MINUTES

CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, October 3, 2016, at the Agriculture Building Board Room located at 2800 N. Lincoln in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chairman Scotty Herriman. He stated this was a Regular Meeting scheduled in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted on Thursday, September 29, 2016, at the front entrance of the building.

She stated this policy is a result of the shared services policy approved in July. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Clark to approve the mileage policy as listed. FY2018 BUDGET REOUEST

Mr. Lam presented the Commission's FY2018 budget request and recommended approval. It contains three priority areas as well as the Office of Geographic Information budget. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Clark and seconded by Ms. LeGrand to approve the budget request as presented. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Herriman, LeGrand and Clark. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Betty Thompson, Assistant Commissioner, stated that SeptemberFest was held recently and there was a lower attendance of ag groups. She reported on the State Fair of Oklahoma and the Tulsa State Fair where the Made In Oklahoma expo did well.

Ms. Thompson, Brian Painter and Secretary Jim Reese attended the National Association of State Departments of Agriculture Conference where topics included the Trans-Pacific Partnership and workplace development. She shared a fun fact that one farm feeds 155 people.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, stated that the federal government began a new fiscal year and will be operating under a Continuing Resolution through December 9. He stated that the first quarter of the fiscal year will be spent on training for the new Conservation Stewardship Program and the new conservation toolkit.

Mr. O'Neill stated that CSP payments will be made the first quarter. He also reported that the Environmental Quality Incentive Program guidance will be going out and the deadline for signups is November 18.

Mr. O'Neill reported that Dick Zetterberg, Assistant State Conservationist (Programs) has accepted a position at NRCS Headquarters and will be moving to Washington, D.C. Andy Bennett is the new Stewardship Manager.

Mr. O'Neill stated that the Regional Tribal Advisory Council will meet in October in Catoosa. The meeting will be hosted by the Cherokee Nation. The council consists of 12 tribal members with four from Oklahoma.

Mr. O'Neill thanked Ms. Tweed for her work with the conservation partnership.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Steve House, President, stated that Association members participated in a fund-raiser at Bass Pro and all proceeds went to the Mike Thralls Scholarship Fund. He stated that area meetings are coming up and he thanked Commission staff for their work with these meetings.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Rooker attended the Shawnee Farm Appreciation Banquet, SeptemberFest, the Cleveland County Fair, the State Fair and the Trains, Planes and Cars event in Shawnee.

Mr. Jett attended the funeral of Mead Ferguson, Woodward County Conservation District.

Mr. Herriman stated that OSU planted cover crops on his farm last Thursday and rains are needed.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam stated a written report is in the packet. He attended the Pottawatomie County Fair and stated it was good. Mr. Lam reported that the Commission received \$256,000 back from the cuts it took in FY2016. The funds were distributed as follows: \$85,000 to field services; \$68,000 to watershed operation and maintenance; \$42,000 to water quality and \$61,000 to administration. If the Commission does not receive another rescission this year it will send an additional allocation to the districts.

Mr. Lam stated that the full staff met at Grand Lake and toured the Pensacola Dam. He participated in the Blue Thumb Conference at Hinton. Mr. Lam also attended the National Association of State Conservation Agencies (NASCA) annual meeting and found it informative.

Mr. Lam stated that staff is working with Oklahoma State University for a shared services agreement and is also working on similar agreements with the NRCS.

Mr. Lam stated that a retirement reception will held honoring Ms. Tweed on October 26.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She reported that 40 people attended the Blue Thumb Conference. Ms. Phillips reported on the conservation incentive grants with the Texas County, Beaver County, Nowata County and McClain County Conservation Districts with field days. These field days have been so successful that the match for the grant has already been met during its first year.

Ms. Phillips stated that the stream bank restoration project with the Oklahoma Department of Transportation will be completed by mid-November. Repair work for damage from last December's floods will commence in October.

Ms. Phillips stated the water quality monitoring program is successful due to the goodwill of landowners granting access to their property. In return the program will be sending a two page summary of the health of the streams located on their property.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. He then reported on attending the National Association Abandoned Mine Land Programs and touring an open pit copper mine.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Robert Toole, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. Work continues with the Program's mission to protect lives, repair scarred lands and improve the environment. Mr. Toole stated that sites are identified, assessed, prioritized, landowner intent secured, designed, contracted, vegetated, and monitored.

A pre-bid meeting is scheduled next week for a site in Muskogee and an underground mine site pre-bid is scheduled in McCurtain County.

Mr. Toole attended the National AML meeting and toured a site project consisting of less than 30 acres for a total of \$22 million.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, stated a written report is in the packet. She stated that because of the earthquake earlier in the month site inspections were held as there were 12 dams located within ten miles of the epicenter.

Ms. Sawatzky stated that some watershed sites were removed from the high hazard list but some were added for a total of 260 sites on the list.

Ms. Sawatzky stated that a site showing will be held on October 17 for the Barnitz 5 rehabilitation project. There will be a rehab project in Murray County after the first of the year.

Copies of the final report for the Cost-share Program - Program Year 16 were provided (see Attachment A).

Assistant Director: Ms. Owen stated a written report is in the packet. She reported that the Monarch Habitat Initiative kicked off and has been well received in the four districts participating.

Ms. Owen stated that option period for state and district employees began October 1.

Ms. Owen also attended the NASCA annual meeting and toured through the College of the Ozarks, and several farms. She stated that Missouri's conservation program receives 1/10th of one percent of sales tax from the state totaling \$40 million for its cost-share program. The budget for conservation is \$61 million.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission will be held on Monday, November 7, 2016, in the Agriculture Building Board Room, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma beginning at 9:30 a.m.

Prior to adjournment, Mr. Herriman expressed his appreciation to Ms. Tweed for her efficiency and work with the Commission over the years and wished her well in her retirement.



Titanic and became an activist for children and workers.



Colorado: The Headwaters State


Of the 158 named rivers that flow through the State of Colorado, all but two have their headwaters within our state. Although there are about 17 major rivers that have their start in the mountains of Colorado, the headwaters of the Arkansas, South Platte, Rio Grande, and Colorado Rivers are the life blood of our watersheds, agriculture, wildlife, recreation, hydro-power, and municipal water supplies, both statewide and nationally.

Please join us on Wednesday, February 1, 2017, for a special afternoon tour that will include a bus ride to the Continental Divide atop the Rocky Mountains on the summit of Berthoud Pass (11,307 feet in elevation.) You will be able to see on both sides of the divide: the western side that eventually drains to the Pacific Ocean and the eastern side that reaches the Atlantic Ocean. Informative speakers will explain about the importance of the amount of annual snow that falls here, how it affects at least eighteen other states, and how much of our country is dependent on this annual moisture.

You will learn about Colorado's many Trans-Mountain Diversions–pipelines that move the state's water from the western slope to the eastern front range of Colorado; Western states' water laws; private property water rights; and information on the different and complex river Compact requirements. This tour will also include a presentation on the Mountain Pine Beetle infestation, due to the close proximity and epicenter of Grand County's National Forest devastation.
