The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Phil Campbell. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Clay Forst led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Clay Forst and seconded by Gary Crawley to approve the minutes of the April 5, 2021 Commission meeting as written. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Commissioners reviewed the claims register, p-card statement, revenue summary and allotment budget / available cash report as provided by Ms. Owen in Exhibit #1. Ms. Owen stated that they had processed claims totaling \$2,423,697.70 from March 25-April 20,2021. Ms. Owen said she would be happy to answer any questions the commissioners might have. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the financial reports as presented. Here are just a few projects Shellie has successfully completed: she developed a Blue Thumb data entry app and also a data viewable app map; summer of 2019 Shellie was asked to build an App for Blue Thumb volunteers to enter their data to get away from Adobe fillable forms. These projects were successful and worked out well for the end users.” Ms. Green noted, we appreciate Shellie for her attitude and her talents she brings to the Conservation Commission.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Ms. Owen presented one ratification of a new agreement for approval listed as item “a” on Exhibit #2. Ms. Owen stated this was to develop a restoration plan for Saline Creek in support of the Lake Hudson Watershed. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Herriman for ratification of the agreement. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen presented 3 new agreements for approval listed as items “b-d” on Exhibit #2. Ms. Owen recommended approval of these new amendments. A motion was made by Mr. Crawley and seconded by Mr. Jett for approval of the amended agreements. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen presented one amended agreement for consideration listed as items “e” on Exhibit #2. She recommended approval of the amendment. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Jett for approval of the new agreements. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR APPOINTMENT

Ms. Owen noted that there were letters in the packet from the districts where directors had not met 75% attendance requirements as shown on Exhibit #4. The commissioners were in agreement that COVID has had an impact on attendance to board meetings. She recommended approval of the recommendations for appointment except for Michael Patton in Tulsa County. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Forst and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the list of directors for appointment but to remove Mr. Patton’s name for consideration this month. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECTIONS FOR POSITION #2

Ms. Owen discussed with Commissioners the process for conducting conservation district elections with filing period having started today. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Forst to authorize Executive Director Lam to certify eligibility of candidates filing a Notification and Declaration of Candidacy for District Director Election and approve polling places in conservation districts where two or more candidates filed a Notification and Declaration of Candidacy for Elections. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

DISTRICT JOINT PLANS OF OPERATIONS

Ms. Owen stated Ms. Green has been reviewing Conservation Districts Joint Plans of Operations for the new Fiscal Year as shown on Exhibit #5. Four districts have made it through the review process. Ms. Owen recommended approval of the plans as listed. A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Forst to approve the Joint Plans of Operation as presented. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

He had been on the call on April 5, 2021 and noted that he was intending to run for the elected position on the Tulsa County Conservation District board. CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Tandy Kidd, Special Projects Manager, reported on the following items:

- Building reopened to the public as of today, May 03, 2021
- Board of Ag meeting will be held on May 05, 2021.
- JanLee was out due to attending the Senate Ag meeting to accept nominations for Nominees: Dan Herald, Hooker, OK for the Conservation Commission; Nicoma Cook, Cordell OK for the Department of Ag, Food and Forestry.
- Ag on Lincoln Day – There will be entertainment and several vendors. The gathering is on May 13, 2021 from 11:30am – 6:00pm.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

- Actively obligating EQIP Contracts; working quickly to get through the process so the focus can be on CSP and other projects. As of last week, \$4 million was obligated in contracts. There are more contracts ready that have been preapproved.
- Got more guidance on EQIP incentive contracts on the farm bill that can help prod This will help producers move from EQIP to CSP. There is more flexibility with CSP. Every state will pilot this. Getting allocation and focusing on soil health. Will be running sign up as soon as details are received from the National Office.
- CSP sign up ended on Friday to be considered for the program. Five hundred applications were turned in. Getting ready to start assessment and ranking.
- Completed training on Working Effectively with American Indians. The training was virtual with 30 different states in participation.
- Hosting Working for Wildlife Great Plains Grasslands week of May 3, 2021. Having a grasslands strategy meeting for team where priorities have been set.
- New initiative looking at woody encroachment on some of the grasslands. Reviewing data on how cedar has encroached in OK. Especially in the western part of the state. Trying to get some meetings scheduled that include cattlemen, partners, Conservation Commission and Districts. This seems to be a concern in the Southern Plains.
- Have hired several people at entry level positions through the direct hire authority. Positions coming available soon are: Engineering position at the State Office for Watershed Planning; Engineering positions in Woodward, OK and Perry, OK at the TSO Offices; Biologist at the State Office; Soil Scientist in Clinton, OK; Soil Conservationist in Mangum, OK.
- Update on COVID – 25% of state office staff and 50% of field office staff are allowed to be in the office at the same time; 50% at the same time in the field. There is more flexibility with outdoor events. There have been some changes with quarantine; if someone tests positive the office is closed for 3 days.

-Announcement of Regional Conservation Partnership Project (RCPP) awardees. Announcement of 85-86 around the country. Excited that the Conservation Commission's poultry project was funded. Mr. O'Neill stated there is a great opportunity to work with partners. They will start working with Mr. Lam to put an agreement together soon.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Sarah Blaney, OACD Executive Director
- Noted youth awards and director service awards have gone out from the OACD State Meeting.

- Thralls Scholarship is available to 1 High school Student and 1 College Student. Anyone interested in applying needs to do so by June 1, 2021.

- CARE Grant – Identified 6 out of 28 champions. Will be working on Conservation Planning and designing demonstration projects.

- Working with Cheryl, Kevin and Amy on expanding the yard-by-yard program.

- Executive Board Meeting is scheduled for May 18, 2021.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Jett – about 3 months ago Beaver Co. received a grant on fire safety. In September the district plans on having a program at the county fair about prescribed burning. They are currently working to get irrigation center pivots in the county equipped to assist with wildfire suppression. Several producers are lined up for this assistance. No rain to report.

Mr. Herriman – nothing to report.

Mr. Crawley – reported 3 ½ inches of rain. Waiting for warmer weather for Bermuda grass to grow.

Mr. Campbell – nothing to report

Mr. Forst – reported 5.1 inches of rain at home in Jefferson County. He also noted that Royce Reagan's wife passed away and asked that we keep his family in our prayers. Welcomed a new addition to their family Ford Robert Forst.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam accompanied Dan Herald to his confirmation hearing with the Senate and Assistant Director Ms. Owen reported the following items:

- Mr. Lam and Ms. Owen reviewed the telework policy with staff. They are working on the final details.

- Mr. Lam gave a presentation to the Senate Rural Caucus on Commission Programs.

- Working with State Risk Management to submit documentation for the district liability policy. Anticipating about an 8% increase.

- Participated in the NACD Tribal RPG Meeting. Grant Victor from Ottawa County has been appointed to the NACD Committee.

- The Feral Swine Technician Positions have been announced and closed. Have received about 33 application to review.

- Gathered letters together for Kevin Norton's retirement celebration. Congressman Lucas' office provided a commendation.
- Completed a budget revision for AML so that construction contracts could be sent to OMES.
- Clancy has been assisting the Texas County Conservation District and providing training in Deer Creek Conservation District. Scheduling training with new hires in Marshall and Johnston Counties as well.
- Clancy has been reviewing FY 21 district major projects.
- OCC website redesign seems to be going well. Planned launch date in June 2021.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips stated they have been getting out to districts and educating on water quality. Participating departments have been water quality, soil health and blue thumb. They have visited about 15 districts informing of programs that are available and why there may be monitoring in their area. Looking to do in person education events. Ms. Philips stated they are excited about the Regional Conservation Partnership Program. Working with Poultry producers and their neighbors. They want to address the concerns of those who live in the vicinity of a poultry operating location. There is an agreement in place with the Grand River Dam Authority. They will be working with Jerry Fleming on their project. There will be an opening for a Project Coordinator. Funding will be available from multiple sources including 319 funding, Poultry Integrators and Cherokee Nation.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Shellie Willoughby, GIS Specialist, stated there was a report provided in the packet and feel free to ask any questions. Work is continuing on the 911 project; they will be starting a 2nd course in person. The 3rd course will start thereafter. Working with Repository where all of 911 data will be stored. Once all of the 911 data is confirmed it will be housed with their GIS location. The data will be compiled and available for use for the State of OK. They also continue to assist on other projects for the Conservation Commission.

Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation: Robert Toole, Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the report stating that: construction is on-going on four (4) projects; two (2) projects are scheduled for contracting & construction start on August 1; one (1) project is pending an Authorization to Proceed from OSMRE; vegetation management & maintenance monitoring is being performed on six (6) projects; eight (8) projects are in the design phase; two (2) projects are in survey phase; three (3) sites are in realty phase.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director reported on the following items: Ms. Marshall has been providing Cost-Share training to all districts. The training was held in 2 session in which most districts participated. Ms. Marshall has been attending board meetings at districts where there has been low participation to encourage responsiveness to this program.

PROPOSED EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 10:25 a.m., a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Forst to enter Executive Session as authorized by the Oklahoma Meeting Act Section 307 (B)(1) of Title 25 of the Oklahoma Statutes to discuss the Executive Director's salary. Those voting aye were: Jett,

Campbell, Herriman, Crawley and Forst. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. The Commissioners requested that Ms. Stewart and Ms. Owen remain in Executive Session with Ms. Owen taking minutes. Teleconferencing was muted at this time.

At 10:59 a.m., the Commission re-entered open session with all Commissioners present. Teleconferencing was taken off mute and a motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Forst to return to open session. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, Crawley and Forst. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Crawley to set and establish the pay of the Executive Director of the Conservation Commission, a Grade ED9, at \$126,500 annually to become effective May 1, 2021. This established pay is being based off the Agency Director Pay Structure formulated by OMES for the Grade ED9 positions. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, Crawley and Forst. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

NEXT MEETING

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission is scheduled to be held on Monday, June 7, 2021, at the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Building, 2800 N. Lincoln Blvd., Oklahoma City, Oklahoma at 9:30 a.m. Ms. Owen noted that following the June Commission meeting; a luncheon was being planned to honor Karl Jett for his service to the Commission.

There being no further business, Mr. Jett made a motion, seconded by Mr. Forst, to adjourn the meeting 11:03 a.m. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Herriman, Jett, Crawley, and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

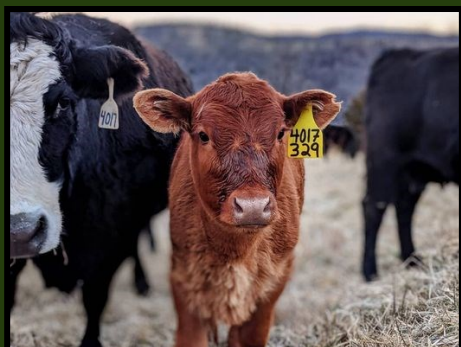

On his farm in Cotton Plant, Arkansas, Adam Chappell tends 9,000 acres of cotton, corn, soybeans, and rice. Chappell's triumph over pigweed made him a proponent of regenerative farming practices. He stopped tilling most of the soil, which depletes it, and he's nearly eliminated pesticide and synthetic fertilizer. His soil has become healthy and dark, alive with earthworms, rich with carbon.



The **Osage Creek Farms** currently runs 200 head of Angus base cattle in a rotational grazing system that allows them to have fresh grass year round. They drink from spring fed tire tanks which allows us to reduce erosion. In June 2017, they purchased an additional 700 acre expansion and are working to incorporate into the current operation which includes farm-to-table sales and marketing.

STATE BUDGET AGREEMENT REACHED

OKLAHOMA CITY (May 13, 2021)— A state budget agreement reached Thursday maintains all state core service funding, provides tax relief to individuals and businesses, and makes targeted new investments in key priorities like education, economic development, health care and infrastructure. The agreement also replenishes more than \$700 million in state reserve funds that were significantly reduced to offset pandemic-related revenue reductions last year. Under the agreement, the appropriated Fiscal Year 2022 budget would be \$8.3 billion.

The high-level agreement, which is still being finalized between the Legislature and Gov. Kevin Stitt:

- Increases common education funding by \$171.8 million, or 6%, to a record high of \$3.2 billion, triggering class size reductions in kindergarten and first grade.
- Boosts reserves from less than \$300 million today to more than \$1 billion – approaching the high-water mark state reserves held before the pandemic began.
- Reduces the top personal income tax rate from 5% to 4.75% and the corporate income tax rate from 6% to 4%, placing both in the Top 10 for lowest rates in the country of states that levy those types of taxes.
- Recruits more film industry projects by creating a new film tax incentive with a \$30 million cap.
- Expands broadband in underserved and unserved areas statewide through a \$42 million tax incentive for providers.
- Aggressively recruits jobs to Oklahoma through \$35 million in new economic development funding.
- Restores the Earned Income Tax Credit.
- Increases to \$50 million the Equal Opportunity Scholarship program cap (\$25 million for public schools and \$25 million for private schools).
- Funds expanded Medicaid for low-income Oklahomans.

- Restores historic sales tax credit allowing OU Health to train 160 additional nursing graduates and nurse practitioners annually and 70 additional medical residents within three years.

Legislation containing the agreement will begin progressing through the legislative Joint Committee on Appropriation and Budget in the coming days. The general appropriations bill will be House Bill 2900.

The budget was built on the Board of Equalization's February certification of \$9.6 billion in revenue available for appropriations. Of that figure, the agreement spends \$8.3 billion and allocates the rest to tax relief, replenishing reserves or replenishing off-the-top funding temporarily redirected during the pandemic last session.

The constitutional deadline for adjournment of the legislative session is 5 p.m. Friday, May 28.

"Today we delivered on the People's Agenda. I am proud of the Legislature's collaborative efforts to propose a budget that cuts taxes for Oklahomans and businesses, makes the largest investment in education in state history, and deposits around \$800 million into our state's savings account, replenishing our \$1 billion in savings. Last year the nation saw firsthand how Oklahoma's approach of fiscal responsibility and saving taxpayers' money works to secure our state and its future, and this budget demonstrates our strong commitment to continuing that approach to become a Top Ten state." – Gov. Kevin Stitt

"This budget delivers substantial savings, provides tax relief and invests in education. Of particular note is the increase in caps on the Equal Opportunity Scholarship program, a terrific program making a difference in the lives of deserving Oklahoma students who otherwise wouldn't have the chance to pursue a high-quality education. It's a remarkable feat considering that just over a year ago, we were in the height of a global pandemic and there was much economic uncertainty. This budget agreement will help ensure Oklahoma continues to advance from the effects of the pandemic and continue to grow and thrive as a state." – Senate President Pro Tempore Greg Treat, R-Oklaoma City

"This is the most comprehensive state budget in recent history. Getting tax relief, historic education investments, major economic development and infrastructure efforts, robust savings and more all into one budget is an unprecedented, tremendous step forward for Oklahoma. It's bug picking season! After holding onto macroinvertebrate samples we helped volunteers collect this past winter, those same volunteers are now picking through them! We use a process called subsampling, since picking the entire sample would take too much time and cost a lot for the taxonomist to identify; instead, we pick a random subsample of the jar. The picking can take between 3-6 hours, depending on the contents of the sample and how many times we have to subdivide to get the subsample down to about 100 bugs.



Ag on Lincoln

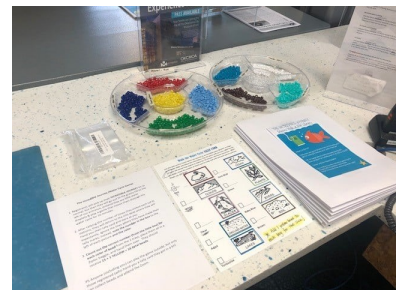
