The Oklahoma Conservation Commission met Monday, July 05, 2022, in the Agriculture Building located at 2800 N. Lincoln Blvd in Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 9:30 a.m. by Chair Gary Crawley. He stated this was a scheduled regular meeting held in accordance with the Open Meeting Law, Title 25, Oklahoma Statutes, Sections 301 and following as amended. The agenda for this meeting was posted at 11:30 a.m. Thursday, July 1, 2022, at the front entrance of the Oklahoma Agriculture Building, 2800 N. Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, as well as on the agency's website conservation.ok.gov.

Mr. Lam presented information on the NACD South Central Regional Meeting to be held in Baton Rouge, LA, August 28-30, 2022. Mr. Lam indicated 6 Commission staff, including himself and Ms. Owen, anticipate attending if approved and requested Commissioners also let Ms. Owen know if they would be attending. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Priess and seconded by Mr. Forst to approve the travel request pending Secretary approval. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Forst, Crawley and Priess. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION DISTRICT DIRECTOR APPOINTMENTS

Ms. Green discussed with Commissioners possible approval of directors recommended for appointment by their respective districts as shown in Exhibit #4. One of the recommended directors did not meet the 75% attendance requirement and two were incumbents who failed to file for election. Ms. Green recommended approval of these appointments. After discussion, a motion was

made by Mr. Herriman and seconded by Mr. Priess to approve the district director appointments as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Forst, Crawley and Priess. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

REVIEW OF CONSERVATION DISTRICT ELECTION RESULTS

Ms. Green presented the election results from two districts where more than one candidate filed for an elected position (Exhibit #5). No action was taken.

DISTRICT JOINT PLANS OF OPERATIONS

Ms. Green presented the list of districts who have completed the requirements for the Conservation District Joint Plans of Operation as shown on Exhibit #6. Ms. Green recommended approval of these plans. After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Priess and seconded by Mr. Forst to approve the joint plans of operation as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Forst, Crawley and Priess. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

REVIEW OF THE COMMISSION'S FY2023 BUDGET

Motion carried.

Ms. Owen presented for approval the proposed allocations to conservation districts for personnel and operating expenses as seen as item (b). (Exhibit #8). After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Forst and seconded by Mr. Priess to approve the district allocations as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Forst, Crawley and Priess. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Mr. Lam and Ms. Owen presented for approval the Agency Budget Work Program as seen in item (c). (Exhibit #9) After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Forst and seconded by Mr. Herriman to approve the Agency Budget Work Program as presented. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Forst, Crawley and Priess. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Ms. Owen discussed setting the conservation district director meeting expense at \$25.00/meeting for a maximum of twelve meetings as seen in item (d). After discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Priess and seconded by Mr. Forst to set the conservation district director expense at \$25.00/meeting with a maximum of 12 monthly board meetings. Those voting aye were: Herriman, Forst, Crawley and Priess. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: No report

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Gary O'Neil, State Conservationist, presented. Thanked everyone for their patience in his absence but he is glad to be back. He thanked Jamey Wood for filling in during his detail. Mr. O'Neil explained what he did while working on

detail in Washington, D.C. Discussed this FY's watershed funding and what Oklahoma received. He noted that NRCS has submitted their FY23 budget and will hopefully be adding several new entry level positions at the agency. NRCS will be focused on not only training them but get those who were hired during COVID fully up to speed with their job duties. He is hopeful that the higher amounts requested for EQIP and CSP will be approved. They are currently wrapping up this year's EQIP and still have a lot of CSP plans that need to be written. Currently, NRCS is at 100% for staffing in the office according to COVID protocols but at least four conservation districts have been limited to wearing masks and not having visitors. COVID numbers are trending upward in OK but right now they are working business as usual.

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Bill Jordan, OACD President, presented. Mr. Jordan spoke about the five field days that OACD has held with their CARES Champions from across the state. There will be another field day on July 9th in Dover, Oklahoma. Sarah Blaney presented at the Texas Agricultural Conference about the CARES project. A film crew will be working on a documentary about the CARES program in Oklahoma, and it will be used for online outreach. He discussed the leadership class event that was held in Tahlequah, OK. He appreciates the support that the Commission has given to OACD regarding the leadership class events. The grant that OACD and OCC are partnering in regarding Climate Smart Agricultural Practices for Underserved Producers has been submitted. OACD will be doing a Partnership with Fresh RX, as well as partnering in a grant with the Playa Lakes Joint Venture focused on social science in Woods, Beaver, and Upper Washita Conservation Districts. Phil Campbell is now serving on the OACD board, and they are grateful to have him. Sarah will be attending the NACD summer meeting in Puerto Rico, as well as one of this year's CARE Champion. OACD hopes that several of them will be attending the NACD South Central Meeting in Baton Rouge.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Priess – Stated he would like some rain.

Mr. Forst – Stated that his area is in exceptional drought and needs rain.

Mr. Crawley – State that his area is getting very dry and needing rain.

Mr. Herriman – Stated that he was really hoping for some rain, as things are starting to get really dry in NE Oklahoma. He also welcomed Mr. Priess to the Commission.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Executive Director: Trey Lam. He commented on the OACD leadership class and how this year's class is such a great group of people. On June 29th, attended one of OCC's Feral Swine Outreach Meetings in Walters, OK, and commented on the good turnout we had. Explained the budget process that OCC has now completed but it kept everyone very busy. Communicated the sentiment that it will be a great year for conservation and that OCC has a lot of work in the coming months.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, OCC Water Quality Division Director, Ms. Phillips stated that there was a report in the packet, and she would be happy to answer any questions. She welcomed Mr. Priess to the Commission and looks forward to working with him. It has been a busy month for the WQ division education programs. The Soil Health and Blue

Thumb Programs have had around 20 events recently. She attended the leadership class in Tahlequah about Water Quality and shared Trey's thoughts about what a great group of people they are. Water Quality has been going through an audit for their EPA programs while the normal budget is due, so things have been hectic. She thanked Mary Anne Dantzler-Kyer for her help in the audit process since Ed Crall has retired. The division is working on several different proposals with our conservation partners and looks forward to getting these projects underway. Their field season is in full swing, and she hopes all is going smoothly.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, Dr. Sharp stated that there was a report in the packet, and he would be happy to answer any questions. He welcomed Mr. Priess to the commission and looks forward to working with him. Dr. Sharp mentioned noted that for the first time ever there were state appropriations for the GIS program this year. The division will be reaching out to other state agencies to help with their GIS needs. They are also working with the Department of Libraries to digitize their logs so that any changes in section, township, and range can be viewed easily.

Abandoned Mine Lands Reclamation: Robert Toole, Director, stated that a written report was in the Commissioner's packet. He summarized the report noting that AML staff were continuing to inventory non-coal (hardrock) abandoned mines. In addition to the non-coal inventory work, AML staff had been preparing to administer the AML funds provided by the state to reclaim two sites and perform maintenance on several others.

District Services: Clancy Green, Director, stated that there was a report in the packet and she would be happy to answer any questions. Ms. Green added that there would be a District Teams training this month over the FY23 allocations and policies.

Conservation Programs: Tammy Sawatzky, Director, Ms. Sawatzky stated that there was a report in the packet, and she would be happy to answer any questions. She welcomed Mr. Priess to the commission and looks forward to working with him. She stated that she attended quite a few board meetings this month to conduct Watershed Aide reviews. She also conducted interviews for three Watershed Aide positions open in Hughes, Pontotoc, and Garvin CD's. All these positions now have been accepted and two of those individuals will start Friday. The individual in Garvin will not be starting until the 18th. The Watershed Crew was in Seminole clearing sites this month. Taylor Marshall, Cost-Share Program Coordinator has been busy helping Ms. Owen with Feral Swine Outreach Meetings. The division will be hiring an individual to help digitize the easements for Watershed Dams, this will make changes in land ownership much easier to manage in the future. There will be an event for the rededication of Upper Elk 23D on August 24th. Congressman Lucas and NRCS Chief Terry Crosby will be in attendance. In good news, the final payment was made to the contractor for the work done on Cottonwood 54 after a slew of legal issues.

Assistant Director: Lisa Knauf Owen. Ms. Owen stated that most things had been covered but shared news that the new OCC HR Manager would start on July 13th. She thanked Ms. Marshall for helping with the coordination of the Feral Swine Outreach Meetings in May and June. The meetings had decent attendance and she was happy with how they turned out.

The next regular meeting of the Oklahoma Conservation Commission is scheduled to be held on Monday, August 1, 2022, at the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture Building, 2800 N. Lincoln Blvd., Oklahoma City, Oklahoma at 9:30 a.m.

There being no further business, Mr. Crawley declared the meeting adjourned at 11:29 a.m.

FISCAL YEAR 23 - PROPOSED DISTRICT POLICIES

1. All employee positions (District and Commission) that become vacant will be reviewed and will require justification before approval to fill the position. Future employee allocations will be dependent on the level of legislative appropriations.
2. The maximum number of hours for a non-benefitted part-time temporary district employee is 999 hours. If hours exceed 999 in the 12-month period from the employee's hire date, the district will be responsible for the employer's share of retirement contributions and payment of longevity, if applicable.
3. District operating expense allocations will be based upon each district's submission of required reports and documents. The allocation is based solely on whether the deliverable was completed with all required elements and submitted on time – not on the specific content of the deliverable.
4. Failure to perform audits and/or submit preclaim payments (for retirement and insurance) within the established timeframe will result in OCC withholding payment of district claims until compliance is accomplished.
5. For a district to remain eligible to continue receiving a personnel allocation from OCC the district must conduct annual performance evaluations during the fiscal year on all staff and notify OCC in writing of the review's completion.
6. Fiscal Year allocation will not be made for a district until a draft of the Joint Plan of Operations has been submitted for review. The Joint Plan of Operations is effective July 1 each year and serves as justification for allocating funds.

Illinois River Riparian Easement Program

- Annual agreement packets have been submitted to and are in review and process for payment by the three conservation districts covering the area for the **Illinois River Riparian Easement Program**. These agreements are for the lease offset for riparian exclusion and non-use/disturbance of riparian corridor areas. The expected total participation and payout for 2022 includes 24 landowners covering 1,207.3 riparian acres for a total payout of \$73,643.40. The following is a summary of acreage and payment expected by conservation district, pending verification of continued exclusion and cooperator engagement.
- Annual contracts in Adair County Conservation District include 19 landowners covering approximately 861.4 acres for a total payout of \$51,684.
- Annual contracts in Cherokee County Conservation District include 3 landowners covering approximately 289.8 acres for a total payment of \$18,257.40.

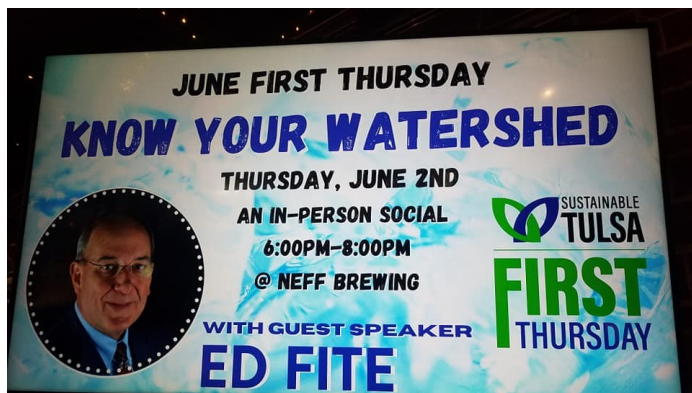
A Different Kind of Training
