CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, October 9, 2017, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Deanna LeGrand. She stated this was a Re-scheduled Regular Meeting filed in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted on Thursday, October 5, 2017, at the front entrance of the building.

COMMISSION FY2019 BUDGET REQUEST

Mr. Lam presented the Commission's FY2019 budget request as outlined in Exhibit #5. He noted that it contains two priority areas as well as the budget for the Office of Geographic Information. Mr. Lam stated that the Commission is required to submit its FY2019 budget request after approval by the Commission to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the FY2019 budget request as presented. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman and LeGrand. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no requests for public comments.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business presented.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Betty Thompson, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry Deputy Commissioner, reported on the following items:

- Tulsa State Fair is currently going on;
- -Special session of the legislature is currently at a standstill;
- Secretary Reese is hosting the Secretary of Agriculture from Mexico and touring him around Oklahoma.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, Natural Resources Conservation Service State Conservationist reported on the following items:

- staff finished meeting with landowners to review 430 Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) contracts that encompass 476,000 acres District Conservationist are finding 60-70% of landowners are canceling current CSP contracts and opting to sign up again as a new contract due to constraints within the program.
- currently working on 1000 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) contracts worth \$22 million
- -staff worked with landowners affected by wildlife in Beaver, Harper and Woodward Counties to develop 60 contracts worth \$1.25 million with the majority of the work being in deferred grazing.
- -as the agency moves through the restructuring process the allocation of EQIP funds will be on team boundaries.
- -received notice of funding available for the construction of a new flood control site, Lower Bayou Site 12, in Love County.
- -Bill Northey has been selected as USDA Under Secretary for Farm Production and Conservation.
- -currently have 14 shared positions across Oklahoma through agreements with the Conservation Commission and other partners.
- -received notice that the agency will need to reduce the number of vehicles (approximately 25 to 30) in the fleet by the end of the calendar year
- -submitted additional flood control projects for remedial repairs following a review from another state.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Jimmy Emmons, Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts President reported on the following items:

- -met with the Nature Conservancy to provide soil health training to their staff;
- -OACD received a grant for providing outreach opportunities for socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers in agriculture and conservation. The majority of the funding will be passed through to conservation districts to accomplish the deliverables of the grant.
 - -will address the Kansas Association of Conservation Districts at their annual meeting
 - -will make a presentation at the Governor's Water Conference
- -President Emmons commended Sarah Blaney, Executive Director, for her hard work on behalf of conservation districts.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Campbell reported that he attended the National Watershed Coalition / National Association of State Conservation Agencies meeting in Nebraska. He noted that it was an extremely informative meeting. Mr. Campbell also noted that he had opportunity to meet Kim

Shaw, Water Quality Blue Thumb QA Officer, in the field at Soldier Creek. He commended her on her knowledge and willingness to show him the work she was doing with bug collections at the creek.

Mr. Jett reported that he has been working with Department of Ag to coordinate a Fire Ant Meeting in Beaver County. They have had one confirmed case of fire ants in Harper County.

Mr. Herriman commended Gary O'Neill, NRCS State Conservationist for his leadership and support of the conservation partnership.

Ms. LeGrand reported on her attendance at the National Watershed Coalition / National Association of State Conservation Agencies meeting in Nebraska.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Trey Lam, reported that he had met with the Senate appropriations committee and staff to discuss apportioned funds – which for the agency are the funds received from the gross production tax on oil. He noted that he participated in the full staff meeting hosted by the Water Quality Division at Crow Creek in Tulsa. Mr. Lam reported that he had served on the selection committee for the first annual Leopold Award. He reported that he made a presentation on flood control dam rehabilitation at the National Watershed Coalition annual meeting. Mr. Lam noted that he attended the USDA Food and Agriculture Council / State Emergency Board committee meeting. The Council provided information on USDA and state programs to congressional staff. Mr. Lam reported that the agency had received 35 applications for the Public Information Officer position that were currently being reviewed and a panel selected for interviews.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She commended Greg Kloxin and Brooks Trammel for working closely with Department of Ag staff to develop purchasing procedures. Ms. Phillips reported that Jeri Fleming has moved to a new position with the Water Center at the University of Oklahoma.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, OGITS Director, reported that he had been deployed as part of the Oklahoma Incident Management Team to provide GIS services in Rockport, Texas following the hurricane. He indicated that his work while there was to assist with coordination of repair of electric and water services by providing mapping services in those areas.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation Program Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that construction was progressing on three projects, vegetation was being managed on two projects, two projects were being monitored for maintenance; five projects were in the design phase with three designs being performed in-house and two projects being prepared for design by A&E firms; five projects were pending project selection; release letters had been accepted by landowners on six projects; realty research and rights-of-entry were being pursued on four projects, and; requests to OSMRE for Authorization to Proceed with construction have been submitted for two projects. Mr. Toole concluded by saying that the AML Program continues to advance its mission of protecting lives, repairing scarred land

and improving the environment.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She also thanked NRCS for their leadership in submitting request for funds for new flood control structures.

Association of State Conservation Agencies meeting in Nebraska on the conservation partnership Farm to Food Bank project. She also noted that she had been assisting conservation districts with final paperwork for retiring employees. Ms. Knauf reported that the agency had sent notification to all conservation district directors announcing open enrollment for health / dental insurance. She also reported that the agency continues to move forward with information transfer with the Department of Agriculture to provide a smooth transition of services November 1. Ms. Knauf commended Johnny Pelley, Conservation Programs Watershed Aide, for his assistance with coordination of hog gate distribution to conservation districts.



ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Findings of Fact

- 1. The Cimarron Valley Conservation District Board of Directors and the Kingfisher County Conservation District Board of Directors both approved the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan* (Attachment A Plan) (Attachments B & C -Board minutes of the approvals). Under the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan*, the Cimarron Valley Conservation District has agreed to transfer all lands that are currently within its jurisdiction located within the boundaries of Kingfisher County to the Kingfisher County Conservation District. The Kingfisher County Conservation District has agreed to accept all the above described lands from the Cimarron Valley Conservation District located within Kingfisher County, including all the responsibilities, operations, powers and duties that come with the acceptance of these lands. These lands and responsibilities and duties shall transfer over to the Kingfisher County Conservation District pursuant to the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan* and this Administrative Order.
- 2. The lands to be transferred from the Cimarron Valley Conservation District to the Kingfisher County Conservation District are shown in two of the three maps, MAPS A & B, attached to the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan*:
- MAP A "Lands in Cimarron Valley CD that shall be transferred to the Kingfisher County Conservation District." This map shows the current boundaries of the Cimarron Valley Conservation District. Furthermore the map highlights the lands located in Kingfisher County that are being transferred to the Kingfisher County Conservation District in an orange/red color while the lands remaining in the Cimarron Valley Conservation District are in a grey/brown.
- MAP B "Lands making up the Kingfisher County CD once the Cimarron Valley CD lands located in Kingfisher County are transferred to the Kingfisher County CD." This map shows the new boundary of the Kingfisher County Conservation District

once the lands are transferred from the Cimarron Valley Conservation District on the last day of December 2017. The new lands being acquired by the Kingfisher County Conservation District are highlighted in orange/red and are located in the Northwestern part of Kingfisher County.

After the transfer is complete the remaining jurisdiction of the Cimarron Valley Conservation District shall be those lands contained in Blaine County as shown in MAP C attached to the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan*.

MAP C "Lands Remaining in the Cimarron Valley CD." These remaining lands are highlighted in grey/brown and shall be addressed in a separate consolidation action and administrative order.

3. The legal descriptions of lands being transferred from Cimarron Valley Conservation District to the Kingfisher County Conservation District in Kingfisher County, Oklahoma are as follows:

Township 17 North, Range 9 West:

From a point of beginning, the SW corner of Section 6, thence East to a point at the SE corner of Section 5; thence North to the point where the Cimarron River intersects at the Section line; thence Northwesterly following the meanders of the Cimarron River to the County line and thence South along the County line to the point of beginning.

Township 19 North, Range 9 West:

SW4 Section 13:

N2 Section 21, West of Cimarron River;

E2 & NW4 Section 24; and

E2 & SW4 Section 25.

Township 18 North, Range 9 West:

NW4 & N2 of SW4 Section 12;

N2 & SW4 Section 13;

E2 & SW4 Section 14;

S2 Section 21:

E2 & SW4 Section 22;

W2 & SE4 Section 23;

NW4 Section 24;

SE4 Section 28:

NW4 Section 27;

S2 & NW4 Section 26:

N2 of SW4 Section 25:

E2 Section 33:

N2 Section 34:

NE4 & SW4 Section 35; and

N2 of SW4 Section 36.

Township 18 North, Range 8 West:

E2 of SW4 &NW4 Section 18

Township 19 North, Range 8 West:

SE4 of NW4 Section 6; and SW4 Section 5.

- 4. Upon the approval and transfer of the properties detailed in this Administrative Order the Cimarron Valley Conservation District assigns to the Kingfisher County Conservation District all of its easements, rights and interests in all these lands and the Kingfisher County Conservation District accepts the assignment of all these easements, rights and interests.
- 5. Janet Stewart from the Oklahoma Conservation Commission appeared on behalf of the two districts on November 6, 2017, to present the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan* and request approval from the Oklahoma Conservation Commission for the transfer of lands from the Cimarron Valley Conservation District that lies within the Kingfisher County boundary lines to the Kingfisher County Conservation District. Therefore, establishing that the Kingfisher County Conservation District shall starting December 31, 2017 to operate and exist on the new boundary lines as shown in MAP B of the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan*. The remaining lands of the Cimarron Valley Conservation District located outside of Kingfisher County, Oklahoma shall be addressed in a separate consolidation action and administrative order.

Conclusion of Law

- 6. Title 27A of the Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 3-1-101 and following provide for the overall powers and duties of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission and the local conservation districts. Section 3-2-106 (A) (18) (a) grants power to the Commission, by Administrative Order, to transfer lands from one district established under the provisions of the Conservation District Act to another district. The statute requires that the boards of each requesting district approve the reorganization proposal by a majority vote of the members of each of the boards involved. Furthermore, the boards of both districts must submit in writing a consolidation or transfer plan to the Commission for its approval of the proposed reorganization.
- 7. In a regularly scheduled board meeting held on November 6, 2017, the Oklahoma Conservation Commission examined and considered the minutes, facts, and issues regarding the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan* between these two districts. Upon review of the documents represented and the questioning of Commission staff involved in assisting in the transfer effort, the Commission finds that the statutory requirements have been met regarding the request for reorganization, and that the transfer of real property, operations, powers, and duties of these two districts as set out in the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan* will further the interests of conservation of renewable natural resources in Oklahoma.
- 8. Accordingly, the Oklahoma Conservation Commission approves the *Transfer of Conservation District Lands Plan* to transfer land, as set out in the Conservation Commission minutes of November 6, 2017, and as approved by the Kingfisher County Conservation District and the Cimarron Valley Conservation District. Effective on the close of business on December 30,

2017, the Cimarron Valley Conservation District shall transfer all of its lands, interests in lands, operations, powers, and duties, lying within Kingfisher County to the Kingfisher County Conservation District. The Kingfisher County Conservation District shall assume its new operations, powers, and duties, including district cooperator agreements and conservation plans, if any, for all the lands and interest in lands being transferred to it by the Cimarron Valley Conservation District as of the start of business on December 31, 2017. Furthermore the Kingfisher County Conservation District shall thereafter operate and exist on their new boundary lines as shown in MAP B.

9. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission finds, approves, and recognizes that all real property, interests in property, operations, powers, and duties, including existing district cooperator agreements and conservation plans, if any, on the above-described lands that transfer from the Cimarron Valley Conservation District shall become the responsibility of the Kingfisher County Conservation District as of December 31, 2017.

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER AND REPORT OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Findings of Fact

- 1. The Cimarron Valley Conservation District Board of Directors and the Blaine County Conservation District Board of Directors both moved to approve the *New District Consolidation Plan* (Exhibit A Plan) (Exhibits B & C -Board minutes of the approvals). Under the *New District Consolidation Plan* the Cimarron Valley Conservation District and the Blaine County Conservation District have agreed to consolidate their districts into one district to be called the Blaine County Conservation District. All lands, property, assets, and personnel that are currently within Cimarron Valley and Blaine County Conservation Districts will be assigned and become the property, real property, and liquid assets of the new Blaine County Conservation District. These lands, assets, resources, responsibilities and duties shall transfer over to the newly formed Blaine County Conservation District pursuant to the terms in the *New District Consolidation Plan* and this Administrative Order.
- 2. The lands to be transferred and consolidated from the Cimarron Valley Conservation District to the new Blaine County Conservation District are shown on the maps (Attachments A-C) as part of the *New District Consolidation Plan (Exhibit A)* which is attached as an exhibit to this Administrative Order.

Attachment A of Exhibit A "Lands Remaining in the Cimarron Valley CD"

- 3. Upon the approval and transfer of the properties detailed in the *New District Consolidation Plan* and this Administrative Order the Cimarron Valley Conservation District assigns to the new Blaine County Conservation District all of its rights and interests in all its lands and the new Blaine County Conservation District accepts the assignment of all these rights and interests.
- 4. Upon the approval and transfer of the properties detailed in the *New District Consolidation Plan* and this Administrative Order the Blaine County Conservation District assigns to the new Blaine County Conservation District all of its rights and interests in all its lands and the new Blaine County Conservation District accepts the assignment of all these rights and interests.
- 5. Janet Stewart from the Oklahoma Conservation Commission appeared on behalf of the two districts on November 6, 2017, to present the *New District Consolidation Plan* and request approval from the Oklahoma Conservation Commission for the consolidation of lands of the Cimarron Valley Conservation District with offices that were once located in Okeene, Oklahoma and the Blaine County Conservation District with offices located in Watonga, Oklahoma. The consolidation will result in one conservation district, the new Blaine County Conservation District, being located and with jurisdiction to operate and exist within the Blaine County boundary lines (see Exhibit A, Attachment C).
- 6. In addition, Mrs. Owen explained the *New District Consolidation Plan* including information on the closing of the Cimarron Valley Conservation District Office; as well as the District Board composition of the new Blaine County Conservation District.

Conclusion of Law

- 7. Title 27A of the Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 3-1-101 and following, provide for the overall powers and duties of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission and the local conservation districts. Section 3-2-106 (A) (18) (a) grants power to the Commission, by Administrative Order, to transfer lands from one district established under the provisions of the Conservation District Act to another district. The statute requires that the boards of each requesting district approve the consolidation plan by a majority vote of the members of each of the boards involved. Furthermore, the boards of both districts must submit in writing a consolidation plan to the Commission for its approval of the proposed reorganization.
- 8. In a regularly scheduled board meeting held on November 6, 2017, the Oklahoma Conservation Commission examined and considered the minutes, facts, and issues regarding the *New District Consolidation Plan* of these two districts into a new conservation district. Upon review of the documents represented and the questioning of Commission staff involved in assisting in the consolidation effort, the Commission finds that the statutory requirements have been met regarding the request for consolidation, and that the transfer of real property, operations, powers, and duties of

these two districts as set out in the *New District Consolidation Plan* will further the interests of conservation of renewable natural resources in Oklahoma.

- 9. Accordingly, the Oklahoma Conservation Commission approves the *New District Consolidation Plan* to transfer and consolidate land, as set out in the Conservation Commission minutes of November 6, 2017, and as approved by the Cimarron Valley Conservation District Board of Directors and the Blaine County Conservation District Board of Directors. The effective date of the final closing of the Cimarron Valley Conservation District is the close of business on December 31, 2017 and the new start date of the new Blaine County Conservation District is the start of business on January 1, 2018. The Cimarron Valley Conservation District and the Blaine County Conservation District shall transfer all of its lands, interests in lands, operations, powers, and duties, lying within Blaine County to the new Blaine County Conservation District and the Cimarron Valley Conservation District shall finalize all paper work and the integration of its liquid assets per the Consolidation Plan. The new Blaine County Conservation District shall assume its new operations, powers, and duties, including district cooperator agreements and conservation plans, for all the lands and interest in lands being transferred and consolidated to it by the Cimarron Valley Conservation District as of the start of business on January 1, 2018, the Final Starting Date of the new district.
- 10. The Oklahoma Conservation Commission finds, approves, and recognizes that all real property, interests in property, operations, powers, and duties, and conservation plans on the above-described lands that transfer and consolidate from the Cimarron Valley Conservation District and Blaine County Conservation District shall become the responsibility of the new Blaine County Conservation District as of January 1, 2017.


