CALL TO ORDER

The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, October 11, 2021, in the Agriculture Building located at 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Scotty Herriman. He stated this was a regular scheduled meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted at 3:00 p.m. Thursday, October 07, 2021, at the front entrance of the Oklahoma Agriculture Building, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, as well as on the agency's website www.ok.gov/conservation.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

A motion was made by Mr. Campbell and seconded by Mr. Herald for approval of the amended agreement. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell, Forst and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen presented nine ratified new agreements for approval listed as items “c-k” on Exhibit #2. Ms. Owen stated that Chair Herriman was asked to approve these agreements prior to the Commission Meeting. CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR APPOINTMENTS

COMMISSION FY 23 BUDGET REQUEST

Mr. Lam presented the Commission’s FY 2023 budget request as outlined in Exhibit #5. The first priority is for Upstream Flood Control Program to address the backlog of maintenance and repair needs; The second priority is Critical Needs for Conservation Districts, requesting funding to hire five Conservation District employees and a market adjustment salary increase for

current District employees. The third priority is an unpaved roads/road side erosion program, to develop a pilot project in Lincoln County Conservation District. The fourth priority is for operation funding for Office of Geographic Information. Also included in the budget request is a supplemental appropriation for the Abandoned Mine Land program. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Herald, seconded by Mr. Forst, to approve the FY'23 Budget Request as presented in Exhibit #5. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Herald, Campbell, Forst and Crawley. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Janlee Rowlett, Legislative Liaison, reported on the following items-

- Introduced Jamie Deans, Governor's Policy Team-Ag
- Participated in NASDA's Annual Meeting with Secretary Arthur; met with other State Departments of Agriculture. Discussed common issues and developed policy. Secretary Arthur will continue role as Animal Ag Committee Chair and was elected to be an at-large member of NASDA'S Board of Directors.
- ODAFF Divisions are currently in rulemaking process; drafting and will publish for notice and comment this winter.
- Market development had a record sales year in the Made in OK store at the Oklahoma State Fair; Made in OK café located at Tulsa State Fair as well.

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Trey Lam, Executive Director, Oklahoma Conservation Commission reported on the following items on behalf of Gary O'Neill, State Conservationist-

- Emergency Watershed Protection – Due to flooding event on June 26 – June 28, 2021, - five damage survey reports were submitted to national headquarters for funding; amount requested was \$634,980.00. Project locations are: Osage, Logan, Garvin, Lincoln and Payne counties.
 - Farm Bill Program FY'21 totals – EQIP, 800 contracts obligated for \$22mm and 196k acres, \$3.1mm payments made for FY'21; CSP GCI, 401 contracts obligated for \$3.4mm and 40k acres; CSP Classic Renewals, 150 contracts obligated for \$4.1mm and 47k acres; CSP Classic, 169 contracts obligated for \$7.8mm and 154k acres; WRE, 3 new easements for 600 acres; ALE, 1 new easement obligated, should close sometime in October.
 - Hiring: Hired 25 direct entry level positions. Advertising for five new Pathway positions: Recent graduate Economist Position, Soil Scientist Position in Claremore, , Soil Position in Fairview, , Rangeland Management Position in Hobart, and Pawhuska,. Priority for FY'22 will be training new hires.
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- Budget – Received initial allocation for FY'22, starting program activity for FY'22; working under a continuing resolution until Mid-December timeframe.
- Outreach – Developed outreach plan for activities in FY'22. Goal to increase partner outreach events with additional groups who can help reach potential customers and expand urban conservation impacts.
- Other items – State Technical Advisory Committee meeting on November 3, 2021. NRCS employees inquiring about COVID vaccination mandates and reasonable accommodation process; date for NRCS employee vaccination is November 22, 2021. NRCS is waiting on final guidance on how requirements will impact staff, agreements, and contracts.
- CSP – Working with producers to get documentation for CSP payments.
- CRP – Conservation plan finalization by December 17th for accepted CRP offers; big task for Teams 1,2, and 3.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Sarah Blaney, OACD Executive Director, reported on the following items-

- OACD Area Meeting – Area IV meeting on October 27, 2021, Duncan; participants can attend virtually or in-person. There will be an outstanding award presented to a Cooperator and Director; winners will receive \$1,000 each. The district award winner will receive \$2,500.
- Traveled to NACD Executive Director conference in North Carolina; made presentation on CARE Project.
- OACD will be hiring a Project Manager.
- CARE Grant – Identified 24 Champions and first demo is in December; field days will start in December as well.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Herald – beautiful fall weather; received about a ½” inch of rain in 12 hours. Cutting grain sorghum. Wheat planting is going well.

Mr. Herriman – about 1” inch of rain this morning. Participated in the Leopold Award Ceremony; Grant Victor was recognized.

Mr. Crawley – dry climate; about 2/10” inch of rain on 10/10/21. Ponds are getting low. Army worms are causing problems in pastures.

Mr. Campbell – attended field day in Lincoln County; spouses of veterans participated.

Mr. Forst – 6/10” inch of rain. Ready for hunting season.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Mr. Lam reported the following items:

- Toured Elk Creek 23D Dam Rehab; Congressman Lucas, Secretary Arthur, Mayor and City Manger of Elk City were in attendance.
- Participated in the Arkansas Oklahoma River Compact Commission 2021 Annual Meeting with staff.
- Attended the NASCA Conference in Spokane, Washington with staff; opportunity to meet with other conservation agencies from different states and exchange ideas and feedback to

improve expertise for Oklahoma Conservation Commission staff. NRCS, Chief Terry Cosby was in attendance.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, OCC Water Quality Division Director, stated that there was a report in the packet. Ms. Phillips stated that staff had been busy with field days and workshops, including Blue Thumb and Soil Health who held a Full Circle Citizenship Training in Duncan; good attendance with representatives from the City, the Lake, conservation districts and others. Attendees were updated on the NRCS Little Beaver Watershed project, soil health and water quality. One district board member heard about the potential for unpaved roads projects and quickly relayed interest in working on unpaved roads. Ms. Phillips stated that the Soil Health Team had participated in a training with American Farmland Trust related to the economic assessment tool. The training was useful helping the team condense and simplify how the tool was communicated to producers so focus could be on most important information necessary to complete the assessments. Finally, Ms. Phillips noted OCC had finalized its Nonpoint Source success story candidate watersheds had been accepted, but not yet finalized by EPA. This year's stories include Turkey Creek in Jackson, Harmon, and Greer Counties and Roaring Creek in Grady county, both delisted for E. coli bacteria. These watersheds include a large number of upstream flood control structures whose operation and maintenance played a role, along with NRCS conservation practices in reducing bacteria in the stream. Salt Creek in Pottawatomie and Seminole counties was another success story, delisted for E. coli and fish community. Finally, Coon, Deer and Willow creeks in Logan, Oklahoma, Cleveland and Canadian counties were delisted for chlorpyrifos, a type of pesticides. These successes highlighted the value of the OK Department of Agriculture's pesticide training and certification program in ensuring that pesticide usage had minimal larger environmental impacts.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated that there was a report in the packet and would be happy to answer any questions. Mr. Sharp stated he didn't have anything to highlight at this time.

Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation: Robert Toole, Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. Mr. Toole summarized the September 2021 AML Program activity stating: construction is on-going on three (3) projects; contracting is on hold for 2 projects pending funding; vegetation management & maintenance monitoring is being performed on seven (7) projects; seven (7) projects are in the design phase; three (3) sites are in realty phase and one (1) project is in environmental clearance phase.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director of Conservation Programs reported on the following items:

- OETA did a story on the watershed program; staff was present and interviewed in Canadian and Wagoner counties.
- Operations and Maintenance work in Hughes County. with six-man crew clearing sites.
- Allocations of \$184k was distributed to districts for operations and maintenance funds. Several districts are working with NRCS to make remedial repairs of the corrugated metal pipes. Currently six of ten dams have been repaired.
- CostShare Program YR'23 allocations in the amount of \$471,023 was sent to 70 Conservation Districts; bringing the total PY'23 allocations to \$2.2 million. Costshare coordinator

Taylor Marshall is compiling final information for PY'22 which will be presented to the Commission at the November meeting. Ms. Marshall has started on the PY'24 guidelines and plans to present guidelines for approval to the Commission in December.

Assistant Director: Lisa Knauf Owen reported on the following items:

- Introduced Kari Kuykendall, HR Management Specialist who is a new hire for the Commission. Ms. Kuykendall will provide Human Resources support to the Commission and District offices.
- Worked on Budget Request for FY'23.
- Continued updating the Conservation Districts employee handbook with Ms. Green and Ms. Stewart.
- Feral swine traps have been delivered to 2 pilot areas.
- Communicating with the Pig Brig Company about a non-electric trap to utilize in areas with poor cellular coverage; the company has set out a demo trap for testing.
- Participated in OETA interview in Pawnee area regarding feral swine issues in Oklahoma.
- Listened to a podcast from Australia; speaker advised on sodium nitrate and benefits to reducing feral swine population; sodium nitrate is not supposed to be harmful to other animals.
