### **CALL TO ORDER**

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, October 8, 2018, at the Agriculture Building Conference Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Bill Clark. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, October 4, 2018, at the front entrance of the building.

## **MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING**

A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the minutes of the September 10, 2018 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

## **CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

Nancy Tackett, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Comptroller, presented the claims, purchase card summary and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

## **RECOGNITION OF COMMISSION EMPLOYEE**

Shanon Phillips, Water Quality Division Director presented Leonard Moore, Water Quality Monitoring Specialist, for 35 years of service.

## **PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS**

Ms. Owen presented three amended agreements listed as items "a-c" in Exhibit 2, for ratification that were previously approved by Chair Clark. She recommended ratification of these agreements as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mrs. LeGrand to ratify the agreements. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen presented two amended/continued agreements listed as items "d and f" in Exhibit 2. She recommended approval of the amended/continued agreements as presented. A motion was made by Mrs. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve these agreements. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen presented two new agreements listed at "f and g" in Exhibit 2 for consideration. She recommended approval of the new agreements as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the new agreements. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT**

Ms. Owen presented the recommendation for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #3. A motion was made by Mrs. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve district director appointments as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

## **CONSERVATION DISTRICT JOINT PLANS OF OPERATIONS**

Ms. Owen recommended approval of the Joint Plans of Operations for Bryan, Cimarron

and Osage counties. She noted that these were the final plans for the fiscal year needing approval. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the plans as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried

#### **APPROVAL OF BUDGET REQUEST**

Trey Lam, Executive Director began a discussion on the aspects that have been modified since the presentation of the Commission's FY2020 Budget in last month's commission meeting. Those items are itemized in Exhibit #4. Mr. Lam recommends that the final budget be approved as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the FY2020 budget request. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

#### **GOVERNOR'S WATER CONFERENCE**

Mr. Lam presented information regarding the upcoming Governor's Water Conference to be held December 5 – 6. In past years the agency has been a sponsor of this conference. After discussion, Mr. Jett made a motion, seconded by Mrs. LeGrand, to sponsor the conference at the \$1,000.00 level. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

#### **OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUEST**

Mr. Lam presented an out of state travel request for possible ratification as listed in Exhibit #6. Secretary of Agriculture and Chair Clark previously approved this request as the opportunity arose between Commission meetings. A motion was made by Mrs. LeGrand and seconded by Mr. Campbell to ratify the travel request as presented. Those voting aye were: Jett, Clark, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Land Division Director, advised that there had been an AML emergency in Pittsburg County that had been acted upon with a Declaration of Emergency by OCC Executive Director, Trey Lam. Mr. Toole recommends that the Declaration of Emergency, be ratified. A motion was made for ratification by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

#### **CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS**

*Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry:* Betty Thompson, Department of Agriculture Deputy Commissioner, reported on the following items:

- Secretary Reese and Governor Fallin will attend a ribbon cutting ceremony for a flour mill in Enid.
- The Department has been advised that the Made in Oklahoma products, particularly the clay yogurts and pies, were extremely successful this year. They have made approximately One-hundred thousand (\$100,000.00) in net sales.
- The Department will attend a meeting in Lawton, OK on unwanted pesticides on October

30<sup>th</sup>.

*Natural Resources Conservation Service:* Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

- The Cherokee Nation has been approved to form a tribal conservation district. The signing ceremony will be towards the end of November.
- In this new fiscal year there is twenty-five million dollars of EQIP contracts (\$25,000,000.00) and 400,000 acres enrolled in CSP.
- The agency is aiming to centralize their administration, and a plan of action is already being implemented.

*Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts:* Jimmy Emmons, President, reported on the following items:

- The Association was well represented at the Southcentral Regional Meeting on October 4, 2018. There are already plans to host this meeting next year, although the exact dates have not been set.
- OACD hosted another leadership class in Tahlequah, OK. They had twelve participants.
- OACD signed an eight-hundred fifty thousand dollar (\$850,000.00) agreement with Nature Conservancy that will be discussed at the upcoming area meetings.

#### **OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS**

Mr. Campbell reported that he attended the OACD Leadership session at Tahlequah. He noted that eighty fifth-graders attended a soil and water health day that was held in Oklahoma County.

Mr. Jett reported that he attended a sand mining meeting in Faye, OK. The purpose was to address horizontal drilling concerns with the DEQ present. He reported that the Bureau of Mines setbacks are within two-hundred feet of three homes, causing lots of concern for homeowners.

Mr. Herriman stated that he had nothing to report this month.

Ms. LeGrand reported that she attended an outdoor classroom that all of the Upper Washita and North Fork of the Red River board members were at. She reports that more than eighty third-graders participated in the activities.

Mr. Clark stated he would like to extend his gratitude in being able to attend the NACD Regional Meeting held in San Marcos, TX. He also stated that since his home in Pontotoc County received more than twenty-eight inches of rainfall in two weeks, he has been able to see it as a good opportunity to discuss flood control with the public.

#### **OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF**

*Executive Director:* Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. Mr. Lam reported on the following items:

- Attend the OACD Leadership class in Tahlequah.
- Participated in the Leopold Award judging for the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual award.

- Participated in the National Association of State Conservation Agencies annual meeting in Syracuse, New York.
- Worked on the FY2020 budget request submission.

*Water Quality Program:* Shanon Phillips, Director stated a written report was in the packet. Ms. Phillips reported on the following items:

- Jeanette Lamb has resigned her position and will be moving to Colorado Springs, CO at the end of October.
- Judith Wilkins will be retiring at the end of November.
- New Blue Thumb calendars will be dispersed to the districts at the upcoming Area Meetings.

*Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services:* Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He noted that GIS can be helpful in analyzing sand mining problems because of the reliability and accuracy of the data. Mr. Sharp stated that LiDAR technology will be available across the state of Oklahoma in the next year.

*Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program:* Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation Program Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that: construction was completed on one (1) emergency; construction is on-going on one (1) project; two (2) projects have received an Authorization to Proceed from the Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement (OSMRE) and are being prepared for contracting; three (3) projects have been postponed for a year due to the presence of American Burying Beetle (ABB); vegetation management and maintenance monitoring is being performed on four (4) projects; three (3) projects are in the design phase; two (2) projects are in planning; two (2) sites are in realty phase; four (4) sites are pending project selection.

*Conservation Programs:* Tammy Sawatzky, Director stated that a written report was in the packet. Ms. Sawatzky reported on the following items:

- There was approximately five-hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) of cost share funds left over from FY18. The Commission elected to only let the districts keep one-hundred ninety-five thousand dollars (\$195,000.00). The remainder of the FY18 cost share funds will be divided up between the top eighteen performing districts to be utilized on their qualified alternates. Ms. Sawatzky stated that she hoped this would serve as an incentive for the districts to mobilize their allocated funds.
- Cost Share Program Year 18 is slated to end on August 31. All payments must be in the Commission by this date.

*Assistant Director:* Ms. Owen noted that monthly activities are outlined in the written report. Ms. Owen reported on the following items:

- Continued to assist Logan, Garfield and Osage County Conservation Districts due to employee vacancies. Also assisted the new hires in Texas, Beaver, and Bryan in training.
- Attend and made a presentation at the National Association of State Conservation Agencies annual meeting in Syracuse, New York.
- Participated in the full staff meeting on the Illinois River in Tahlequah.

### **NEXT MEETING**

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, November 5, 2018, in the Oklahoma Association of Electric Cooperatives Board Room, 2325 E. I44 Service Road, Oklahoma City, OK 73111 beginning at 7:30 a.m.

### **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business, Mr. Campbell made a motion, seconded by Mrs. LeGrand, to adjourn the meeting at 10:30 a.m. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.
