, and shall be recorded in the official minutes of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission.

Reasons for Emergency Declaration:

This project addressed an emergency situation involving the sudden collapse of an underground coal mine, creating a dangerous Vertical Opening (VO) in the front yard of a residence in Wilburton, Oklahoma, and the dangerous subsidence that resulted in the collapse of Birch Street. The VO is approximately 12 inches in diameter and 17 inches deep. The void is larger underground. The subsidence under the street continues to sink. The subsidence is 45 feet long x 6 feet wide x 6 inches deep.

This is a busy street in a residential area inside the city limits of Wilburton, Oklahoma (population 2,972). There is a high probability of harm to children and the general public and vehicular traffic on Birch Street.

Location:

It is located in the SW ¼ of Section 9, Township 5 North, Range 19 East in Latimer County (Wilburton USGS Quadrangle). The specific site is 201 West Birch Street,

Wilburton, Oklahoma.

- OTCAC had their annual meeting at the Citizen Potawatomi Nation on August 23. I facilitated the meeting and it was attended by over 100.

Oklahoma Prescribed Burn Association (OPBA -Tentative) -

- I made a presentation to the Eastern Red Cedar Registry Board on August 29. I discussed the purpose of the OPBA and the role it can play in partnering with different groups to promote prescribed fire to reduce fuel loads, promote Firewise and help local burn associations with organization, training and action.
- · I spoke at the Legislative Public Safety Interim Study on September 6 and provided information about the OPBA and the reason for its formation.
- The underwriter providing liability coverage in Texas has decided to pull out of this line of coverage. This happened due to a burn in TX that was outside of prescription that has resulted in litigation. The underwriter feels it is better to settle than go through litigation even though the person burning did so outside of prescription. This is disappointing but we are discussing this with the other states to find another underwriter.
- The OPBA is incorporated in OK as a nonprofit and is working on the nonprofit status with IRS.
- The Nature Conservancy made a generous donation to the OPBA to assist in formation. Agreements with NRCS and ODWC are in development. Other grant opportunities are being explored.

Oklahoma Prescribed Fire Council (OPFC) -

• The OPFC met in Oklahoma City on September 11. There was a good turn out for this meeting and the group is engaged to continue to provide information on prescribed fire and advocate for its use.




