The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Thursday, July 1, 2021, in the Agriculture Building located at 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Phil Campbell. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. Clay Forst led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

SELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022

After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herald and seconded by Mr. Campbell to appoint Mr. Herriman, Chair; Mr. Forst, Vice Chair; and Mr. Crawley, Secretary. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

Following the selection of officers' vote, Mr. Herriman assumed the duties of Chair for the remainder of the meeting.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Gary Crawley and seconded by Phil Campbell to approve the minutes of the June 7, 2021 Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Commissioners reviewed the claims register, p-card statement, revenue summary and allotment budget / available cash report as provided by Ms. Owen in Exhibit #1. Ms. Owen stated that they had processed claims totaling \$2,530,874.42 from time period May 20, 2021 through June 21, 2021. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herald to approve the financial reports as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

PRESENTATION OF AGREEMENTS

Ms. Owen presented 6 amended agreements for approval listed as items "a-f" on Exhibit #2. Ms. Owen recommended approval of these amended agreements. A motion was made by Mr. Crawley and seconded by Mr. Campbell for approval of the amended agreements. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen presented 5 new agreements for approval listed as item "g-k" on Exhibit #2. Ms. Owen recommended approval of these new agreements. A motion was made by Mr. Crawley and seconded by Mr. Herald for approval of these new agreements. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR APPOINTMENTS

Ms. Owen presented a list of directors recommended for appointment by their respective districts as shown in Exhibit #3. Three of these directors have not met the 75% attendance requirement. Letters of explanation have been submitted by their districts. Ms. Owen recommends approval of these appointments. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herald to approve the list of directors for appointment as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION DISTRICT JOINT PLANS OF OPERATIONS

Ms. Green presented the list of districts who have completed the requirements for the joint plan of operations as shown on Exhibit #4. Ms. Green recommends approval of these plans. A motion was made by Mr. Crawley and seconded by Mr. Campbell to approve the Joint Plans of Operations as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION FY 2022 BUDGET

Mr. Lam led a discussion covering the highlights of the FY 2022 budget. He noted that the budget had been completed and submitted to OMES pending the Commission's approval.

- a. Mr. Lam reviewed and recommended approval of the Proposed District Policies for FY 2022 as listed in Exhibit #5. A motion was made by Mr. Herald and seconded by Mr. Crawley to approve the policies as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.
- b. Mr. Lam reviewed and recommended approval of allocations to conservation districts for personnel and operating expenses as listed in Exhibit #6. Mr. Lam explained that the allocations include gross salary, longevity, FICA, operating expenses and copier expense. Employee benefit allowance for health insurance and employers share of retirement are not included in the allocations. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Crawley to approve the allocations as proposed. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.
- c. Mr. Lam presented the Agency Budget Work Program as listed in Exhibit #7. He explained that this document outlines the sources and amounts of funding for each agency division. Mr. Lam reviewed with Commissioners each division's sources of funding. He noted that about half of funds budgeted will go to districts in allocations, cost-share and flood control operation and maintenance. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herald to approve the budget work program as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.
- d. Mr. Lam discussed the conservation district director meeting expense, noting it was recommended to be set at \$25.00/meeting for a maximum of 12 monthly board meetings and would be reimbursed to the districts from their standard operating allocation. A motion was made by Mr. Campbell, seconded by Mr. Herald, to set the meeting expense at \$25.00/meeting with a maximum of 12 monthly board meetings. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Abstention: Forst. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Janlee Rowlett, Legislative Liaison, reported on the following items:

- Welcomed Commissioner Herald while serving his first time on the board at the Oklahoma Conservation Commission.
- On June 30, 2021, kicked off summer tour; Secretary Arthur will be traveling around the state visiting with producers and Ag businesses to see what challenges exist; ODAFF will be looking for ways to improve service. Visited with Made in Oklahoma companies in Madill, Pauls Valley and Durant. Also, visited with meat processors and agritourism venues.
- Legislative work – monitoring interim studies of what impact medical marijuana is having on the Ag industry.
- Hosting Agriculture Conference for young women in the Ag industry in OKC on August 6 - 7, 2021.
- Discussion of mobile meat processing trailer in CARES Act including meat processing grants, labor challenges.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Stacy Riley, Assistant State Conservationist Programs, reported on the following items:

- EQIP 99% obligated with almost \$22 million in funds.
- CSP Classic received 570 eligible applications and the deadline for ranking is July 09, 2021.
- New staff and promotions: Alexander Tune started as Soil Conservationist in Taloga, OK on June 6, 2021; Kim Ashby, Program Asst., Programs Staffing started in the State Office on June 20, 2021; Breanna Satterfield, Resource Conservationist in Wagoner started on June 2, 2021; Duel Brown, Range Management Specialist in Pawnee, OK started on June 20, 2021.
- No longer on staff: Don Skiles, Resource Conservationist, Altus, OK; has accepted a position in Texas started as of June 6, 2021.
- Wetland Reserve Easements (WRE) – 60 applications have been received and not all are eligible; with 3 offers pending.
- EWP – All projects have been completed as of June 23, 2021; this was from the 2019 flood events.
- Watershed planning covered Caston Mountain plan at National Headquarters
- Had public hearing on June 30, 2021, covering the Okfuskee N-7 project.
- Rehabilitation work is under way on the Upper Elk Creek Site 23D

- COVID – In the service center they are at 50% capacity or 2 people max at the same time; in State offices 25% staff at the same time; no outside visitors without appointments; a F-Pack proposal has been submitted to the President of what they would like the normal process to be in returning to the office. The agency's goal is to return to what the new normal would be by September of whatever processes are put in place in opening back up. Processes have not been finalized yet as of July 1, 2021.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Trey Lam, OCC Executive Director, reported on the following items for Sarah Blaney, OACD Executive Director:

- Area Meetings – Area IV will be in Duncan on October 27, 2021; working on dates for Area V hosted by LeFlore CCD, confirming hosts for Area I, II, and III.
- South Central Regional Meeting is in Eureka Springs, AR on 8/12/21-8/13/21.
- Winners for the Thralls Memorial Scholarship have been selected; winners and districts were notified this week; official announcement and press release will go out after July 4, 2021.
- CARE Grant has identified 13 socially disadvantaged and/or veteran champions; Soil testing and WORMS data is being collected until August 1, 2021; there are demonstration projects of up to 40 acres all will be designed before September; worked with the prescribed burning association to train individuals on how to complete a burn plan was hosted in Pittsburg CCD; also traveled to Nacogdoches, TX to discuss projects progress with Assoc. Soil and Water CD, Texas Agri forestry Small Farmers and Ranchers and four local conservation districts.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Herald – thanked everyone for the opportunity to work with them. He hopes to know more about the operations of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission in the next year. They had 7” of rain in May; good start to harvest. On June 30, 2021, they had 85 mile an hour winds that was a little challenging in operating one of his work trucks.

Mr. Herriman – explained the process for harvesting his first rye cover crop; with plans to plant beans after.

Mr. Crawley – they have had less than an 1” of rain. Gearing up for hay bailing. Went to a prescribed burning training; highly encouraged others to go.

Mr. Campbell – attended webinar by National Watershed Coalition; went well. Participated in a Water Quality Blue Thumb Wet Training; he recommended others to attend. His grandkids have been helping him out on the farm.

Mr. Forst – been receiving a slow steady rain.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam reported the following items:

- Spent a significant amount of time on budgets.
- Participated in Don Bartolina's retirement gathering; got to see some folks in Conservation that he hasn't seen in a while.
- Worked with Soil Health in WORMS data testing.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips stated there was a report in the packet and would be happy to answer any questions. Welcomed Mr. Herald on his first time serving on the board at the Oklahoma Conservation Commission. Ms. Phillips introduced Meg Greski; Ms. Greski has 10 years experience in regenerative ag and has gathered experience while working all over the country. She will be working with districts and producers on regenerative ag and soil health. Water Quality has provided educational programs, monitoring and training. Ms. Phillips invited commissioners to let staff know if they are interested in participating in water quality events.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated there was a report provided in the packet and would be happy to answer any questions. Work continues on the Next Generation 911 project. Two training classes have been completed and a third and final class is scheduled for August. The NG911 State Repository has been completed and will be the primary subject of the third training class. The State Repository is a website that will receive 911 data from the local 911 centers that will be processed to ensure it complies with the State 911 Address Standard. The data once validated will be merged into a statewide 911 dataset. Equipment to support this 911 project has been ordered and will be installed over the next couple of months in the State Datacenter.

Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation: Robert Toole, Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole welcomed new Commissioner Dan Herald. He then introduced the AML Program staff. Next he recognized Valerie Rogers, AML Engineer, for 5 years of service to the State of Oklahoma. Mr. Toole then summarized the June 2021 AML Program activity stating: construction is on-going on four (4) projects; two (2) projects are in contracting & with construction starts in August; vegetation management & maintenance monitoring is being performed on six (6) projects; five (5) projects are in the design phase; two (2) projects are in survey phase; three (3) sites are in realty phase. AML funding initiatives have significantly increased in the last month with multiple bills introduced that address reauthorization of fee collections. AML funding has also been addressed in an infrastructure proposal that would provide significant funding in addition to the existing AML Trust Funds. HR 1734, co-sponsored by Congressman Markwayne Mullin, is still Oklahoma's preferred fee reauthorization legislation.

Conservation Programs: Lisa Knauf Owen, Assistant Director reported on the following items for Tammy Sawatzky, Director of Conservation Programs:

Watershed Aide District Reviews are underway; 7 out of 9 were completed by Ms. Sawatzky, Johnny Pelley and George Moore this month. Rehabilitation work has started on the Upper Elk Creek Site 23 D. Rehabilitation of Cottonwood 54 is in phase 2 of construction and work continues on this project.

Assistant Director: Lisa Knauf Owen reported on the following items:

- Provided a virtual presentation to Dam Information, Resources and Training (Dirt) with Dan Sebert for the National Watershed Coalition.
- Tanner Raasch, Feral Swine Control Technician started on June 1, 2021; he has met with 24 producers thus far and attended 4 district meetings. Michael Horinek, Feral Swine Control Technician who will be in Pawnee, OK started on June 14, 2021.


NEXT MEETING

2. The maximum number of hours for a non-benefitted part-time / temporary district employee will be 999 hours. If hours exceed 999 hours, the district will be responsible for the employer's share of retirement contributions.
3. District operating expense allocations will be based upon each district's submission of required reports and documents. The allocation is based solely on whether the deliverable was completed with all required elements and submitted on time – not on the specific content of the deliverable.
4. Failure to perform audits and/or submit preclaim payments (for retirement and insurance) within the established timeframe will result in OCC withholding payment of district claims until compliance is accomplished.
5. In order for a district to be eligible to continue receiving a personnel allocation from OCC; the districts must perform annual performance evaluations on all staff.

Field Season!

It's time for fish collections! This year, we're fishing the Central Irregular Plains Ecoregion, which includes most of the Tulsa area, Okmulgee, Broken Arrow, and a little further east to Muskogee. Volunteers will get a chance to get a different look at their creek through a habitat assessment and the experience of seining for fish. A healthy riparian area and a diverse fish population indicate that a creek is functioning as it should.

Bottom (from left to right): A gizzard shad (accompanied by a very large, aggressive snapping turtle) and some longear sunfish in Owasso Creek. A black bullhead catfish that we managed to catch in Owasso Creek as well (no noodling involved). And a beautiful redear sunfish from a tributary to Haikey Creek. The shad and catfish are tolerant to pollution, while the redear is slightly sensitive. Longear sunfish are also somewhat tolerant, are found throughout Oklahoma, and can be very bright and colorful! Common snapping turtles are sometimes mistaken for rocks while performing the habitat assessment.



New volunteers!

We had a training for new volunteers this month in Oklahoma City! Even with the hot, hot temperatures, these new volunteers were a great bunch! They went through 16 hours of training, during which they learned about Blue Thumb, stream ecology, nonpoint source pollution, biological assessments and chemical monitoring and analysis. Staff assist monitoring volunteers with fish and bug collections, and volunteers complete monthly chemical testing on their own.

Education events are ramping back up! We could not be more excited. We've had a volunteer borrow the Incredible Journey to help kids learn about the water cycle in Tulsa.
