#### MINUTES OF PREVIOUS REGULAR MEETING

A motion was made by Scotty Herriman and seconded by Clay Forst to approve the minutes of the May 3, 2021 Commission meeting as written. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Campbell and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

#### **CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

Commissioners reviewed the claims register, p-card statement, revenue summary and allotment budget / available cash report as provided by Ms. Owen in Exhibit #1. Ms. Owen stated that they had processed claims totaling \$1,710,463.15 through April 20, 2021. A motion was made by Mr. Crawley and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve the financial reports as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Crawley and seconded by Mr. Forst for approval of the amended agreements. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Mr. Lam provided information about the NACD south central meeting scheduled to be held in Eureka Springs, Arkansas on August 12-13, 2021. He asked Commissioners to notify Ms. Powell as soon as possible if they would interested in attending. He recommended approval of six staff members and five Commissioners to attend. ### REAPPOINTMENT OF DOUG EICHELBERGER TO REMAINDER OF TERM FOR NORTH CADDO CD BOARD

Ms. Owen presented information in the packet recommending approval of Mr. Eichelberger to complete his appointed term. The Commission had provisionally appointed Mr. Eichelberger provided that he attends 75% of the meetings in the first year of his term. He has attended 9 out of 10 meetings as of April 2021. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Forst to appoint Mr. Eichelberger for the remainder of his term which ends June 30, 2022. ### DECLARE POSITION #2 VACANT IN CONSERVATION DISTRICTS WHERE NO ONE FILED FOR ELECTION

Ms. Owen presented the list of districts where no one filed for the elected position #2 as shown in Exhibit #6. She noted that districts will be notified to take action in their June meeting to recommend appointment of someone to fulfill the elected term. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Forst to declare elected position #2 vacant in districts as presented. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

#### REVIEW OF CONSERVATION DISTRICT ELECTIONS

Ms. Owen presented information regarding the four contested conservation district elections as shown in Exhibit #7. Elections were held in Coal County, Okfuskee County, Tulsa County and Little River Conservation Districts on Tuesday, June 1, 2021. No action required.

#### UNOFFICIAL RESULTS OF DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECTIONS FOR POSITION #2

Ms. Owen presented Exhibit #8 as the unofficial results of the four conservation district elections. Executive Director Lam will declare these individuals elected once the official paperwork is received from the election committee chair. No action required.

#### CONSERVATION DISTRICT JOINT PLANS OF OPERATIONS

Ms. Owen presented the list of districts who have completed the requirements for the joint plan of operations as shown on Exhibit #9. Ms. Owen recommends approval of these plans. A motion was made by Mr. Forst and seconded by Mr. Crawley to approve the Joint Plans of Operation as presented. A roll call vote was taken and those voting aye were: Forst, Herriman, Jett, Crawley and Campbell. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

#### REVIEW OF THE COMMISSION'S FY2022 APPROPRIATION

Mr. Lam reviewed the Commission's FY22 appropriation. He noted that this appropriation is an increase of 8.43% over last fiscal year. The appropriation this year for the Commission will be \$13,726,001.00. This appropriation fulfills a full year bonding for the fund. The Agency has also received funding to continue the Master Irrigator's program in partnership with OSU. Mr. Lam noted that staff is working on putting the detailed budget together for approval at the July Commission meeting.

### RECOGNITION OF KARL JETT, AREA 1 COMMISSIONER, FOR 10 YEARS OF SERVICE

Mr. Lam thanked Mr. Jett for his service on the Commission board and the State of Oklahoma. He recognized him for his leadership as chairman and mentorship he provided at the time Mr. Lam joined the Commission. Mr. Lam showed his appreciation to Mr. Jett on how he handled challenging situations during his time on the board. Many in the room spoke about Mr. Jett's character, work ethic and the time they have worked with him. All were thankful and appreciative of their time with Mr. Jett. Mr. Jett spoke about his time on the board, and his appreciation for the opportunity, and those who he has worked with.

#### CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Emily James, Public Relation Coordinator, reported on the following items:

- Welcomed new intern Audrey Ochsner and noted she will be assisting Secretary Arthur, Janlee Rowlett and the communication's team this summer.
  - Tandy Kidd accepted a position with NASDA in Washington D.C.
  - Legislative session has ended. For any questions please forward to JanLee Rowlett.
- Made in OK Showcase Today in Luther, OK. Gearing up for summer ag tours that Secretary Arthur and other directors attend. If anyone has suggestions that they should stop by please feel free to make suggestions.
- Board of Ag Meeting is being held on June 16, 2021 at 10:00 am in the Agriculture Building.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary 0'Neill, State Conservationist, reported on the following items:

- Recognized Ms. Owen on her work ethic. It was a pleasure working with her. He congratulated her on her time at the commission.
- Recognized Mr. Jett for his time served and the challenges he took on without any hesitancy. Mr. O'Neill spoke about the wildfires in northwest OK and how Mr. Jett stepped up to help.
- New staff and promotions: Jeremy Hughes, District Conservationist on Team 3; New Forester in McAlester, OK, John Heinen.
- Retirees coming in July: John Glover, former Deputy State Conservationist and Salvador Salinas, Regional Conservationist.
  - Terry Cosby from Ohio has been selected to serve as the Chief of NRCS.
- Staff are finishing up on EQIP and trying to get funds obligated so they can begin to focus on CSP. Have been discussing EQIP incentive contracts which is a new part of the farm bill. This program will be piloted in Arizona, California, Oregon and Colorado. This program is not EQIP or CSP.
  - Received 700 applications for CSP; staff are busy assessing applications.
- Met with Heather Dawn Thompson, Director of Office of Tribal Relations; accompanied Ms. Thompson to a meeting with the Cheyenne Arapaho nation. Discussed soil health activities and bison herd. Looking at American Rescue Acts and loan forgiveness.
  - Two Forestry projects have been submitted.
- Had engineering boot camp was held virtually with 32 participants. Many were partner employee and shared technicians. The field portion of the training is taking place with smaller groups.
  - COVID Field office staff is at 50% and state office is at 25%.
  - 21 new pathway interns have started.; trying to train in small groups in the field.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Sarah Blaney, OACD Executive Director, reported on the following items:

- CARE Grant Identified 10 out of 28 champions. Will be working on Conservation Planning and designing demonstration projects.
  - Planning has begun for the Area Meetings that will be held in person in November 2021.
  - Legislative budget increase of over 8%.

- Encouraged attendance to the NACD Summer 2021 Meeting in Chicago, IL on July 24 28, 2021.
- Encouraged attendance to the South Central NACD Regional Meeting in Eureka Springs, AR on August 12-13, 2021.

#### OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Jett – reported that the panhandle of Oklahoma had received a little over 5 inches of rain in the past week. The Beaver County district is planning a wildlife education event to coincide with the county fair. He finished by stating it has been a privilege serving with everyone.

Mr. Herriman – expressed appreciation for Mr. Jett.

Mr. Crawley – noted it has been a pleasure working with Mr. Jett.

Mr. Campbell – told Mr. Jett to anticipate a call from him to get a weather report.

Mr. Forst – thanked Mr. Jett for his guidance.

#### OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

*Executive Director:* Mr. Lam reported the following items and noted he would be happy to answer any questions:

- Remember the weather in 2011 and reminisced with Mr. Jett on the dry climate.
- A lot of work on budgets and beginning to deliver some grants; coming out of the restrictions from the pandemic.
- On June 1, 2021 staff returned back to work in the office with telework policy still in place. All employees will be in the office at least part of the time.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips stated there was a report in the packet and would be happy to answer any questions. Ms. Phillips introduced attendees from GRDA, Mr. Fite, VP of River Ops. and Water Quality; Mr. Townsend, VP of Ecosystems and Watershed Management; Ms. Fleming, Dir. of Environmental Education and Poultry Partnerships. Ms. Phillips notated it has been a pleasure to work in partnership with the GRDA on repairing easements on the IL River Watershed, Grand lake watershed and water shed planning. Now they will be working together on a poultry partnership project. Ms. Phillips introduced Ms. Dantzler-Kyer who recently has joined the Commission. Ms. Seiger introduced Ms. Frentz she is the Soil Health Intern from OSU.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated there was a report provided in the packet and would be happy to answer any questions. Mr. Sharp thanked Mr. Jett for his service to the Commission. Mr. Sharp noted that within OGI they are getting ready to do some hardware upgrades for 911 project that they are working on for the state repository working with OEM on. There is only one county that has met the state standard on data and it is Beaver Co.

Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation: Mike Sharp, Assistant Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Dr. Sharp summarized the report stating that: construction is on-going on four (4) projects; two (2) projects are in contracting & with construction starts in August; vegetation management & maintenance monitoring is being performed on six (6) projects; eight (8) projects are in the design phase; two (2) projects are in survey phase; four (4) sites are in realty phase. AML funding reauthorization, specifically HR 1734 co-sponsored by Congressman Markwayne Mullin, is moving through the House with hearings conducted by the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources. Subsequently, HR 1734 was Ordered to be Reported (to the House) by the Committee on Natural Resources.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director reported on the following items: Ms. Sawatzky thanked Mr. Jett for his hard work. Ms. Sawatzky spoke on her time working with Ms. Owen and how she is an interictal part to the agency. Ms. Sawatzky had Ms. Marshall present the PY 21 final Cost-Share report. Ms. Marshall noted that this PY was for the soil health initiative. Each Conservation District received \$12,000.00, this was done in the NRCS Teams. This was worth \$1,008,000.00 and paid out \$429,834.19 to participants. The amount of \$578,000.00 was returned back to OCC from this PY. There were about 147 participants for this year; 9 different practices; 167 practices installed. Area 3 got the most paid out participants about \$120,000.00. Working on ways to put funding back into soil health; working with Ms. Seiger on ideas to maybe schedule a field day.

Assistant Director: Lisa Knauf Owen reported on the following items:

- Thanked everyone for their kind words.
- Hired 2 feral swine control technicians for pilot projects: Tanner Raasch, will be housed in Tillman County and Michael Horinek, will be housed in Pawnee County.

#### PROPOSED EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 11:02 a.m., a motion was made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Forst to enter Executive Session as authorized by the Oklahoma Meeting Act Section 307 (B)(1) of Title 25 of the Oklahoma Statutes to discuss the Executive Director's salary. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, Crawley and Forst. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. The Commissioners requested that Ms. Stewart, Ms. Owen and Mr. Lam remain in Executive Session with Ms. Owen taking minutes. Teleconferencing was muted at this time.

At 11:22 a.m., the Commission re-entered open session with all Commissioners present. Teleconferencing was taken off mute and a motion was made by Mr. Forst and seconded by Mr. Crawley to return to open session. Those voting aye were: Jett, Campbell, Herriman, Crawley and Forst. Nay votes: none. Motion carried. Chair Campbell noted that there was no action to be taken regarding Executive Session.

#### FISCAL YEAR 22 - PROPOSED DISTRICT POLICIES

- 1. All employee positions (District and Commission) that become vacant will be reviewed and will require justification before approval to fill the position. Future employee allocations will be dependent on the level of legislative appropriations.
- 2. The maximum number of hours for a non-benefitted part-time / temporary district employee will be 999 hours. If hours exceed 999 hours, the district will be responsible for the employer's share of retirement contributions.
- 3. District operating expense allocations will be based upon each district's submission of required reports and documents. The allocation is based solely on whether the deliverable was completed with all required elements and submitted on time not on the specific content of the deliverable.
- 4. Failure to perform audits and/or submit preclaim payments (for retirement and insurance) within the established timeframe will result in OCC withholding payment of district claims until compliance is accomplished.
- 5. In order for a district to be eligible to continue receiving a personnel allocation from OCC; the districts must perform annual performance evaluations on all staff.

#### Field Season!

It's time for fish collections! This year, we're fishing the Central Irregular Plains Ecoregion, which includes most of the Tulsa area, Okmulgee, Broken Arrow, and a little further east to Muskogee. Volunteers will get a chance to get a different look at their creek through a habitat assessment and the experience of seining for fish. A healthy riparian area and a diverse fish population indicate that a creek is functioning as it should.

Top Right: It is important to seine underneath overhanging vegetation while fishing; it's very good habitat for fish!

Bottom (from left to right): A gizzard shad (accompanied by a very large, aggressive snapping turtle) and some longear sunfish in Owasso Creek. A black bullhead catfish that we managed to catch in Owasso Creek as well (no noodling involved). And a beautiful redear sunfish from a tributary to Haikey Creek. The shad and catfish are tolerant to pollution, while the redear is slightly sensitive. Longear sunfish are also somewhat tolerant, are found throughout Oklahoma, and can be very bright and colorful! Common snapping turtles are sometimes mistaken for rocks while performing the habitat assessment.







#### **New volunteers!**

We had a training for new volunteers this month in Oklahoma City! Even with the hot, hot temperatures, these new volunteers were a great bunch! They went through 16 hours of training, during which they learned about Blue Thumb, stream ecology, nonpoint source pollution, biological assessments and chemical monitoring and analysis. Staff assist monitoring volunteers with fish and bug collections, and volunteers complete monthly chemical testing on

their own.









### **Education, Education**

Education events are ramping back up! We could not be more excited. We've had a volunteer borrow the Incredible Journey to help kids learn about the water cycle in Tulsa. Our most popular activity, the EnviroScape®, was at Chouteau Elementary School, where kids got to see how `nonpoint source pollution affects a watershed.
