UNPAVED ROADS PROGRAM


 Works to create a better unpaved county road system with a reduced negative environmental impact on priority water resources in Oklahoma. The Program focuses on best management practices (BMPs) that reduce the impact of sediment and road runoff to streams, rivers, and drinking water supplies while reducing long term unpaved county road maintenance costs

• Grants available up to \$75,000.00, with 1:1 IN-KIND match from grant applicant

UNPAVED ROADS PROGRAM

- Working with the District
 - Connect the local district with their County Commissioners
 - Funds awarded through the district
 - District receives \$200 for each grant awarded through their district
 - Reduction of sediment entering priority waters thanks to the partnership with the districts "A WIN FOR THE DISTRICTS WITH REPORTING!!!"

INVASIVE WOODY SPECIES MITIGATION PROGRAM (TPWRP)

- Started in FY24 as Terry Peach North Canadian Watershed Restoration Act "Pilot Project"
- Focus on Wildfire Mitigation Practices
 - Brush Free Zone Establishment
 - 4 CETs originally, added 6 FY24, 6 more Fy25/26
 - Fighting Fire with Fire Training
 - Grants to Rural Fire Departments and PBAs
 - Prescribed Fire Financial Assistance for landowners
 - \$20/ac with a maximum payment of \$6,000.00
- ERC removal study site
 - 5,000 acre study area (17% ERC canopy)
 - Employ different removal techniques for controlling ERC
 - Monitor soil moisture, soil health, and forage in cleared areas and on control sites

PRESCRIBED FIRE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

- I am a United States citizen or a qualified alien under federal Immigration and Naturalization Act, and I am lawfully present in the United States
- Completing this form <u>does not</u> guarantee financial assistance
- If approved for financial assistance, I understand that a cash or in-kind match may be required
- Each application will be evaluated and ranked by the OCC LMD staff to verify the property is eligible for payment under the Terry Peach Watershed Restoration Program
- Implementation of this practice **prior to application approval** may result in ineligibility of financial assistance
- Payment assistance is limited to \$20/ac with a max of \$6,000 per landowner each Fiscal year
- I am **not** an Oklahoma Conservation Commission commissioner or employee, conservation district employee or the spouse of any of these people mentioned
- Provide a copy of the burn plan(s) for the property seeking financial assistance
- If you are not the landowner, provide a properly executed consent form from the owner(s)
 of the land and file it with this application
- Property <u>currently under contract</u> through another cost share program for a prescribed burn payment will not be eligible for payment under this program
- Land parcels are only eligible for payments on a 3-year burning interval Example: Parcel burned in 2025 is not eligible again until 2028

FIGHTING FIRE WITH FIRE


- \$5,000 grants available for Rural Fire Departments and Prescribed Burn Associations
 - Volunteer and Combination fire departments
 - One grant per RFD for attending training, plus a new drip torch
 - No restrictions on how grant can be utilized
- We like to work with districts on sponsoring the workshop and distributing the grant funds
 - W9 is required from each entity receiving a grant
 - LMD will send list eligible grant recipients to district for claim

WILDFIRE MITIGATION (BRUSH FREE ZONES)

- Available to every district
- Work in conjunction with the district to identify areas of concern and install wildfire mitigation practices
- We will coordinate with the landowner on the paperwork required for access the property and perform work

INVASIVE WOODY SPECIES REMOVAL FY26 COST SHARE LEA

- Initial focus on priority watershed and elevated wildfire risk
 - Altus-Lugert
 - Beaver River
 - Blue River
 - Eufaula Lake
 - Lincoln, Logan, Payne, Pawnee Counties (elevated threat to life and property)

LAND MANAGEMENT AGREEMENTS

- Unpaved Roads Program agreements new and amended
- · Land Management Technician position agreements renewed/amended annually in June
- Conservation Planner / Construction Manager office space agreements renewed/amended annually in June
- Land Management District Expenditure agreements amended as funds are exhausted or annually which ever come first
- Nutrient Management Planning agreement renewed annually in June

LAND MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT PROCESS

- Unpaved Roads Program agreements
 - Once UPR grant application is approved an agreement is drafted with project site information
 - Agreement submitted to OCC for Commission review/approval
 - Approved agreement signed by OCC Executive Director
 - OCC signed agreement scanned and sent to district for board review/approval; Chair signs agreement and agreement scanned and emailed to Andrea Moseley
 - Amended annually if project not complete
- Land Management Technician position agreements renewed/amended annually to align with new Fiscal Year
 - Amended agreement drafted annually for review at the May or June Commission meeting
- Conservation Planner / Construction Manager office space agreements
 - Agreement renewed/amended annually to align with new Fiscal Year
- Land Management District Expenditure agreements
 - Amended as funds are exhausted or annually which ever come first
- Nutrient Management Planning agreement
 - Amended annually to align with new Fiscal Year

UNPAVED ROADS PROGRAM CLAIMS

- An agreement will be signed and approved by the OCC and District.
- District will receive notification when a claim is to be submitted to Land Management usually from Andrea.
- Claim will include the grant amount (usually \$75,000 but not always) and \$200 admin fee. List each amount on separate lines.
- Include project number in the description (example UNPR-2025-12).
- Backup for the claim will be the signed/approved agreement and the Notification of Grant Approval letter.
- If a district receives funds in advance of a project being completed, the district must retain these funds as "restricted" funds they may not be used to cover expenses for any reason other than the agreed upon project.
- District will also receive notification when funds are to be paid to the County Commissioner usually from Valerie in the form of a Final Certification.

Notify us approximately five days before construction activities begin so we can schedule to be on site for the start of the project, if possible. Photos should be captured during the construction process and provided to OCC at the final inspection. Upon project completion, a final inspection must be scheduled on-site involving the OCC and the grant recipient. Final inspections should be completed within five days after work is complete, so any remediation can be done while equipment is still on site if needed. Only after the final inspection will the payment for the work be made to the county. The district is not eligible to apply for a new grant until the current grant is completed.

- Prescribed Fire Assistance Applications can come from the landowner or through the local District.
- Application is approved by the Land Management Director (Trampas Tripp). A copy is sent to the landowner and the District.
- Once the prescribed burn has been completed and required documents are received by Trampas, the application will be approved for payment.
- The District will submit a claim for payment.
- Backup for the claim will be the signed/approved agreement and application.
