MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Thursday, September 1, 2016, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Scotty Herriman. He stated this was a Regular Meeting scheduled in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted on August 30, 2016, at the front entrance of the building.

GUIDELINES FOR THE MONARCH HABITAT INITIATIVE COST-SHARE PROGRAM - PROGRAM YEAR $\mathbf 1$

Ms. Owen reported that she met last week with the districts involved with this initiative and stated a new set of guidelines was in the packet for approval (see Exhibit #5). After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the guidelines as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

GOVERNOR'S WATER CONFERENCE

Mr. Lam stated that the Governor's Water Conference is scheduled for October 11-12, 2016, Embassy Suites, Norman, Oklahoma. After discussion, it was determined that Ms. LeGrand and Mr. Rooker would attend with Mr. Jett as an alternate.

FY2017 JOINT PLANS OF OPERATION

DISCUSSION OF THE COMMISSION'S FY2018 BUDGET

Mr. Lam stated that the Commission is required to submit its FY2018 budget request on October 1 to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. He provided a handout of the Commission's draft proposal recommended by staff and he discussed the recommendations (see Attachment A). Approval of the budget request will be on the October meeting agenda.

OKLAHOMA SUPREME COURT OPINION 2016 OK 65

Janet Stewart, General Counsel reported on the Oklahoma Supreme Court Opinion 2016 OK 65 between the Logan County Conservation District v. Pleasant Oaks Homeowners Association, et al. regarding the rehabilitation of Cottonwood Creek Watershed, Site 54. A copy of her presentation is listed as Attachment B.

Following the presentation, members thanked Ms. Stewart for her work with this case and her presentation.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Betty Thompson, Assistant Commissioner, reported on the USDA-AMES organic rule that received over 5000 comments so the rule has not been finalized.

Ms. Thompson reported that Oklahoma's Forestry Division led the nation with burned acres standing at 700,000. She reported that the State Fair will begin this month and that the Made In Oklahoma area has doubled its vendors.

Ms. Thompson stated that a cock fighting ring was found in Midwest City and 20 roosters were sent to a rescue in Colorado. She reported on the feral hog issue stating that staff met with a wildlife group and are moving forward with rules. She then reported on a ranch at Big Cabin where seven yearlings and one breeding bull have died and that high levels of aluminum were found in the creek and the pond. Ms. Thompson stated that a news release is being prepared regarding the swine flu since it has been found in Michigan and Ohio.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, stated that a briefing at the national level will be held for changes made to the Conservation Stewardship Program.

Mr. O'Neill reported that Brent Reavis is retiring effective September 2; Chad Kacir, Assistant State Conservationist (Field Operations) for Zone 2 will supervise Team 12 in eastern Oklahoma; Stacy Riley, Assistant State Conservationists (Field Operations) for Zone 1 will supervise Team 10 in the Shawnee, Holdenville area; and David Hungerford, Assistant State Conservationist (Field Operations) for Zone 3 will supervise the southern area.

Mr. O'Neill reported on the tribal meeting held last week where 15 tribes were represented. He stated the StrikeForce training went well. Mr. O'Neill stated that the Pauls Valley office will be moving into the old OG&E building in Pauls Valley.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Steve House, President, stated that the StrikeForce meeting was very productive. He reported that Jordan Shearer will become the executive director of the Oklahoma/Colorado/New Mexico Sorghum Association. Mr. House thanked the Commission for co-sponsoring the area meetings and expressed appreciation to Commission staff for their work with these meetings.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Jett, Mr. Herriman, Mr. Rooker and Ms. LeGrand reported on attending the NACD South Central Meeting and all appreciated the tours and seeing the different crops the region grows. They were particularly impressed with the rice production.

Ms. LeGrand attended the Plant ID meeting at the Wichita wildlife refuge and stated it was very informative.

Mr. Clark participated in the Oklahoma Cattlemen's Association Convention.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. He attended the tribal meeting and appreciated the discussion of cover crops, water quality and soil health.

Mr. Lam stated that staff continues working with the Noble Foundation and Oklahoma State University on shared services.

Water Quality Program: Greg Kloxin, Assistant Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He reported that the retirement reception for Cheryl Cheadle, Blue Thumb Program Director, is today. Mr. Kloxin stated that the Plant ID meetings for soil health are well received and he commended Blane Stacy, Water Quality Monitoring Specialist, for doing a great job.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He reported on the OKMaps project and the work being done with County Assessors to identify oil and gas property, land records, etc. on the site. There will be a training session at the OACD State Meeting.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He stated that 14 assessments have been scheduled for project selection review. Staff is performing designs on two sites; vegetation management on four sites; and is moving to the contractual phase on eight sites totaling \$1.6 million.

The American Burying Beatle surveys on four sites are being completed. They found a hit on one site but the project is two separate sites so work can continue on the second site.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She stated that the watershed technicians and aides performed Emergency Watershed Program work on seven flood damaged sites in Seminole County stretching those emergency funds. She thanked Tony Harrison, Trent Drennon, Chuck Pyka, Rusty Adams, Johnny Pelley, George Moore and Dennis Boney for their work.

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen stated a written report is in the packet. She stated that work continues on shared services agreements. She reported on participating in the Oklahoma Turning Point Conference where she discussed new partnership opportunities with the Regional Food Bank and the Choctaw Nation. Ms. Owen reported that Lonnie Stone, Kay County Conservation District secretary, is retiring and her reception was held this week.

History


- Structure built in 1970's (for flood control only)
- Area was platted by a developer/landowner (Crowder)
- Easement was released by Quit Claim Deed in 1977 to an elevation two feet above top of dam elevation due to landowner/developer pressures
- Homes built all around the lake
- Home Owners/Lake Association
- Many homeowner lots actually ascend into the lake
- Homes built up next to the dam


- One home built below the auxiliary spillway crest elevation


Challenges of Modifying This Structure


- NRCS starts working on the plan for rehabilitation in 2007?
- Can't raise the dam because of homes built right next to the dam and the dam is near a county road
- Can't extend the spillway without taking out homes
- What to do?
 - Decision to lower the water level in the lake by over 4 feet to get the height on the dam and the needed water storage required and get the one house below the auxiliary spillway crest protected
 - Lower the auxiliary spillway to get the water flow capacity required














Landowner Responses

- Logan Cty CD and NRCS hold multiple landowner meetings
- Angry/Threatening lawsuits
- Raise multiple concerns (restricts recreation, fire, increase bugs, a taking by lowering of the water thus decreasing home values)
- Easements do not cover "rehabilitation"

- Landowners (Crowder) behind dam
 - Easement concerns
 - Loss of ability to build homes on already platted property
 - Want paid six figures for the removal of an old pole barn located in our easement, the district had offered
 \$10,000.00, in an effort to prepare for construction

Options

- Move forward with construction?
 - Once contracted then this can get messy/ wait for them to sue, seems highly likely to occur
- o Do nothing?
 - Violation of the state dam safety act /failure to protect the homes downstream
- Condemnation?
 - Already have an easement
- Oeclaratory Action?

What is a 'Declaratory Action'

- Individuals may seek a declaratory judgment after a legal controversy has arisen but before any damages have occurred or any laws have been violated.
- A declaratory judgment differs from other judicial rulings in that it does not require that any action be taken. Instead, the judge, after analyzing the controversy, simply issues an opinion declaring the rights of each of the parties involved. A declaratory judgment may only be granted in actual controversies that fall within a court's jurisdiction.
- A declaratory judgment, sometimes called declaratory relief, is conclusive and legally binding as to the present and future rights of the parties involved. The parties involved in a declaratory judgment may not later seek another court resolution of the same legal issue unless they appeal the judgment.

What Controversy Exists?

- Easements
 - Are the easements sufficient?
 - On they cover modifications of this type?

Statutory Language

 In 2008 the Oklahoma Legislature passed 27A § 3-3-411 (B)

"Pursuant to the Conservation District Act, the phrase "operation and maintenance" or "operate and maintain" as used in a variety of contractual documents, easements, statutes, rules, and other legal authority by the conservation district and their assigns shall be interpreted to:

- Encompass the terms, repairs, modification, alteration, rehabilitation, upkeep, upgrade, improvement, construction, reconstruction, decommission and inspection and;
- Benefit the state and conservation districts
- Does this apply Retroactively

Other Landowner Challenges

- Right of project sponsor to lower the water level in the lake (permanent pool) permanently
 - Oklahoma has had no legal precedence or case law regarding this issue
- Any private property taken or damaged for which compensation must be paid to landowners for lowering the water in the lake (i.e.. Docks, pole barn...)

Majority Rule on Water Level

- The proprietor of a dam has an unqualified right to remove, alter, or abandon the dam including the water level
- The fact that a property owner has used or improved their property with reference to the artificial lake created by another's dam does not confer the property owner with property rights in the continued water level of the lake
- Nebraska, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, Washington and Michigan

Legal Action Timeline

- Logan County CD files a Declaratory Action in March 2011
 - asking if they have the right to perform work on Site 54 with current easements
 - if they can lower permanent pool, &
 - that no taking is occurring that requires compensation
- The facts are presented to the District Court of Logan County
 - Orally
 - Written
- September 2014 the District Court rules in favor of the district on all issues

Appeal Timeline

- Landowners appeal District Court decision
- District files a Motion to Retain of the appeal to Oklahoma Supreme Court
- December 2014 the Supreme Court grants the Motion to Retain
- On June 7, 2016 the Supreme Court issues its 24 page opinion confirming the district court decision on all issues – independent research conducted by the court. (Note – seismic footnote)

Analysis

- Easement construct, operate, maintain, inspect, enter, water storage
 - Imposed duty on Grantee to inspect, maintain, and repair so as to function safely (District responsible for OM)
 - Easement not unambiguous
 - Plain ordinary meaning of words "operate" & "maintain"
 - 27A § 3-3-411 can be applied retroactively; conforms to plain meaning of words and original purpose of the Act
 - Foreseeable repairs and changes; perpetual (open ended)
 - Illogical to sanction routine inspection and maintenance but prohibit repairs
 - Repairs includes all new an improved methods
 - Unless specified in the easement, it is assumed Grantee must conduct repairs, so long as on the property in the easement
 - Manner, frequency, intensity of use may change over time
- Permanent Pool level draining for repairs and permanent lowering
 - No set water level in easement, water fluctuates
 - Yost case dam owner need not maintain for the benefit of upper riparian owners
 - No taking, no compensation

What does this mean?

- Start Construction
- Landowners must remove all structures; no payments for removal
- Clarifies for all Districts
 - The easements; rehabilitation;
 - Water level fluctuations, draining, lowering

Proposed Mileage Policy for Shared Services Memorandum of Understanding between Conservation Districts

In order to facilitate the implementation of MOU's between districts to provide shared services, the Oklahoma Conservation Commission (OCC) has adopted the following policy related to mileage reimbursement.

- a. If a district is providing ongoing administrative assistance to a district with an administrative vacancy; OCC will reimburse mileage to the district providing the assistance. Request for reimbursement must be made through the OCC Assistant Director and prior to the work being done.
- b. If the assistance is for Flood Control Operation & Maintenance and / or inspections; a request for funds to reimburse mileage may be made to the OCC Conservation Programs Division on an OCC 8-H form. These requests must be made prior to the work being done and approval will be based on available funding at the time of the request.
- c. If 2 or more districts are assisting each other and the assistance is mutually beneficial; then each district should pay their own mileage reimbursements.
- d. If the assistance is for the purpose of helping with equipment rental, repair and/or delivery or is for any other local enterprise; the district receiving the assistance should pay for mileage. This arrangement should be worked out locally between the two conservation districts.

Contracting process is scheduled to begin in October 2016 and construction is anticipated to be in progress by March 2017.
